Bike Rodeo

Sponsored by 4-H Youth Council

Tuesday 5:30pm at the Horse Barn

1. Participants register at 5pm at Youth Council Booth.
2. Participants need not be 4-H or FFA members, but they must be old enough to control a bike.
3. HELMETS RECOMMENDED
4. Bike security is the responsibility of the owner. Bring your own padlock. Bikes may be stored in the small animal building after noon on Tuesday. There will be no security guard on duty in the building.
5. Riding of bikes will not be allowed on grounds prior to event. Persons disobeying will be disqualified.
6. All participants will receive ribbons.
7. Classes will be divided by age.

Classes

Big Wheel

Age 6 and under. Straight race—approximately 80 feet.

Board Run

A participant will ride his/her bike on a 6"x30' long board. The goal of the event is to have the slowest and most accurate ride. A five second penalty point will be assessed each time a foot touches the ground.

Pole Race

Participants will ride as fast as possible around five poles placed 20 feet apart (and back again) without stopping, knocking down the poles, or touching the ground with their feet. The person with the shortest time will be the winner.

Bike Bulldog

Participants will ride from starting line approximately 100 feet, dismount, carry out an instruction, remount and ride back to starting line. The person with the shortest time will be the winner.

Other events may be added.

Fair Dance

The dance will be held in the Home Economics Building. It is open to 4-H and FFA members, their guests and 4-H and FFA alumni. All persons will be charged \$2.00 at the gate. There will be no alcohol or illegal drugs allowed on the fairgrounds. This applies to youth and adults. If found, all alcohol will be emptied and further action will be determined by the Linn County Sheriff's Department who will be on site during the dance. There will be no smoking on the fairgrounds during the dance. A waiting area for parents will be set up in Building #2. Official dance chaperones will be wearing identification.
