### COMMUNICATIONS CRAZE 2007 - 2008

#### Goals of COMMUNICATIONS CRAZE

- Strengthen sharing and listening skills at club meetings  
Officer roles, roll call, discussing club business, leading recreation
- Practice **expressing feelings and opinions** and proper use of communications **technology**
- Encourage use of 4-H **project guides**



#### COMMUNICATIONS CRAZE Group Program Idea - Celling Out (Communications Helper's Guide PP 10 -11)

Prepare a chart to survey your club members on ways they communicate on a daily basis. Ask each member to estimate the number of minutes they spend each day on the phone (cell or telephone), on the computer emailing or Instant Messaging, and in direct person to person conversation.

Discuss the effect of electronic devices on personal communication. Using the chart, ask questions:

What do you notice about yourself in comparison with others?

What trends do you see? Are there trends that need to be managed? How?

How many times did you choose to speak to a friend on the cell phone or IM rather than interact personally with people around you?

**True or False** - Because youth are "celling out," they are missing opportunities to positively interact with those around them and develop strong communications skills. Defend your opinion.

Will you change your allotment of "headphone time" as a result of this activity?

#### COMMUNICATIONS CRAZE Game Idea - Moon Ball

Using a 10-inch or larger inflatable ball, the leader asks the group to stand in a circle. The objective is for each team members to hit the ball in the air while keeping it aloft without striking the ground. No player can hit the ball twice in a row. Once the group has achieved that goal, ask them to select a more rigorous goal.

Observe the interaction of the group. After the game is over, **ask questions** such as: How did you communicate during the game? What worked and what did not? What did you have to change with the new goal? Who took the lead in setting a new goal? Who made suggestions? Who listened? How could you apply this problem solving activity to our 4-H club meetings? To sport teams? To other groups you are a member of?

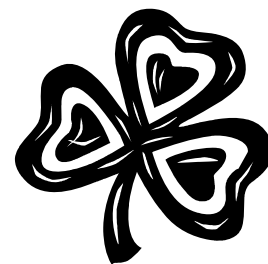

## 268 4-H'ers in Boone County

As of late January, 268 members have enrolled in eighteen 4-H clubs in Boone County. The first payment of the \$20 program development fee per member has been sent to Iowa State University.

Accident insurance coverage for all 4-H members and leaders has been renewed at \$1 per person per year (paid by funds from the 4-H foodstand.) This covers injuries incurred while attending regularly approved and adult supervised 4-H group activities

To be enrolled in 4-H, youth need to:

- Complete 4-H enrollment form,
- Parents complete medical information/ release,
- Pay the \$20 program development fee.

4-H'ers may add 4-H projects at any time unless an earlier deadline applies (for example May 15 is the last date to add most animal projects.)

## 4-H'ers for 4-H donations help Conference, camp, 4-H building

Boone County 4-H clubs are challenged to donate at least \$2.00 per member to 4-H'ers for 4-H. Last year Boone County 4-H clubs donated \$522.

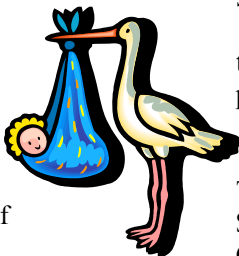

## Have you added to your 4-H Participation Summary for 2007 - 08?

Record keeping is easier if done throughout the year. The Boone County 4-H Participation Summary (with 3 years on one form) includes space to briefly record 4-H club, county, leadership, and communication participation as well as home, school and community activities. There are spaces to briefly highlight all your 4-H projects including citizenship and communication.

4-H'ers should complete a basic, experienced or advanced record on at least one project. To be considered for outstanding member or special awards you should complete more detailed records on most of your projects. Animal worksheets are also required.

## Central Area 4-H Council forming at retreat on March 29 - 30

Youth 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades can be part of the effort to form a Central Area 4-H Council. An area council is like a county council but made up of 4-H youth from seventeen central Iowa counties.

To get an area council going a retreat is planned at the State 4-H Camp near Madrid, March 29<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup>, 3:30 p.m. – 11:30 a.m. If you are interested, contact the Extension Office for registration information.

# Ag Notes

## FSQA on March 25 or 26 for beef, sheep, dairy and meat goat, poultry, rabbit, and swine exhibitors

Food Safety and Quality Assurance training communicates good production practices to ensure safe animal food products. For the 2008 Iowa State Fair and Boone County Fair exhibitors in the above mentioned species must be FSQA certified by May 15.

Training on **March 25 or 26** (come only one night) at the Boone County Fairgrounds at 7 p.m. will focus on the three quality assurance points to help youth understand their role in the food supply chain.

**Youth ages 9 – 11** on or before January 1, 2008 must attend FSQA certification every year.

**Youth ages 12 – 14** (on or before Jan. 1<sup>st</sup>) have the option to attend the program each year or take a test. Youth passing the test will be certified until they turn 15.

