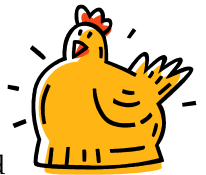

## **Poultry Pullorum Testing Set for June 27**

**IMPORTANT: Woodbury County 4-H'ers exhibiting poultry** must have their birds tested for pullorum. **All** Birds must be tested (except doves and pigeons). If you have a certificate from the store, it is only good for 90 days which may mean birds will have to be retested depending on purchased date. Testing will be done at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds on June 27 from 7:30 am – 11:00 am. Cost is 50 cents a bird. For more information contact Michael Beavers (712-944-5140), Peggy Davidson (712-239-1026) or Jamie Johnson (phone number incorrect in mailed out newsletter). 4-H'er can always have their birds tested from other certified testers. Jamie Johnson will only be able to test birds on June 27.

Market Beef/Heifers	Breeding Heifers
Feeder Calf	Cow-Calf
Sheep	Swine
Goats (market & dairy)	Dairy Cattle
Rabbits	Poultry

## **Who must attend workshops or test out?**

- If you are 9, 10 or 11 years old (age as of January 1, 2009) you **MUST** attend a workshop.
- 4-H'ers who are 12, 13 or 14 years old as of January 1, 2009, can test out or attend a workshop. Once you test out you no longer need to take a test until you turn 15 years old.
- 4-H'ers 15 years old and up must again test out. After you test out you no longer will need to take a test.

**4-H'ers who are 9, 10 and 11 years old must attend a workshop. If you haven't attended a workshop you can go to another county's workshop. 4-H'ers who haven't attended a workshop will be ineligible to exhibit their livestock at the Woodbury County Fair, State Fair and Clay County Fair.**

Overall Senior Horseman will be evaluated on Community Service, Years' Involvement, Sportsmanship, Leadership, and Horsemanship. A committee of judges will select one current year graduated high school member. Applications for this award will be due July 15, 4:30 pm at the Woodbury County Extension Office. Overall Senior Horseman Award will be presented Wednesday during the horse show. Overall Senior Horseman will be open to a senior member in 10, 11 or 12 grades. A 4-H'er is eligible to win one time. NO entry forms available at this time.* Entry fees vary for each show. It is the responsibility of each 4-H'er and their parents to read the rule book and follow entry rules. No entries will be accepted after the entry due date. Fees must also be paid at entry time.

### ❖ Iowa State Fair, August 13 - 23, 2009

### *Entries & Fees Due July 1*

Livestock/Animal, Dog and Horticulture entries are due Wednesday, July 1. 4-H Building exhibits are selected during County Fair. 4-H'ers must have completed 5<sup>th</sup> grade to be eligible to exhibit at State Fair. ### *Entries & Fees due August 14*

Livestock and horse entries are due August 14 in the Woodbury Extension Office. Horse exhibitors must be 12 years old by January 1, 2009. Other exhibitors must be 10 years old by January 1, 2009. Go to the following web site: [www.aksarben.org](http://www.aksarben.org) for more information on Ak-Sar-Ben. The rule book is only available online.

**Please note:** 4-H'ers who plan to exhibit hogs, lambs, meat goats and feeder calves must have the animal identified on the May 15 Livestock Identification forms, but all DNA must be in the Extension Office by June 15 to exhibit at Ak-Sar-Ben. Market Beef have already been identified and DNA taken at the January weigh-in and tagging.

### Lost an Ear Tag?

If you have an animal that has lost an eartag, it is important that you contact the Woodbury County Extension Office or a 4-H Superintendent to retag the animal. This is especially important for 4-H'ers planning to exhibit at State, Ak-Sar-Ben and Clay County. Please report the lost eartag as soon as possible by giving us the name of the 4-H'er who owns the animal and the lost eartag number.

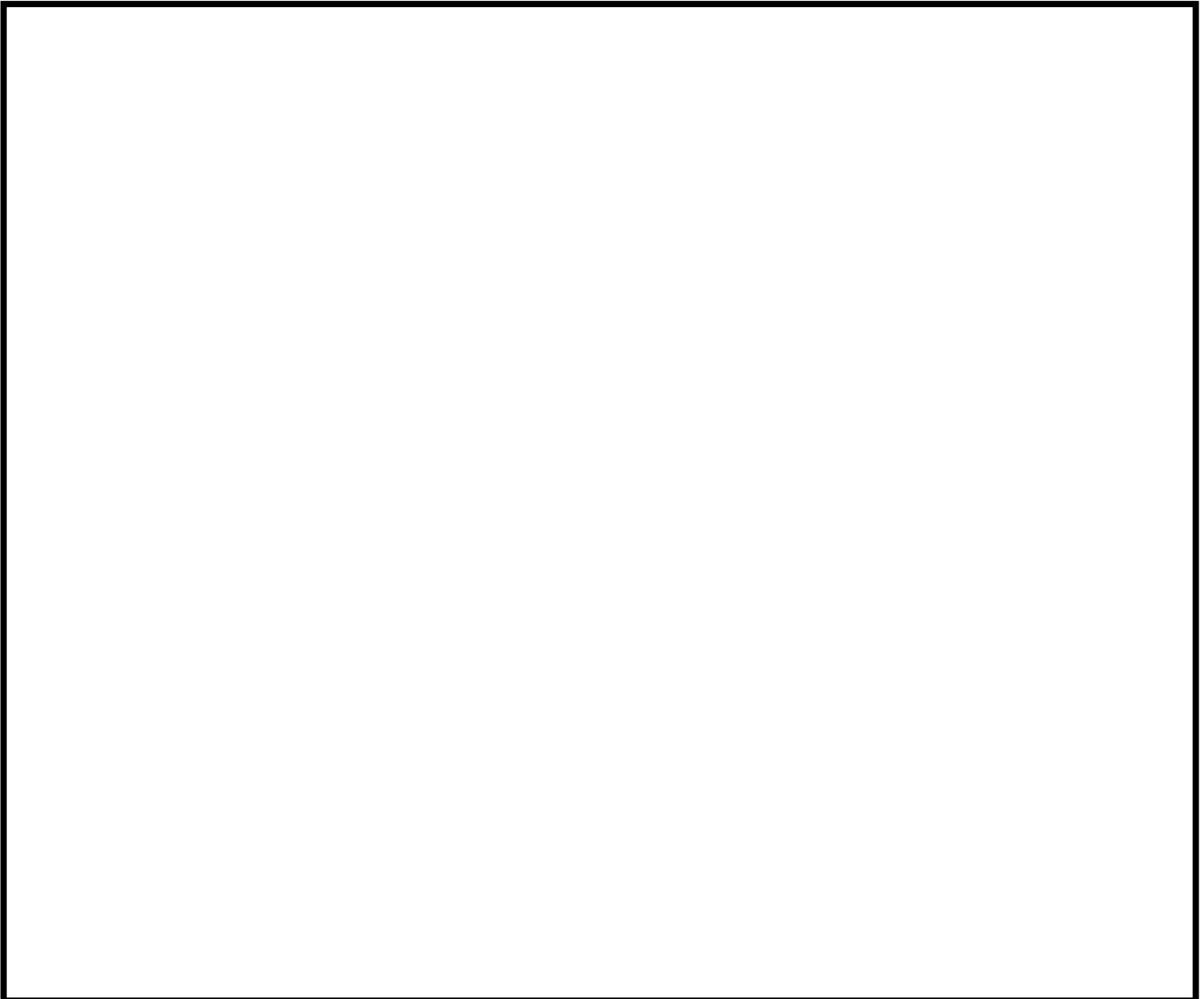
