- Outstanding Graduated Senior (must be in grade 12)

4-H'ers may be interviewed for Special Awards. 4-H'ers who receive a Special Award will receive a 4-H Award Plaque with their name and award on the plaque

*** Project Areas

Listed below are different project awards available, not all project areas are listed. For example: a 4-H'er may have experiences in making bread, that 4-H'er may want to receive a 4-H Bread Award. Or a 4-H'er may have their own sheep herd project and would like to receive an award in Sheep – Breeding or Market. Answers to your questions on applying for 4-H Project Awards & Special Awards

Why Apply for 4-H Project Awards?

- Tells others what you have done in 4-H
- Helps with scholarship applications
- Adds to your job resume
- Receive Recognition

How to apply for 4-H Project Awards?

- Complete Application: 1-5 pages (either typed or written*)
- Attach the 4-H Project Award Cover Form
- Leader fills out project award check list
- Each application must be stapled in upper left corner and submitted in a paper folder – with your name, club and grade on outside of folder

*Don't like to write? Prepare a 10 minute audio or video.

4-H'ers in 9th – 12 Grades apply for Special County Awards

- Project Achievement Awards
- Danforth
- Merit
- Outstanding Graduated Senior

Requirements:

- Have you been in a project area for 3 years or more?
- Set & accomplished 4 or more measurable goals in your project area?

Have you done three or more activities in each of the following:

- Leadership
- Communications
- Citizenship
- You must have received a gold award in the project area

Interviews will be held for these awards.

How to Prepare your 4-H Award Application?

Your application can be 1 page but not more than 5 pages of written or typed information on your 4-H Project Award (or prepare a 10 minute audio or video).

Look at Project Award Guidelines – those guidelines will tell you what is required

Your application should include:

- Introducing yourself and tell something about yourself
- Write about your project area
- What were some new ideas you learned in your project area?
- How did you share what you learned with other people (this could include with your club, your school, your church or community)
- Include your goals, plans and what you want to do in the future in your project area – check the guidelines on how many goals are required
- List any Leadership you did in your project; like planning a workshop* can include activities done within your local club, county and/or community
- Include any Citizenship you may have done in your project*
- Was there communication involved in your project; did you give a talk, make a poster or present a workshop?*
- How have you personally grown from learning about your project?
- How did you feel about your project or are there things you would change – evaluate yourself and what you would do differently
- List other 4-H events or activities you did.
- Include pictures to help tell your story.

*Check the Project Award guidelines on how many activities are needed for the award you are applying for in the different color groups (green, blue, purple, bronze, silver or gold) or for Project achievement
