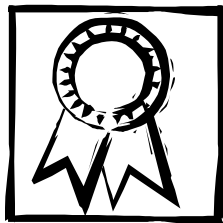

FAIR UPDATE

FAIR ENTRY DAY: JULY 15

July 15th will be here before we know it and that is the day you will need to have all entries into the Extension Office. The form is in three parts: the **white** copy is turned into the office by the 15th, the **yellow** copy is for you, and the **pink** copy goes to your leader. See if you can get them in early! All members will be receiving all forms; we ask that you return unneeded forms with your completed forms. If you lose these forms, single copies are located on our website.

Exhibitor shirts available

All **exhibitors** will have the option to buy a shirt for \$3 (not just livestock exhibitors as in the past). You are only allowed one and it must be ordered by July 15 through your club or chapter. Additional ones can be purchased for \$6 and you may still wear the gray shirts too.

Project vs. Exhibit

Throughout the 4-H year, you learned and then demonstrated to your club how to make cookies. Next you made cookies for the 4-H Club bake sale and finally gave cookies to senior citizens. The learning and activities done during a year create the project. The Exhibit is the plate of cookies and the explanation of your achieved goal for them. Be sure to explain how you achieved your goal, what you learned as you worked to achieve your goal, and what you may do differently in the future. The exhibit tells the audience what you learned while achieving your goal, a single idea of the project. The project enhances skills learned from accomplishing a goal. For example, sharing your cookies with senior citizens enhances your citizenship skills, as you are being kind to those in your community.

Code of ethics form required by July 15.

Every exhibitor (non-livestock & livestock) at the Kossuth County fair must return the Code of Ethics form that was sent to you with your fair entry form to be eligible to exhibit. This form is due July 15 and is to be signed by the exhibitor and each living parent or guardian.

Food Safety Quality Assurance (FSQA)

All livestock exhibitors (except dog, horse, llama & pet) are required to have a FSQA certification. You will not be allowed to show without it. If you were 12 by Jan. 1 or older, you need to come in and take the test soon. We had asked exhibitors to do this by July 1. Contact the office with questions.

Livestock: You must make individual livestock entry. Forms have been sent out. If you didn't get one, contact the office right away. We need to know the number of animals you will be bringing and the types. This information is important to insure a stall or tie space for your animal. Remember you must have a current FSQA certification on file at the Extension Office (except dog, horse, llama and pet exhibitors) before you can only enter animals that were identified.

Sick animals stay home: With all of the animals at the fair, we do not want to start any widespread diseases, so if you know your animal is sick, please leave it at home.

Horses: Should be vaccinated for SST and flu. You may pick up class cards at the office anytime. Complete them before fair and bring back to the horse arena by 8:00 a.m. the day of show. All horse exhibitors must house one horse on the fairgrounds from Wednesday evening to Sunday evening or you will not show. All exhibitors are required to wear a helmet at all times. Consider vaccinating for West Nile Virus if you have not already.

Swine: Erysipelas Booster & Premise ID needed:

Exhibitors are reminded that pigs should have received a booster shot for erysipelas prior to the fair within the recommended time for the product they are using. Check with your vet if you have any questions. See Premise ID information farther back in newsletter.

Poultry: Exhibitors are reminded that all birds (chickens, ducks, turkeys, etc.) must come from a Pullorum-free hatchery or be tested within 90 days of the fair. Either the hatchery certificate or the test certificate must be presented before unloading your birds at the fair. If you need your poultry project tested or if you are not sure if you should, please contact the Extension Office and we will help determine if you need a test and/or set a date and time to have it tested.

Auction notes

The livestock ribbon auction is on Sunday, August 9 starting at 5 p.m. We will be using two auction rings with buyers bidding on the exhibitors ribbon and not on ownership of the animal. All exhibitors will be able to sell a livestock ribbon through the auction and must sign up at the livestock office within one hour following each show. The animal will not go through the auction ring. Extra ribbons will be provided for buyers if needed, you keep yours. Because Exhibitors sell one entry per specie, there is no additional fair premium for livestock

Livestock exhibitor checklist

Taking care of your animals is very important all year, but especially during the fair. The following is a checklist for you to follow to make sure you're giving your animals the best care.

- ✓ Check labels, and make sure you have observed all withdrawal times for drugs, including feed additives, prior to and during the fair.
- ✓ Give your animal enough food and water. Remember, as temperatures climb, animals need more water.
- ✓ Provide your animal with clean, dry bedding.
- ✓ Keep your animal clean.
- ✓ Keep the barn and surrounding areas clean. Place used bedding and manure in designated areas.
- ✓ Handle your animal with care at all times. Only you or someone who knows your animal, such as your parent or brother/sister, should handle your animal. People who are not familiar with animals will be walking around so please be aware of them.
- ✓ If your animal shows signs of illness or is injured, notify the superintendent in your department or Extension staff so the fair veterinarian can be contacted.
- ✓ If your animal is tied, exercise your animal daily.
- ✓ Plan a schedule with other 4-H'ers so at least one attendant is with your animals during the times the fair is open to the public.
- ✓ Always wash your hands after working with your animal to prevent spreading germs and diseases.

