

## Lyon County Project Award Guidelines Grades 4-5-6

These awards are divided into three categories: **Green, Blue, and Purple**. 4-H members need to follow a specific process in applying for project awards which includes an application form and 4-H Story. The award at each level can only be earned once in each project area.
