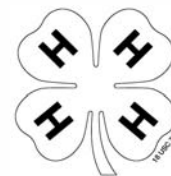

Lamb Tagging and Weigh Date is May 12

Please note that this is the second Saturday of May

All market (includes the pen of 5 fat lamb class), commercial ewe and ram lambs must be ear tagged and weighed on May 12, at the Woodbury County Fair Grounds from 8:00 am – 11:00 am. 4-H'ers will receive a Sheep Identification (ID) Form at the weigh-in. This form is due at the weigh-in or on or before May 15. 4-H'ers who plan to show a registered lamb must have registration number and birthdate on the ID Form by May 15.

4-H'ers may weigh and identify 12 market lambs, 12 breeding ewes and 5 lambs for the fat lamb class. See last year's fair book for the number of animals that can be exhibited at county fair. 4-H'ers who plan to show a ewe in the Production Yearling Ewe Class (#6035) will not need to re-tag the animal, but it must be listed on this year's identification form. Tags cost \$1.50 each. For more information contact Sheep Superintendents: Alan Ralston 712-873-3471 or Penny Yaremko 712-372-4722.

Please Note: 4-H'ers who want to exhibit lambs at the Iowa State Fair and/or Ak-Sar-Ben will need to bring their lambs to the May 12th Tagging and Weigh-in for verification. Lamb will be for tagged, nose printed and DNA extracted. The 4-H'er and a parent must be present for the verification on May 12. If the 4-H'er is not present – a waiver form must be signed and brought to the weigh-in; and if the parent is not present – the parent must sign a waiver form. Forms can be requested from the Extension Office or you may go to the following website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4H/Agriculture/index.htm>. The Sheep Identification Form is due on May 15; it is important that all information is on the ID form and turned into the Extension Office on or before May 15.

Meat Goats: 4-H'ers who want to exhibit meat goats at the Iowa State Fair must also have their animals tagged & verified on May 12, 8:00am – 11:00 am at the Fairgrounds in Merville.

Fair 4-H Changes

Medical Information/Release Form

4-H'ers who plan to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair must have on file with their club leader and the Extension Office an Iowa 4-H Medical Information/Release Form. This is required for fair and for any 4-H event on the club, county and state level that the 4-H member is involved in through 4-H.

Clarify Sheep Rate of Gain

The highest gaining market lambs of .75 lbs or the top 10 lambs (which ever is the smaller group) will be paraded prior to the selection of the Grand Champion Market Lamb.

4-H Dog Obedience Classes

**4-H Dog Classes “kick off” on May 7, 7:00 pm
At the Woodbury County Fairgrounds.**

Dog Obedience Classes will be held every Monday starting on May 7, 7:00 pm at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds. Other class dates: May 14, 21; June 4, 11, 18, 25; July 9, 16, 23. (no classes on May 28 and July 2). At the first class bring a copy of your dog's current shots and rabies certificate. Make sure your dog has a buckle collar or choke collar and a 6 ft nylon or leather lead. All 4-H'ers who attend the training must have on file the Iowa 4-H Medical Information/Release Form...check with your 4-H Leader if you are unsure if you have turned in this important form.

4-H'ers who plan to show their dog at the Woodbury County Fair must fill out a Livestock Identification form that will be due on or before May 15. 4-H'ers exhibiting dogs must also fill out a 4H Fair Animal/Livestock Entry Form that is due July 13.

Livestock Identification (ID) Forms Due May 15 at the Woodbury Extension Office



In this issue of the 4-H Scene and in the March 4-H Scene is a Livestock/Animal Identification Form. 4-H'ers who plan to exhibit livestock and/or animals at the Woodbury County Fair must fill out a Livestock Identification form. The form is due on or before Monday, May 15, at the Woodbury County Extension Office. A postmark of May 15 is accepted, (but a postage meter mark is not accepted). Faxes are unacceptable - the original must be mailed or delivered to the Extension Office. The Livestock Identification Form is also available on line at the Woodbury County Extension Website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/woodbury/> click on Kids and Teens/4-H on the left hand side and it will bring up a screen with the 4-H Scene, and other forms.

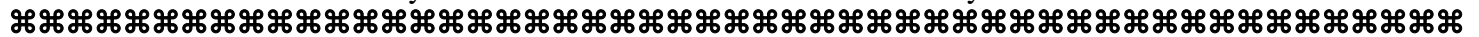
Livestock/animals that need to be identified on the ID form includes: Dairy Cattle, Dairy & Meat Goats, Breeding Heifers, Cow-Calf pairs, Feeder Calf, Swine, Horse and Dogs (*Rabbits, Poultry, Cats or Small Pets do not need to be on this form*). Sheep Identification forms will be handed out at the May 12 tagging and weigh-in. Market Beef ID forms were due January 15, 2007.

