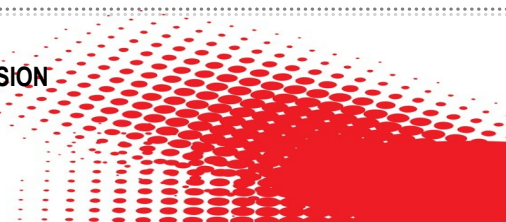

This statement on page 70 of the fair book was covered up by the Fair Trophy rule box:

4-H BUILDING GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS
4-H'ers who have completed grades 4-12 are eligible to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair in the 4-H Fair Classes.

4-H members exhibiting at the Woodbury County Fair must have had their 4-H Enrollment form and the Iowa Code of Ethics on file at the Woodbury County Extension office by May 15 to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair. In addition to the enrollment form 4-H members must have on file with

their leader and the Extension office, an Iowa 4-H Medical Information/Release Form to exhibit at the County Fair. Youth in the Clover Kids program for members in grades K-3 may exhibit projects in the 4-H building. Clover Kids members will receive a participation ribbon(s) for their exhibits. What the 4-H Judge looks for when judging your fair exhibit

Check out this website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects> this site list the 4-H Project Hot Sheets and most important the Exhibit Tip Sheets. The site for the tip sheets is: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/tipsheets.htm>. The exhibit tip sheets tell you exactly what is needed for county fair judging. Most important are the 3 questions that you need to answer for each of your exhibits.

- 1) What did you plan to learn or do? (What was your exhibit goal(s)?)

- 2) What steps did you take to learn or do this? Explain what you wanted to do so it is easily understood. The judge wants to know and understand the steps you used to make your exhibit.

- 3) What were the most important things you learned? You can design your own form or if you would like you can request a goal form from the Extension Office or check out the fair forms at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/woodbury/kidsteens.htm> - you will need a goal form for each exhibit.

4-H Pie Contest

The 4-H Pie Contest is our county 4-H fundraiser. Each club is expected to bake a pie for the pie contest that will be held on Saturday, August 6. All pies will be sold at the pie Auction. 4-H Clubs can decide who in the club will bake the pie. It could be a club pie baking contest, drawing a name out of a hat or a 4-H'er who volunteers to bake the pie.

Each 4-H club pie must be a two-crust pie. Pie filling can be fresh fruit, homemade canned or canned fruit in a disposable pie tin. No egg custard or uncooked dairy products. The recipe must be Included.

Practice baking your pie –comments from judges in the past have been that pie crusts are soggy on the bottom (it takes a little higher temperature for the first few minutes when

baking a pie in an aluminum pie tin). Use fresh shortening or lard, have the correct amount of thickener for your fruit (look over your recipe before baking your pie) and seal the pie crust. We want the best baked pies for our pie auction. See the county fair book for more information on the 4-H Pie Contest.

The money from the pie sale is used for:

Medical insurance for each 4-H member and leader, 4-H recognition and awards, State 4-H Conference, leader workshops, Washington DC Citizenship trip, county fair, 4-H events – like the Halloween Party, 4-H Holiday, Shooting Sports, financial assistance for county and other district events.

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Fundraiser at the Fair: Garden Gizmos, Bird Houses & More

The Woodbury County 4-H Foundation is asking each 4-H club to help us raise funds again during our Silent Auction to be held during the Woodbury County Fair. The bird houses made by the clubs went over so well last year, that this year we are expanding the auction to include all kinds of lawn or garden ornament.

The Foundation is inviting clubs to make any lawn or garden ornament of their choosing.

A lawn or garden ornament might be a stepping stone, a bench, a garden flag, a gazing ball, a garden gnome, a trellis, a bird house or something completely original.

Each 4-H club will receive half of the money made from their donated item. Clubs may submit more than one item. Please bring items to the Woodbury County 4-H Foundation booth at the 4-H building on Monday, August, 1 beginning at 10 a.m. Bids will be accepted starting on Wednesday, August 3, at the Woodbury County 4-H Foundation booth in the 4-H building during open hours until Saturday, August 6, at 6 p.m. when the winners will be determined.

Complete Rules for Clothing Selection

Here are the complete rules for Clothing Selection, since some of the information is missing in the fair book for Clothing Selection. The 4-H \$15 Challenge and 4-H Fashion Revue rules are listed in the fair book.

