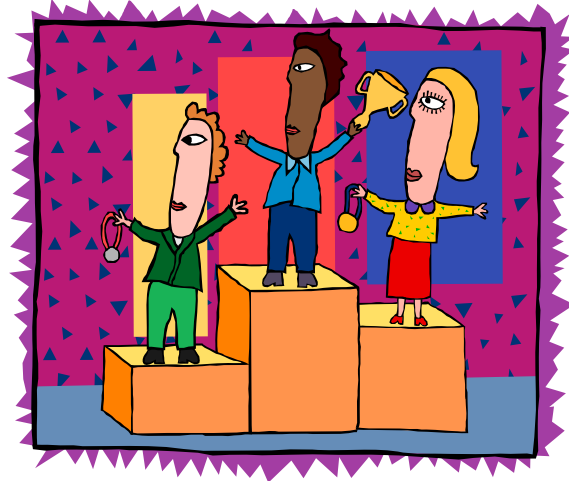

If you plan to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair the following forms are due at the Woodbury County Extension office on or before May 15:

- Enrollment Form and \$20 enrollment Fee
- Medical Release Form
- Iowa Youth Ethics Form
- Livestock Identification Form

Forms not turned in by May 15 will make you ineligible to show in 4-H at the Woodbury County Fair.

Ak-Sar-Ben Information for Exhibiting: Market Broilers, Feeder Calf and Swine

To be eligible to exhibit market swine or feeder calves families must pull an individual hair sample and submit it in an Ak-Sar-Ben issued collection envelope. These samples are due June 15. Envelopes and directions on how to take samples are available at the Woodbury County Extension Office.

4-H'ers interested in the Ak-Sar-Ben Market Broiler class must submit entry form by July 1. Cost is \$55 for 50 chicks – families can share birds. Registration form is available at: www.aksarben.org

Dog Obedience Classes will be held every Sunday starting at 7:00 pm at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds. At the first class bring a copy of your dog's current shots and rabies certificate. Make sure your dog has a buckle collar or choke collar and a 6 ft nylon or leather lead. All 4-H'ers who attend the training must have on file the Iowa 4-H Medical Information/Release Form...check with your 4-H Leader if you are unsure if you have turned in this *important* form.

4-H'ers who plan to show their dog at the Woodbury County Fair must fill out a Livestock Identification form that will be due on or before May 15. 4-H'ers exhibiting dogs must also fill out a 4H Fair Animal/Livestock Entry Form that is due July 11.

Livestock Identification (ID) Forms Due May 15 at the Woodbury Extension Office



In the April 4-H Scene was a the Livestock/Animal Identification Form. 4-H'ers who plan to exhibit livestock and /or animals at the Woodbury County Fair must fill out a Livestock Identification form. The form is due on or before Monday, May 15, at the Woodbury County Extension Office. A postmark of May 15 is accepted, (but a postage meter mark is not accepted). Faxes are unacceptable - the original must be mailed or delivered to the Extension Office. The Livestock Identification Form is also available on line at the Woodbury County Extension Website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/woodbury/> click on Kids and Teens/4-H on the left hand side and it will bring up a screen with the 4-H Scene, and other forms.

Livestock/animals that need to be identified on the ID form includes: Dairy Cattle, Dairy & Meat Goats, Breeding Heifers, Cow-Calf pairs, Feeder Calf, Swine, Horse and Dogs (*Rabbits, Poultry, Cats or Small Pets do not need to be on this form*). Sheep Identification forms were handed out at the May 3 tagging and weigh-in. Market Beef ID forms were due January 15, 2008.

All information asked for on the form must be filled out. If you have a registered animal – the tattoo **MUST** be written on the ID Form by May 15.

No late livestock identification forms will be accepted, which means the animal can not be shown at the Woodbury County Fair or other shows that require a 4-H Identification Form.

State Fair, Clay County Fair and Ak-Sar-Ben Exhibitors: 4-H'ers **MUST** request a State ID form (please indicate specie) if they plan to exhibit livestock/animals at State Fair, Ak-Sar-Ben or Clay County. 4-H'ers showing Rabbits and Poultry at Clay County must request special Clay County Identification Forms to exhibit those animals at Clay County Fair. Those are also due May 15.

Every year a few 4-H'ers do not get their Livestock ID form in on time and then are ineligible to exhibit at Fair. Don't be one of them – fill out your ID form and turn it in on or before May 15.

Food Safety Quality Assurance (FSQA)
IMPORTANT and REQUIRED if you plan to exhibit at County Fair
in Beef, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep & Swine



Did you miss the FSQA workshop or need to test out?

If you missed the workshops held in an April - another workshop will be planned for Woodbury County, no date or time has yet been set. You must fill out a registration form and you will be notified of the testing and workshop. The registration form was in the April 4-H Scene or go online at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/woodbury/kidsteens.htm> and click on the March/April 4-H Scene.

4-H'ers must attend a work shop every year they are 9, 10 & 11 years old as of January 1 and if you exhibit beef, dairy cattle, goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep and/or swine.

4-H'ers who are 12, 13, 14 years old (as of Jan 1) - You can attend a workshop or you can test out. You only need to take the test once in this age group and pass the test. Test can be taken more than once. Test has not been scheduled yet, so be sure to fill out the form that was in the April 4-H Scene so that we have a record of who needs to take the test. Once you test out in this age group, you don't need to take a test until you turn 15 years old.

4-H'ers who are 15 years and up - You are required to take a test. Once you test out, you don't need to take the test again as a youth. Testing has not been scheduled yet, but if you need to take a test, please fill out the FSQA form that was in the April 4-H Scene.

Need help with taking the test? There is a 4-H Food Quality Assurance publication for \$2.50 or the Youth Quality Assurance Booklet from the National Pork board that is free.
