

Regulations Pertaining to County and Shows

Age of Exhibitors

1. To be eligible for a poultry or rabbit at the county fair, a 4-H'er can be Cloverbud /Clover Kid through 12th grade (or that equivalent) prior to the event unless a particular show is more restrictive. FFA members will follow their guidelines. (State Fair – 5th-12 grades)
2. A 4-H'er becomes ineligible to exhibit beyond the county level upon completion of the calendar year of high school graduation. Note: In the event that a 4-H'ers dropped out of high school, the 4-H'er is only eligible to exhibit livestock through the calendar year that his/her class graduated.

Ownership:

All of the animals must be owned by and identified to the individual 4-H'er. When registration papers are involved the papers must either be in the 4-H'ers name or show a logical family relationship. Animals changing ownership after being identified as a project are ineligible to be exhibited as 4-H-FFA animals for that program year.

Animals offered for sale are considered to have changed ownership even though bought back by the original owner.

Identification:

Animals identified as part of a 4-H project cannot also be identified or exhibited as a FFA project.

Deadline:

Pets, Poultry, and Rabbits must be owned and identified by **June 15**.

Special Note:

Cats must be at least 3 months old and have current rabies vaccination. Proof of vaccination will be needed at fair show -- Receipt of vaccination serum is NOT valid for rabies certificate. Copy of vaccination records can be turned in with this form or with fair entry form.

Rabbits: Bring a carpet square to show your animal on.

Filing Your ID Sheet:

Return to the Extension Office by **June 15**.