4-H Clothing Selection

1. The Clothing Selection participant will model a purchased garment he or she selected. The ensemble will be evaluated on choice of color, fit, choice of accessories, appropriateness for the occasion and for the entrant. Knowledge about care and fiber content as well as oral and written reasons for the selection will be evaluated.
2. The outfit worn by the participant must be purchased. It may be purchased new or used. Gifts of clothing are not eligible. The purpose of this program is to help youth develop skills in buying clothing.
3. Entrants in the Clothing Selection program must have participated in a 4-H & Youth program.
4. Garments entered in the Clothing Selection program may not be entered in any other clothing class at the county fair.
5. Clothing Selection County Judging is held an evening in July. The judging date, time, and place will also be posted in the *4-H Scene*.
6. To receive premium money the 4-H'er must participate in the Fashion Revue and Clothing Selection Style Show held Sunday afternoon during county fair. If this is a problem, please contact the 4-H Superintendent.
7. Three Clothing Selection entrants (one boy, one girl, one minority) who have completed grades 9-12, worthy to represent the county at the Iowa State Fair Clothing Selection Program, will be selected. 4-H'ers may participate only one time in the Iowa State Fair Clothing Selection program. Outfits or accessories that will be worn in the Clothing Event program may not be entered as another State Fair exhibit from the county. Participants selected for State Fair who decide not to participate at the state level must reimburse

the county for the State Fair fee. For information on State Fair Clothing Event and the report form that Senior members must complete can be found at the Iowa 4-H website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4H/StateFair/StateFairInfo.htm> Woodbury County State Fair winners will attend the 4-H A Wardrobe event on Thursday, August 11 at Iowa State University Memorial Union in Ames, Iowa.

8. All entrants are required to complete a written explanation of project accompanied by a photograph of the entrant wearing the outfit to be modeled.
 9. Participants in grades 9-10 are responsible for using a minimum of one art principle (rhythm, emphasis, proportion, balance, unity) and the element or elements (shape/form, color, texture, line) used in the selected principle. Participants in grade 11-12 are responsible for using a minimum of two art principles and the elements used in the selected principles. Youth must explain how the elements are used to illustrate the selected principle(s). 4-H members in grades 4th – 8th are encouraged to use design elements and art principles in their write-up.
- Clothing Selection - suggested categories:
- Casual Clothes: Clothes for school or work. Work may range from professional to non-technical and service types. Restaurant, sales, hospital (receptionist, nurses' aide), grocery, store (from manager to stock person), house cleaning, secretary, 4-H volunteer, etc. are examples of types of clothes that might suggest casual clothes.
- Sport or Functional Clothes: clothes that assist with a task or activity, protect you from the environment or promote safety, i.e., bicycling, temperature control situation, or for use in a specific hazardous situation, i.e., farming. This clothing may be selected to minimize environmental conditions or to help prevent accidental injury. Clothing to meet special needs of a handicapped condition fit under this category.
- Special Occasion (dressy) clothes: Clothing for special events: graduation, prom, wedding, etc. Clothing is chosen to allow personal expression with some thought to future use.

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State Fair Selection

4-H'ers whose exhibits are eligible for state fair may want to prepare labels ahead of time for your exhibit(s). State fair exhibits require labels on all items in your display. You will need enough labels for every page of your write up and goal sheet (maybe set the computer to do that as a footer) and for every item in your display. Some exhibits need up to 50 or more labels.

The preprinted labels will come in handy when you get your project ready for state fair because those exhibits need to be in the Extension office the Monday after fair on August 8,

by NOON. This leaves very little time to prepare and clean up your exhibit for state fair. You cannot prepare or put labels on your exhibit until after release on Sunday, August 7, 4:00 p.m.

The label needs to include:

Woodbury County Class number (look in fair book – it's the same number you use for county fair) Your first and last name

Information for Out of County Shows

Listed below is information on State Fair (State Fair book is only available online), Clay County (Clay County rule books are available at the Woodbury County Extension office or use last year's book) and Ak-Sar-Ben (Ak-Sar-Ben rule book is only available online). *Entry forms will be available at the Woodbury County Extension office in early summer for Clay County. State fair 4-H entry forms are only available on-line at <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/StateFair/livestock.htm>. Look for 4-H livestock entry form.*

Entry fees vary for each show. It is the responsibility of each 4-H'er and their parents to read the rule book and follow entry rules. No entries will be accepted after the entry due date. Fees must also be paid at entry time.

Iowa State Fair, Aug. 11 - 21. Entries & fees Due July 1

Livestock/Animal, Dog and Horticulture entries are due July 1. 4-H Building exhibits are selected during County Fair. 4-H'ers must have completed grade 5 to be eligible to exhibit at state fair. Premium books and open class entry forms will be available online at www.iowastatefair.org beginning in late May. Clay County Fair, Sept. 10 - 18. Entries & fees Due July 15

Livestock entries and fees are due in the Woodbury Extension office on Friday, July 15. Additional sheep and swine may be identified for the Clay County Fair - contact the Woodbury office for details before May 15. 4-H'ers must wear an official Clay County T-shirt. Ak-Sar-Ben, Sept. 22 - 25. Entries & fees due August 12

Livestock and horse entries are due Friday, August 12 in the Woodbury Extension office. Horse exhibitors must be 12 years old by January 1, 2011. Other exhibitors must be 10 years old by January 1, 2011. Go to the following web site: www.aksarben.org for more information on Ak-Sar-Ben. The rule book is only available online and will be out in early summer.

