Give the Gift of Grain to Benefit Iowa 4-H

Crop producers who want to support Iowa 4-H Youth Development can decrease their federal income taxes by as much as 40%. By giving the gift of grain, farmers impact youth across the state and can also avoid including the sale of the cash crop in income and can still deduct the cost of growing the crop. This results in saving self-employment tax, federal income tax and state income tax.

Here's how you can make a difference for 4-H. The typical procedure of a farmer delivering, selling and ordering the proceeds sent to the Iowa 4-H Foundation does not work. Instead, the grain should be delivered and a warehouse receipt showing the Iowa 4-H Foundation as the owner should be executed. The Iowa 4-H Foundation would then order the sale of the grain, with the original sales invoice showing the Iowa 4-H Foundation as the seller. These funds can be directed to local county endowments through the Iowa 4-H Foundation to make an impact on your local 4-H program.

Note: To qualify for the highest tax savings, crops must be donated from the previous tax year. If you have grain left over from 2008, it will qualify, otherwise wait until January 1st to donate grain from 2009. Gifts of grain grown in the current year are welcome, but do not incur the same tax advantages.

Help us to spread the word about donating grain to all crop farmers in your county. Contact your local grain elevator and ask them to include this in their newsletter.

The Biofuel Blast Experiment Results Survey & Quiz will be available online tomorrow for youth to enter their experiment results and showcase their knowledge. Thanks to generous support from John Deere, a **\$400 award** will be presented to one county from each state (and one U.S. territory) with the highest number of individual Biofuel Blast results survey submissions before October 30th, 2009. The awards can be used toward the implementation and promotion of science, engineering and technology programs in your county. After youth complete the experiment, make sure they fill in their results at www.4-H.org/NYSD so your county can compete for the award!

In addition, of those who submit their results through the Biofuel Blast experiment survey, five youth names will be randomly selected to **receive a 32GB third generation iPod touch**. The five youth will also be able to designate a 4-H club, school classroom, or youth organization to receive a Fuel Cell Car Experiment kit. ESRI GIS Grants for 4-H Are Available

It's here! We have had several of these grants in Iowa and they have been very successful and the clubs that have worked with the grants have been recognized nationally. GIS has ready made volunteers in nearly every location and the grant provides online learning along with a valuable software package that lets youth develop data rich maps that can be used to deal with local issues. Clubs have done cemetery mapping, location of 4-H members on maps, mapping of resources for youth, and more. Read on.

The ESRI 2010 GIS Grants for 4-H (U.S.) guidelines and application are now posted at www.esri.com/grants <<http://www.esri.com/grants>> or through the link at www.esri.com/4-H. The application deadline is 5:00 pm PST on Dec. 1, 2009. Please download the grant guidelines of interest and bookmark the application link.

The Getting Started with GIS grant is good for 4-H clubs who might be new to technology and GIS software. You'll receive curriculum and software for windows and mac.

The Introductory Grant is appropriate for clubs who want to learn more about GIS technology, using the same software that your local planning office or assessor might use. This grant includes ArcView software (windows only), curriculum and virtual campus courses.

The Intermediate Grants are available for 4-H groups who have successfully completed the requirements for an introductory grant from a previous year. At the intermediate level the club has the choice of continuing with ArcView (and all extensions) or moving up a level to the ArcGIS Editor level. At the intermediate level, clubs may also request to receive American Forests CITYgreen software, an ArcGIS extension that is used by many parks departments and forestry companies to evaluate the health of trees and the contributions to our world that trees provide.

You'll find the grant information at www.esri.com/grants, Education and 4-H grants. There have been some changes in the application process this year, you will need to contact your State 4-H SET Liaison to not only get a letter of support from them, but to also learn about how GIS fits into the states SET plan. Don't worry your state 4-H SET Liaison should already be aware of this grant requirement and should already have a prepared response for you!!!

Remember to download the guidelines early so you have adequate time to consider the questions and submit
