Tractor / Farm Safety Training Course Offered in Denison

Monona County Extension is offering a tractor and farm machinery safety course beginning March 12 ISU Western Research and Demonstration Farm near Castana.

Other class dates will be March 16, 17, and 19. Tractor driving days will be on Sat., March 14 and Sat., March 21.

The training is required by law for 14 and 15 year

olds who want to hire out for neighbors or relatives. They must have this certificate.

The course covers safe tractor operation, tractor controls and maintenance, safe operation of other farm machinery, and tractor driving instruction.

The course is open to all interested youth age 13 and up. Older youth and adults can take this course, as well.

Deadline to registers is March 6, and the cost is \$30 per students. A minimum of 10 students are required to conduct the classes.

Contact the Harrison County Extension Office for a registration form. Harrison County **will not** be offering a class this year.

Burt County Beef Preview

The JNC sanctioned Burt County Beef Preview will be held April 4, 2009 at the Burt County Fairgrounds in Oakland, NE.

While cattle can be on the fairgrounds after Friday at noon, official check-in from 6 to 8 p.m. The show begins on Saturday at 10 a.m.

The cost for pre-entries is \$20 per animal if entered

by March 29 and \$25 if entered after March 29.

Prizes include belt buckles, coats, and gloves.

Other important facts to know include:

- Market classes are divided by hip height.
- Registration papers are required for breeding heifers.
- No bedding will be pro-

vided.

- Lunch stand on the grounds on Saturday.

Animal ID Forms Info

ID forms for breeding beef, feeder calves, bucket/bottle calves, dairy, goats, horses, dogs, sheep and swine will be sent to your leaders. Rabbit, poultry and cat ID forms will be sent directly to 4-H'ers in May. A limited number of extras are available at the Extension office. If you aren't sure if you have the correct form or have questions, call the

office at 712/644-2105.

Remember - *you also are required to enter animal projects for the fair on the **fair livestock entry form (which is different from the ID form)** by June 15th*

4-H FSQA Date Set for April 2

Remember that the 4-H Food Safety and Quality Assurance (FSQA) program will again be in place for

2009. All animal exhibitors (except horse, dog and cat) will have to be certi-

fied. We have scheduled another training date on April 2.

Iowa State Fair Swine Exhibitors

If you are planning to show your 4-H swine project at the Iowa State Fair and/or AKSARBEN this year, please contact the Extension office before March 13.

4-H youth who plan on showing swine past the county fair need to fill out a simple one page "Intent

to Participate" form.

Later-on this spring, animals going to AKSARBEN will be required to have hair samples pulled for DNA purposes (this is done at the county level only).

No swine will be nominated for Ak-sar-ben at

spring weigh-ins for State Fair.

If you plan on showing your swine projects at the Iowa State Fair, you will be required to take your pigs to a special verification site (similar to last year). If you have any questions, please call us at 888-644-2105

FSQA Questions and Answers

Why FSQA?

- ☞ Iowa 4-H'er's produce over 13 million pounds of meat each year, which all goes into the American food supply.
- ☞ Consumers expect a safe, high quality food product.
- ☞ 4-H'ers need to know the food production rules and follow them exactly.

What is FSQA?

- ☞ The Iowa 4-H Food Safety and Quality Assurance (FSQA) program focuses on seven Good Production Practices that help ensure the safety of the food you produce.
- ☞ 4-H'ers in the swine project have been doing this for years --- it was called PQA III (Pork Quality Assurance).
- ☞ When 4-H'ers meet the 4-H FSQA certification, they also meet the Beef Quality Assurance and Pork Quality Assurance certification.

Who Needs FSQA?

- ☞ All youth exhibiting

beef, swine, sheep, dairy, goats (dairy or meat), poultry, or rabbits at the Harrison County Fair and the Iowa State Fair

How do I Certify for FSQA?

- ☞ 4-H'ers ages 9-11 (on January 1) must attend a certification program every year to be FSQA certified
- ☞ 4-H'ers ages 12-14 (on January 1) can either attend a workshop every year, OR take a test which is good until they turn 15.
- ☞ 4-H'ers ages 15-18 (on January 1) can either attend a workshop every year, OR take a test which is good until they turn 19.
- ☞ 4-H'ers age 19 on January 1 will need to certify through the adult program.

When and Where do I Certify for FSQA?

