Dog Project Members Obedience Classes

4-H'ers planning to show their dog at the Woodbury County Fair must fill out a Livestock Identification form that will be due on or before May 15 (enclosed in this issue of the *4-H Scene*). 4-H'ers exhibiting dogs at the Woodbury County Fair must also fill out a 4-H Fair Animal/Livestock Entry Form that is due July 15.

Poultry Pullorum Testing Set for July 10

IMPORTANT: Woodbury County

4-H'ers exhibiting poultry must have their birds tested for pullorum. **All** birds must be tested (except doves and pigeons). If you have a certificate from the store, it is only good for 90 days which may mean birds will have to be retested depending on purchase date.



Testing will be done at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds on July 10 from 7:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. Cost is 50 cents per bird. For more information, contact Poultry Superintendants Janette Beekman (712) 375-5898 or Barb Sitzmann (712) 378-2054. 4-H'ers can always have their birds tested from other certified testers.

Who must attend a FSQA workshop or test out?

- If you are 9, 10 or 11 years old (age as of January 1, 2010) you **MUST** attend a workshop.
- 4-H'ers ages 12, 13 or 14, as of January 1, 2010, can test out or attend a workshop. Once you test out you no longer need to take a test until you turn 15 years old.
- 4-H'ers 15 years old and up must again test out. After you test out you no longer will need to take a test.

Lost an Ear Tag?

If you have an animal that has lost an ear tag, it is important that you contact the Woodbury County Extension office or a 4-H superintendent to retag the animal. This is especially important for 4-H'ers planning to exhibit at the Iowa State Fair, Ak-Sar-Ben and/or the Clay County Fair. Please report the lost ear tag as soon as possible by giving us the name of the 4-H'er who owns the animal and the lost ear tag number.

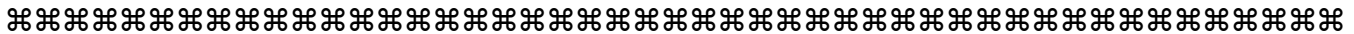
