- Don't know what club you want to join? Talk to someone at your county Extension office, and they'll be happy to find you a club that fits you and your adventure!

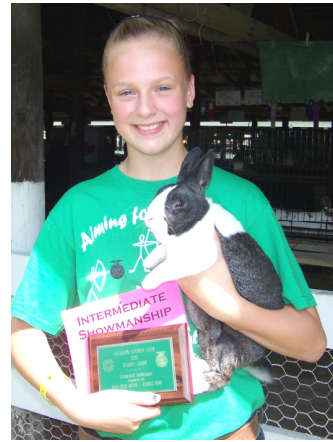
GET INVOLVED