**Youth ages 15 – 19** (on Jan. 1<sup>st</sup>) have the option to attend the program each year or take a test. Youth passing the test will then be certified until they turn 19. You may take the test following the March 25<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup> sessions or by appointment at the Boone County Extension Office. Rabbit and poultry exhibitors can certify at Feb.21 workshop (see next page.)

## Bucket/Bottle calves born from March 1 to May 15

Any newborn or orphan calf (beef or dairy) born between March 1 and May 15, in the 4-H'ers possession by 2 weeks of age, and bucket/bottle fed can be a 4-H project. Enroll in the Bucket/Bottle Calf project (#1030) by May 1. Tag and identify the calf by May 15 on an Identification Form. Halter-break the calf and train it to lead. Keep records. Learn about feed, health, nutrition, and responsibility.



## Basics of raising rabbits & poultry & FSQA certification on Feb. 21

All rabbit and poultry project members need to be Food Safety and Quality Assurance (FSQA) certified by May 15 to exhibit at the Boone County or Iowa State Fair. 4-H rabbit and poultry exhibitors can meet certification requirements by attending the Feb. 21 project meetings or by attending the training for all species on March 25 or 26 (attend only one night.)

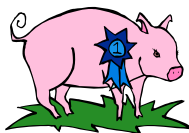

## Sheep and meat goat weigh-in on April 26 and health requirements

- Sheep and meat goat weigh-in will be Saturday, **April 26** beginning at 9 am using the scale in the showring at the Boone County Fairgrounds. All market and commercial ewe lambs and meat goats will be weighed, tagged, ID forms completed.
- **NEW!** To nominate a lamb or meat goat for the Iowa State Fair, the animal will be retinal imaged at a cost of \$5 per head (add \$1 to nominate for Ak-Sar-Ben also.) Each 4-H'er must exhibit at least one



performance carcass lamb at the Iowa State Fair and minimum weight for market lambs is 100 pounds. Only wether meat goats are shown at the State Fair.

- **Scrapie** is a disease of the central nervous system in sheep and goats. It is always fatal and there is no cure for it. Any sheep or goats exhibited or sold that are sexually intact must have an official scrapie tag. 4-H'ers who purchase ewe lambs should be sure they are tagged by the original owner. If you raise your own lambs, you may register your flock and receive free tags by calling **866/873-2824**.

- All new sheep project members need to watch a club lamb fungus video on this highly contagious fungal infection of the skin of sheep. It causes a nasty “ringworm” infection in people.

## Tag purchased swine by April 21 for Boone County Fair

- **Farrowed pigs** are born to a sow belonging to the 4-H member or in partnership with a family member. These pigs need to be ear notched at birth according to the universal swine ear notching system and identified on a Swine ID Report by May 15.
- **Purchased pigs** are ear notched, ear-tagged with official 4-H tags, and ID forms completed by the 4-H member by **April 21**. Tags can be purchased for \$1 each and a tagger can be checked out from the Boone County Extension Office.
- **Swine weight limits at the Boone County Fair are still 230 - 285 pounds at this time.**

## State Fair swine – Intent to participate by March 14 and verification in April

- **Iowa State Fair** – All market, derby and breeding swine will be identified with a new DNA punch tag (no tattoos, no hair pull), ear notches recorded on swine verification form, and derby pigs weighed at sites throughout the state between April 19 – 26. Cost per pig is \$5. 4-H'ers planning to exhibit market swine at the Aug. 7 - 17 Iowa State Fair must verify at least two derby pigs. Maximum weight for derby pigs on April 19 is 40 pounds and add one pound per day.
- To plan for state fair weigh-in sites, 4-H'ers are asked to submit intent to **participate** by March 14. Dates, locations, and more details are available at Extension Office or online at [www.extension.iastate.edu/4H/Agriculture/livestockhandbook.htm](http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4H/Agriculture/livestockhandbook.htm)
- 4-Hers with purebred pigs, market, derby or breeding swine, will need to present original registration papers at check in at State Fair.

## Learn to Knit on Feb. 23

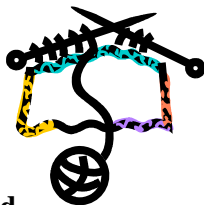
Make a long, narrow fashion scarf. Wear it this winter. Exhibit it at the county fair this summer.

**Who:** 4-H members and other youth. Limit of 10 youth participants.

**Learn:** Casting on, binding off, knit and purl, and (optional) how to add fringe. Start the scarf in class and finish at home.

**When and where:** Saturday, February 23 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the Boone County Extension Office

**What to bring:** Knitting needles size US 15 or US 17, scissors, 100 yards of your choice of yarn - medium weight worsted or 100% acrylic chunky weight



## 4-H Fun Night on March 7 at Ogden Middle School 7-10 p.m.
