COUNTY FAIR INFORMATION

ATTENDANCE REMINDER:

To be eligible to show **ANYTHING** at fair you must attend 5 club meetings (one club community service project may be substituted for one meeting). There are **NO** excused absences. (The 4-H year runs from August to July). If you are not sure you have fulfilled this requirement, contact your club leader.

ENTRY DAYS JUNE 29-30!

For EVERYONE Showing Livestock or Exhibits



Wayne County Fair Entry Days are **June 29-30**. To hopefully make the process easier for you most of the forms can be found online along with the fair book! You can fill out your forms at home and then bring them in or at least get an idea of what information you need to bring with you. The Wayne County Fair book is online so you can get your class information there. The address is:

ALL animals: beef, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, dairy cows, rabbits, dogs, pets, poultry and horses!!!

If you are entering a **Purebred Breeding Heifer or Market Beef** you must bring the registrations papers when you enter the animal.

If you are going to be gone those days you can come in before June 29. **NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED!!!**

What you do at Entry Days:

- 1) Sign up livestock/pets for classes – pay entry fee (listed below)
- 2) Pick up a fair book
- 3) Pick up your fair pass (4-H'er is free, weekly passes can be bought for \$20/ person for the rest of the family, children entering 4th grade and younger are free)
- 4) Pick up your entry tags for 4-H exhibits (exhibits themselves do not need to be pre-entered)
- 5) Pick up goal sheets for 4-H exhibits
- 6) Pick up photography sheets
- 7) Pick up labels for canning or preservatives
- 8) Sign up livestock for **Iowa State Fair (these have to be in our office no later than June 30th)**
- 9) Buy your Wayne County 4-H t-shirts (\$7/shirt)
- 10) Sign up for Share the Fun, Communications, Fashion Revue or Clothing Selection

Bring with you any project questions you may have!!!

Entry Costs

Beef & Dairy cattle (market and breeding) \$7/hd

Horse \$5/hd

Cow/Calf \$4/pair

Sheep, Goats, Swine, Bucket/Bottle Calves \$3/hd

Rabbits, Poultry, Pets, Dogs \$1/hd

TATTOOS

Any animal that requires a tattoo for identification purposes – check those tattoos NOW to be sure they are readable.

Animals with fresh tattoos will not be allowed to show.

LIVESTOCK ENTRY DAYS

COW/CALF CLASS

Due to the possible lack of livestock space it has been decided that cow/calf projects will be released following the show. The Grand Champion Cow/Calf and Grand Champion 1st Calf Heifer/Calf will be expected to stay. Entry fee for the cow/calf will now be \$4.00 / pair

Rabbit Exhibitors

It is recommended that rabbit exhibitors bring a padlock to lock your rabbit's cage. It would be a good idea to give the Rabbit Superintendent an extra key to the cage.

LIVESTOCK RULES

- You are responsible to know the rules as stated in the Fair Book
- **For your own safety PLEASE do not wear open toed shoes when working around the livestock. Open toed footwear provides NO protection! Don't be surprised if superintendents, adult volunteers or 4-H staff tells you to get the proper footwear.**
- You must clean out your stalls and cages when the fair is over. If you don't you will not receive your premium check.
- **Animal Care and Management Disclosure Statement** – remember when you bring your market animals you will have to fill out and sign this sheet on your animals. Any treatments you give your animals will need to be recorded. Keep records of what animal(s) you treated, the date, product name, amount given, route (water, feed, injectable), who administered, withdrawal time, and date withdrawal completed.

LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR COUNTY FAIR

The *Scrapie* program is still in place for sheep and goats. All sexually intact sheep and goats must have an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin tag. If you have questions or need tags call 1-866-USDA-TAG (873-2824).

Poultry Pullorum testing – ALL poultry exhibited must have had a negative Pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days of public exhibitions. You can set up an appointment with Kelly Culver, 641-895-4267 or with the Corydon Vet Clinic 641-872-1064. There may also be someone come around to check for the Avian Flu.

Dogs & Cats – All dogs and cats exhibited at fair should have proof of current Rabies vaccination. A copy may be brought into the Extension Office.

AUJESZKY'S DISEASE (PSEUDORABIES) - ALL SWINE (Iowa is Stage V)

1. Native Iowa swine. Native Iowa swine originating from a Stage 4 or lower status county must present a test record and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that indicate that each swine has had a negative test for pseudorabies within 30 days prior to the show (individual show regulations may have more restrictive time restrictions), regardless of the status of the herd, and that lists the individual official identification. Native Iowa swine originating from a Stage 5 status county must present a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection listing individual official identification. No pseudorabies testing requirements prior to exhibition will be necessary for native Iowa swine originating from Stage 5 counties. Electronic identification will not be considered official identification for exhibition purposes.
2. Swine originating outside Iowa. All exhibitors must present a test record and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that indicate that each swine has had a negative test for pseudorabies within 30 days prior to the show (individual show regulations may have more restrictive time restrictions), regardless of the status of the herd, and that lists the individual official identification. Electronic identification will not be considered official identification for exhibition purposes.
3. Swine that return from an exhibition to the home herd or that are moved to a purchaser's herd following an exhibition or consignment sale must be isolated and retested negative for pseudorabies not less than 30 and not more than 60 days after reaching their destination. (Code of Iowa 166D.13(2).)

Communications Day is Wednesday, July 8th

Communications judging takes place before the County Fair. It will be held at the United Methodist Church in Corydon on **Wednesday, July 8th at 1:30 pm**. There are four categories in which you may participate. If you are in 5th-12th grade, you might be chosen to participate at the Iowa State Fair.

Educational Presentations: This is when you or a team have some information you would like to share, like a presentation you might give at your club meeting. You can use posters or other visual aids to help present your topic.

Working Exhibit: You or a team share information about how to do something. You give your audience the materials and the steps to make or do what you are sharing. Then with your assistance, the audience learns this process.

Share-the-Fun: It's just that – FUN! You or a team of other 4-H'ers may put together your talents in a skit, musical presentation, or any other creative performance you would like to share with an audience. If you prepared for a recital, share your talents again!

Extemporaneous Speaking: This is a category for 4-H'ers who have completed grades 9-12. You will be given a topic and have 30 minutes to prepare a speech, and 4-6 minutes to give it. If this sounds like something you'd like to do, contact the Extension Office for complete rules. Contestants may qualify for the State Fair Extemporaneous Speaking Contest.

Fashion Revue, Clothing Selection & \$15 Challenge

Wednesday, July 8th is the day for Fashion Revue and Clothing Selection judging. Judging will begin at **9:30am**.

Fashion Revue is modeling a garment you have made yourself.

Clothing Selection is modeling a garment you have purchased.

The \$15 Challenge is where you have purchased an outfit for \$15 or less. This outfit must come from a source such as a garage sale, Goodwill, Salvation Army, etc. The reason for this class is to reuse or recycle. You must have a receipt (piece of paper with buyer, seller, date and amount).

There have been a couple questions about project enrollment requirements for participation in the Iowa State Fair 4-H Clothing Event. Participants in The \$15 Challenge and Clothing Selection do **not** have to be enrolled in the clothing project. Participants in Fashion Revue (constructed items) must be enrolled in the Clothing project.

Design Elements and Principles

The elements of design are: line, shape, space, texture and color. The art principles are: proportion, balance, rhythm, emphasis and unity. Include one or more of these when telling how you did your project.

Each contestant must be an active member of at least one worthwhile organization in her community, such as a church group, Girl Scouts, 4-H, etc. Eligibility is not limited to 4-H membership.
