There will be many 4-H fair class changes in the 4-H Building this year. The classes will be easy for 4-H members, parents, leaders and judges to understand. Instead of 62 classes there will be 30 classes. 4-H'ers who are working on projects will be able to find a class to fit their exhibit that they plan to take to the fair. Another change will be in the goals for your project. Instead of 4 questions, there will be 3 questions you will need to answer. Those questions are:

- What did you plan to learn or do? What was your exhibit goal(s)?
- What steps did you take to learn or do this?
- What were the most important things you learned?

4-H judges will use new evaluation forms to judge exhibits. Those forms are available for 4-H'ers so that they can learn what a judge is looking for when evaluating their exhibit. The evaluation forms will be available on the web and connected to the *4-H Hot Sheets* that can be found at the following website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects>. At this time the evaluation rubrics aren't listed, but they should be by early March. 4-H judges will attend a webinar later this spring to learn about the new classes and evaluation forms.

To learn about the new changes you are invited to the 4-H & Fair Committee meeting on Thursday, March 10, 7:00 p.m. at the fire station in Merville, (located across the street from Casey's). 4-H leaders will also learn about the new changes at the 4-H leaders training on Tuesday, April 19. We will list changes in upcoming editions of the *4-H Scene*. The fair book with all the changes will be out later this spring.

2011 4-H'ers for 4-H Campaign Begins March 1

The State 4-H Council is adopting the Foundation theme *My 4-H. My Commitment.* for their annual statewide fundraiser. Their goal is to raise \$30,000 by asking Iowa 4-H clubs to donate \$2.50 per member. Additionally, they have put out a challenge to past state 4-H council alumni to match the goal and raise a total of \$60,000 for 4-H!

The state council alumni have already raised more than \$16,000 and are competing against each other for prizes and bragging rights. Some of the projects to be funded by 4-H'ers for 4-H include improvements to the 4-H exhibit displays for the Iowa State

Fair, Iowa 4-H Center improvements and financial assistance to help youth attend camps and state conference.

The State 4-H office will be emailing (or mailing if they don't have email) 4-H leaders information on the 4-H'ers for 4-H campaign. 4-H clubs can send their donation directly to the 4-H Foundation or the Woodbury County Extension office.

Donations must be received by May 15. Last year, Woodbury 4-H clubs donated over \$250 for 4-H'ers for 4-H. Thank you to the Arlington Future Farmers, Anthon Advancers and Rock-Kee Union who have already donated over \$200 to the 2011 campaign.

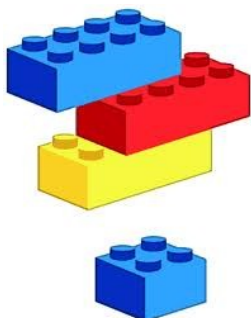

2011 Iowa 4-H Youth Conference June 28-30

Every June, over 1000 teenagers converge on the campus of Iowa State University for 3 days full of speakers, workshops, mixers, dances, a banquet, and community service activities. If you've completed 8th grade, you're eligible to attend. You don't even have to be a 4-H member to attend! The Woodbury 4-H County Council has made it their goal to get kids to this event.

You will get to experience campus life and meet new people from across the state! You will be having fun while learning by doing, dancing the nights away, and serving the community. You will get to learn new things to take back to your community and school, and in the process you might even discover something new about yourself! There are opportunities for you to share your talents with the rest of the delegation through small group discussion, the Conference Chorus, and a talent show! If you have a specific interest in either animal science or crop production, you might want to look into becoming part of the ROUND-UP or CSI: Crops Tracks!

Iowa 4-H Youth Conference costs are approximately \$130 and early registrations are due May 15 to the Woodbury County Extension office. If you need financial assistance, you can go to the following website: Woodbury County 4-H'ers who ride the bus will have their transportation paid.