Please note: 4-H'ers who plan to exhibit hogs, lambs, meat goats and feeder calves must have the animal identified on the Sunday, May 15 Livestock Identification forms, but all DNA must be in the Extension office by June 1 to exhibit at Ak-Sar-Ben. Market Beef have already been identified.

Recording your Animal's Health

Now that most of the 4-H members have their animal projects. It is important that you start keeping records of their health and the medicines that you give your animals. 4-H members may go online at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/StateFair/livestock.htm> and look for "Drug Affidavits" on that site. There are forms for: Beef, Horse, Meat Goats, Sheep and Swine. The forms are required for State Fair and especially for Swine for county fair.

Hang Tags

Hang Tags are needed to identify your project for county fair. The tag helps to identify who the project belongs too and what class the project is entered in.

This tag helps the 4-H fair superintendent's and 4-H judges know whose project it is when judging the exhibit for county fair and selection for state fair.

Hang tags must be requested from your 4-H leader. None will be available at the fair. It is your responsibility to make sure you have those attached BEFORE you come to the fair.

Design Elements and Art Principles

You will still need to tell about your design elements and art principles for exhibits in clothing and fashion, sewing and needlework, visual art, and home improvement.

4-H Building Entry Form

Enclosed in this issue of the *4-H Scene* is the 4-H/FFA Building Entry Form. This form has been revised. You will need to fill out this form and bring it with you to fair on judging day, Monday, August 1. After your exhibits have been judged, you will need to take your form to the premium table in the Varied Industry building to receive your fair money.

County Fair 4-H Forms – Due July 15

In the June *4-H Scene* the Livestock/Animal Entry form was sent out along with the Horse/Rabbit Entry form. Those forms are due Friday, July 15 to the Woodbury County Extension office. Also enclosed in the June *4-H Scene* was the 4-H Communications form.

4-H Exhibitor Pass

4-H members must purchase a youth exhibitor pass for \$2. The passes are available from the Woodbury County Fair in Merville, or check with your 4-H Leader. Some of the 4-H leaders will pick them up for their members or you can purchase them from the Woodbury County Extension office.

The Woodbury County Fair Board required all 4-H members and FFA students to have a youth exhibitor pass to exhibit at the county fair.

Mandatory State Fair Meeting

A Mandatory State Fair Meeting will be held on Wednesday, August 3, at 4:30 pm at Flathers Hall.

Labeling will be explained and other helpful tips to get your exhibit ready for state fair. All 4-H'ers who have projects selected for state fair (includes all champion and reserve champion exhibits) are required to attend the Mandatory State Fair meeting.

“County Only” Horticulture exhibitors are not required to attend as those are county only classes – but we would like you to come for pictures.

If you are not present at the mandatory meeting, the alternate (reserve champion which are rank 1, 2 3...) exhibit will be able to have their exhibit go to the state fair. 4-H'ers who have completed 5-12 grades are eligible for state fair.

Pictures for Champion and Reserve will be taken after the Mandatory State Fair Meeting.

Copyright Question

Q. Can you offer general guidelines for 4-H members to follow regarding exhibits and copyright?

A. Each case is different, and it is very hard to offer recommendations that will apply to all exhibits. However, use the following guidelines as a start:

- 1) **Create something original**
- 2) **If it's not yours, obtain written permission**
- 3) **Give proper credit, even when you have permission**

Horticulture Publications - FREE

There are two publications on preparing vegetables for exhibit and preparing flowers for exhibit. There is a \$1 charge for each of the publications if you come into the office, but they are available online FREE at:

Click on Yard and Garden located on left side. Then on new screen click on Gardening – Vegetables and Herbs for the Preparing Vegetables for Exhibit OR click on Gardening – Flowers for Preparing Flowers for Exhibit. You can print your own free copy.

Photography – What you need for fair

For all exhibits, be prepared to explain:

- **What did you plan to learn or do? (What was your exhibit goal(s)?)**
- **What steps did you take to learn or do this?**

Explain what you wanted to do so it is easily understood. The judge wants to know and understand the steps you used to create your final photograph.

- **What were the most important things you learned?**

Start with a well defined photography goal:

- **Does the photography goal relate specifically to the photography exhibit entered?**
- **Does the goal use photography terminology?**

Example: To place my photo's point of interest by using rule of thirds.

Include the following information in your response to the question: "What steps did you take to learn or do this?"

Camera Information: Digital or Film
Camera Brand and Model: Pixel count

- **Do you have additional lenses? Yes/No**
- **Was the lens you used to take this photo the one that came with the camera? Yes/No**

If no, what lens did you use?

- **If your photo is enlarged, who enlarged it? Where was it printed?**

- **Were any changes made to the original photo to create the final exhibit? Yes/No**

(Include such things as cropping, color enhancement, size of exhibit, removal of red eyes, etc.)

If Yes, list the changes and tell why the decisions were made to make the changes.

- **Who determined what changes, if any, were to be made to the photograph?**
- **Who designed and selected the mounting or matting?**
- **Who actually did the mounting of matting?**