- ☞ Training has been scheduled for Harrison County:
Tuesday, Feb. 17 at

the Harrison County Extension Office and
Thursday, April 2 at the Harrison County Extension Office

- ☞ Class will begin at 6:30 p.m. We will provide a light lunch.

What if I want to test out?

- ☞ Youth choosing to test out may do so after the ethics portion of the training session.
- ☞ You may set up your own time to test at the Extension Office by calling Carole at 712/644-2105
- ☞ To study for the test, you may use the FSQA manual (4H-230A) available at the Extension Office. Cost of a manual is \$5.00. All members of your family may use the same manual.
- ☞ You are only allowed to take the test 3 times in one day. You must have 70% to pass.

Livestock notes . . .

Important dates for your calendar

Attention 4-H'ers showing livestock

Remember the 4-H Food Safety and Quality Assurance (FSQA) program . All animal exhibitors (except horse, dog and cat) will have to be certified.

We have another workshop set for April 2. More details will be on page 9.

Beef: Market beef had to be ID'd and weighed at the county-wide weigh-in.

Cows for the cow-calf project and feeder calf project must be ID'd by May 15th.

Feeder calves and bucket/bottle calves must be ID'd by May 15th.

Breeding Heifers: Breeding heifers must be ear-tagged or if registered, tattooed and ID sheets returned by May 15th.

Swine: If you are farrowing your own pigs, you should plan to pick pigs from a litter born in the first part of February. If you are purchasing feeder pigs, you should plan to purchase 40-50 lbs. pigs in April.

Pigs must be identified by May 15th using 4-H ear tags. To be eligible for the Iowa State Fair, pigs must have ear notches, weighed and have a DNA sample taken and ear-tagged at an official site (to be announced) by May 15. Hogs can be ID'd by June 15 for shows after September 1st (i.e. Ak-Sar-Ben). Ak-Sar-Ben hogs will also require ear notches and DNA. Be watching for more details.

All swine that go to the fair are encouraged to go

to market. However, swine can go back home as long as certain criteria is met (i.e. 30-day quarantine and Pseudo rabies retesting). If interested in taking your swine home, notify the Extension office at the fair.

Sheep: Sheep are also ear-tagged and ID sheets are to be filled in and returned to the Extension office by May 15. To be eligible to show at the Iowa State Fair, sheep must be ear-tagged, have a retinal image taken, and be weighed at a designated site by May 15. Ak-Sar-Ben will also have special DNA requirements. Be watching for more details.

Please call the Extension Office if you plan on showing sheep at the Iowa State Fair.

Horses, Dogs, Goats, and Dairy Cattle: All need to be ID'd by May 15th. Goats and dairy projects need to be ear tagged.

OTHER ANIMAL PROJECTS:

Rabbits: They must be ID'd by a tattoo number (preferred) or a permanent marker number in the left ear. They also need an ID

sheet filled out and returned by June 15th.

Cats, Poultry: These projects must be ID'd by June 15th.

ID sheets (except rabbits, cats and poultry) will be mailed to your club leaders. Remember that these forms are cost items. Some extras will be available from the Extension office. It is the responsibility of the 4-H member to make sure they have the correct ID form. If in doubt, contact your leader or call the Extension office.

The sheets for rabbits, cats and poultry will be mailed directly to members from the Extension office later in the spring.

Identifying your livestock means you insert 4-H ear tags (available from the Extension office) and fill out the correct Livestock Identification Sheet for that project. DO NOT WAIT TO INSERT EAR TAGS!!! DO IT NOW!!!

****Remember--an ID sheet does not enter your project in the fair. There will be a separate form for that later in the year.****

Iowa State Fair Entry Reminder

State Fair entries are due to the Extension office by July 1. We will notify you when we receive the entry forms and class information.

The Iowa State Fair book will only be avail-

able on-line this year. There will be no hard copies.

Please remember that just because you had animals verified at a state fair verification site, this does not automatically enter them for

state fair. You must complete the state fair entry forms and pay the required fees by July 1st in order to be entered. You will also need a signed "Youth Code of Ethics" form to accompany the entry forms.

Plan to Volunteer at the State Fair

The Iowa State Fair is August 13-23. Preparation and entry days in the 4-H Exhibits Building are August 10, 11, and 12.

Youth and adult vol-

unteers are needed to help throughout the Iowa State Fair in many ways in the exhibit building as well as in the livestock departments.

Check at the Exten-

sion office for volunteer opportunities.

Applications for paid staff (youth and adults) are due June 1. Applications for volunteer positions are due July 1.