Northwest Iowa will again have a bus go down to conference on Monday, June 27 and return on June 30. Cost for the bus is approximately \$30 (Woodbury County will pick up the cost of the bus for Woodbury 4-H members). Bus is on a first come first serve. Each county will need adult chaperones. Woodbury County will pick up **all** fees for chaperones.

State Fair Swine Weigh-in Information for 2011

Information for the 2011 State Fair 4-H swine weigh-in process is now posted on the swine page at, <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/livestock/swine.htm>. A tentative listing of sites and times are posted along with updates and changes for 2011.

The State 4-H Office will mail/email swine exhibitors of last year's State Fair. If you think you may be exhibiting swine at the State Fair you must contact the Woodbury County Extension office by Tuesday, March 15 and request an Intent to Participate. 4-H'ers with animals wanting to be eligible for state fair (market, derby, breeding) need to attend one of the regional site locations.

Dates listed on the swine project webpage for this area include: Monday, April 25 at Boyden, 3:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. or Wednesday, April 27 at Spencer, 5:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. For more information go to the website for locations and additional information on showing swine at the Iowa State Fair.

Please Note-Tags for County Pigs: 4-H and FFA members planning to exhibit swine at the Woodbury County Fair must tag their pigs using the Iowa 4-H tag. Ear notches will not be accepted as identification. Cost of the tags are \$1.50 per animal. Tags can be picked up at the Woodbury County Extension office. All pigs must be tagged by the 4-H family on or before Sunday, May 15, 2011.

Food Safety Quality Assurance (FSQA) – Required for County Fair

Woodbury County will have a workshop on Tuesday, April 26. Pre-registration is REQUIRED – there is a form in this issue of the 4-H Scene

4-H'ers planning to exhibit animals at the Woodbury County Fair must attend a workshop if they are in 4th, 5th or 6th grades.

4-H'ers in grades 7th, 8th, or 9th grades can attend a workshop or test out and 4-H'ers in 10th, 11th and 12th grades must take the test. A workshop will be held on Tuesday, April 26, 7:00 p.m. at the Merville Methodist Church.

4-H'ers must attend a workshop or test out if they are exhibiting these animals: beef (market, breeding, cow/calf, and feeder calf), dairy cattle, goats (dairy and meat), poultry, rabbit, sheep and swine. You will be ineligible to exhibit your animals at the Woodbury County Fair, Clay County Fair and Iowa State Fair if you do not attend a workshop or take the test.

4-H Leaders: Please make sure that your 4-H members are aware of the importance of the FSQA workshops and tests.

4-H'ers who need help to study for the test, may to the following website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/livestock/> and at the bottom of that page click on 'FSQA'. There will be a member's manual for you to download.

Woodbury, Ida and Monona Counties will share workshop dates. Those dates are (you MUST pre-register):

Woodbury: April 26, 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. at the Merville Methodist Church

Monona: Saturday, April 9, at the Extension office in Onawa from 9:30 a.m.-11:30 a.m. and Monday, April 11 at St. John's Methodist Church in Mapleton from 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m.

Ida County: Saturday, March 26, 10:00 a.m. -Noon at the Ida County Extension office.

If you plan to attend the workshop at Ida or Monona Counties you MUST pre-register. We have too many 4-H'ers who show up and the sites are not prepared with enough materials.

It is important that your pre-register or you may be turned away from the workshop.

Pig-of-Merit & Performance Pen of 3 Weigh-in & Tagging

Eight pigs may be entered in the Pig-of-Merit and Performance Pen of Three and must be weighed and tagged on Saturday, April 16, 9:30 – 11:00 am at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds in Merville. There is no weight limit on pigs, but the 4-H'er or family must be present to weigh the animal.

4-H'ers can exhibit 4 animals: 2 barrows and 2 gilts in the Pig-of-Merit class and may also show one Performance Pen of 3 at the fair.

Pigs that are not shown in the Pig-of-Merit and Performance Pen of 3 can be shown in the regular market class.