All information asked for on the form must be filled out. If you have a registered animal – the tattoo **MUST** be written on the ID Form by May 15.

No late livestock identification forms will be accepted, which means the animal can not be shown at the Woodbury County Fair or other shows that require a 4-H Identification Form.

State Fair, Clay County Fair and Ak-Sar-Ben Exhibitors: 4-H'ers **MUST** request a State ID form (please indicate specie) if they plan to exhibit livestock/animals at State Fair, Ak-Sar-Ben or Clay County. 4-H'ers showing Rabbits and Poultry at Clay County must request special Clay County Identification Forms to exhibit those animals at Clay County Fair. Those are also due May 15.

Every year a few 4-H'ers do not get their Livestock ID form in on time and then are ineligible to exhibit at Fair. Don't be one of them – fill out your ID form and turn it in on or before May 15.

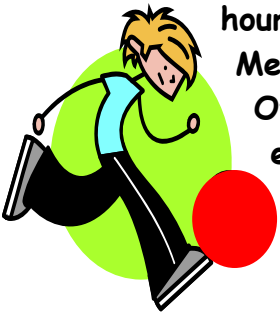
4-H Intermediate Event - May 6

Information for Out of County Shows

Listed below is information on State Fair, Clay County and Ak-Sar-Ben. *Rule books and entry forms will be available at the Woodbury County Extension Office in early summer. NO entry forms or rule books are available at this time.* Entry fees vary for each show. It is the responsibility of each 4-H'er and parents to read the rule book and follow entry rules. No entries will be accepted after the entry due date. Fees must also be paid at entry time.

❖ Iowa State Fair, August 9 - 19, 2007

Entries & Fees Due July 2

Livestock/Animal, Dog and Horticulture entries are due (or postmarked by July 2). 4-H Building exhibits are selected during County Fair. 4-H'ers must have completed 5th grade to be eligible to exhibit at State Fair.

A form is available for State Fair Discount Exhibitor tickets that may be purchased prior to July 20. *If exhibitors want a State Fair 4-H Book and entry forms mailed to them for the cost of postage and handling, please request by June 20 to the Woodbury County Extension office. Or pick up the forms and book (no costs) at the Extension Office.* For other State Fair events and shows contact: Iowa State Fair, Statehouse, Des Moines, IA 50319 or call 515-262-3111 or their website is: www.iowastatefair.com
The Extension Office only has information on 4-H events; you must contact the Iowa State Fair on Open Class and Grandstand Events.

Entries & Fees Due July 13

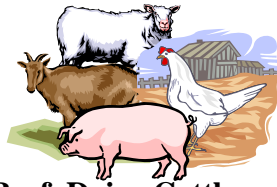
Livestock entries and fees are due in the Woodbury Extension Office on July 13. Additional sheep and swine may be identified for the Clay County Fair - contact the Woodbury Office for details before May 15. 4-H'ers must wear an official Clay County T-shirt. ❖ Ak-Sar-Ben, September 25 - 30, 2007

Entries & Fees due August 17

Livestock and horse entries are due August 17 in the Woodbury Extension Office. Horse exhibitors no longer need to qualify at a Qualifying Horse Show to exhibit horses at Ak-Sar-Ben. Horse exhibitors must be 12 years old by January 1, 2007. Other exhibitors must be 10 years old by January 1, 2007. Food Safety Quality Assurance (FSQA)
IMPORTANT if you plan to exhibit at County Fair in Beef, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep & Swine



4-H'ers who are 9, 10 & 11 years old (as of Jan 1)

A workshop held on April 26 – if you missed that workshop, you will need to attend a workshop in another county. 4-H'ers must attend a work shop every year they are 9, 10 & 11 years old.

4-H'ers who are 12, 13, 14 years old (as of Jan 1)

You can attend a work shop or you can test out. You only need to take the test once in this age group and pass the test. Test can be taken more than once. Test have not been scheduled yet, so be sure to fill out the form that was in the March 4-H Scene so that we have a record of who needs to take the test. Once you test out in this age group, you don't need to take a test until you turn 15 years old.



4-H'ers who are 15 years and up

You are required to take a test. Once you test out, you don't need to take the test again as a youth.



Need help with taking the test? There is a 4-H Food Quality Assurance publication for \$2 or the Youth Quality Assurance Booklet from the National Pork board that is free.