Restricted mammalian protein feeds and drug withdrawals

The producer-signed affidavits are guaranteeing the packers that the cattle have not been fed restricted mammalian protein feeds. Packers are requiring this because the fast food industry is demanding this of them, the suppliers of beef products. Why? Because of the concern of Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) and the potential to be spread by the consumption of BSE contaminated beef by-products. Even though this has never been a problem in the U.S., the concern and fear that consumer's have must be addressed. In order to help you follow all food safety rules and regulations, the state 4-H Office has modified the previously used drug affidavit and separated the swine, beef, and sheep forms to meet these new requests. We also have a fact sheet for use with **beef** and **sheep** exhibitors explaining these new rules and regulations. They revised the previously used drug affidavit for use with **beef** and **sheep**, to include the new regulation on restricted mammalian protein feeds. These statements include the medications used, as well as certification on the use of approved feeds. 4-H'ers should keep copies of the feed tags (labels) from the feeds they use that contain animal proteins due to new regulations. If any problem should arise in the future, the paper trail of feed labels will be important. Youth should be advised that feeds that state on the label "**not intended for cattle or sheep**" should **not** be used. The revised drug affidavit for use with **swine** has added a statement about the swine dysentery information

Horse stall decoration contest

Start thinking of ideas now for horse stall decoration contest. More details will be available at the fair.

Sheep rule

All sheep must be slick shorn on arrival at fair. Exhibitors will not be allowed to weigh their lambs if not sheered properly.

Static exhibits (non-livestock):

Entry must be made by July 15 at the Ext. Office. Individual members should have received an entry form to complete. If your club is having an achievement show or workday, take this form with you to complete. If you have questions, contact your leader or the office. You will pick up the white copy at the fair to take to the judges and return it to the front table in the 4-H Exhibits Building before leaving. If you do not return this form, you will not get recognition or premiums since this is the form that is used to calculate this information.

Judging day

We judge by project area, which means you might be seeing more judges, but it allows us to have better quality judges. We cannot expect judges to be knowledgeable in all areas. Your club will be assigned a block of time and members can go to judges in any area. The judging schedule is included in this newsletter.

Club displays

ALL exhibits will be displayed by club, the only special displays will be challenge classes, Jr. Recognition, State Fair & Alternates. We have not decided how the challenge class will be displayed.

Helpful hints for non-livestock fair exhibits:

- Baked items – include the recipe & source – be sure to read the *Inappropriate Food Exhibits for Iowa 4-H Fairs* in your fair book – it has been updated just this year!
- Use of alcoholic beverages in the preparation of production of 4-H food exhibits is not permitted.
- Charts, display boards, etc. are to be measured when flat (unfolded).
- Make sure the write up is complete. For State Fair the judge will only have your write-up to learn about your exhibit and see what you have learned.
- Include the steps of completion (research, baked items that flopped and what you learned, etc.)
- Include Design Elements/Art Principles if applicable – see fair book – class description
- If Child Development – include what are the ages and stages for the project, if your item is age appropriate, when you tested it out, what were the kids' responses, etc.
- Be sure to include where you got your information (source).
- Personal Development – you need to show how your involvement in the project has helped you grow and develop personally. This includes the self-determined area.

F & N Info. - preserved food items

Preserved food exhibits should have two (2) product samples if possible. One sample may be opened for evaluation. If it is opened, it will be returned to the exhibitor for disposal after the judge has completed their evaluation. The second sample will then be put on display. If only one sample of the product is available, the judge may open the sample for evaluation and no sample will be on display. If your product is selected to go to the Iowa State Fair, you will need to send two (2) sealed samples for judging if possible. At the State Fair, one sample of the exhibit WILL be opened for evaluation. Again, the first will be opened, judged, and discarded while the second will be put on display (the contents will be discarded and the jar saved). If only one sample is available, it will be judged and no sample will be displayed during the fair.

Fair Entry Forms & Tags

The following forms may be available from your leader or can be picked up at the Extension office:

- Yellow and green entry tags to attach to all fair exhibits
- Photography tags to attach to the back of photo. exhibits
- Poster tags to attach to the back of Poster Art posters
- Preserved food labels for all canned exhibits
- Individual fair entry form for both livestock & non-livestock – one per exhibitor – due July 15
- Report forms for Clothing Selection/ Fashion Revue (these will be mailed after you make entry)

What happens judging day

Come to the building with your exhibits, when it is your club's judging time, go to the check-in/out table at the south entrance, they will hand you your form to take with you to the judging tables. Tables will be labeled with the project area. When it is your turn, hand the form to the helper at the table. Next your exhibit will be judged.

You will have a chance to visit with the judge about your exhibit. Get your fair form back from the workers and go on to the next table. When you have everything judged, return your form back to the check in/out table and take all exhibits to your club's space. If your form is not returned, you will not receive your fair premium money.

Judging

When the judge looks at and visits with you about your exhibits they need to think about more than how your exhibit looks when they decide what ribbon to award you at the fair. The way your exhibit looks is important, but it is also judged by what you learned as you made it.

Judges want to know what goals you had as you made your exhibit and how you made it. This is why they talk with you as they judge your exhibit. Sometimes they will read your answers on your entry form and will still ask you some of the same questions. Talking with judges at the fair is a good way to feel good about your exhibit and learn tips for next year.



Need help with a static exhibit?

If you have questions concerning a family and consumer science exhibit you are working on, call the ISU Extension Families "Answer Line" at 1-800-262-3804. They are available to assist you Monday- Friday from 8-12 and 1-5 p.m. Feel free to contact the office too, we will try to help you or find the answers. You may also call the office at any time and we will be glad to help.

Copyright issues

Copyright rules and guidelines must be followed when creating a fair exhibit. Exhibits will be disqualified if they do not follow copyright guidelines. If you have questions, it is better to ask now. Jean will help you understand this if you are confused, just call the office.

Remember display size

Exhibit displays have always been limited to the 4' x 4' in size, except where stated in fair book (F & N exhibits have special guidelines). This measurement must be the flat unfolded dimension.

Fair help is still needed

The fair is a big event and to carry it out successfully it takes many people. This year especially with Bob not at fair, we could use some more volunteers!. If you have an area of interest that you would like to be a part of a team to carry out, contact the office. We will be putting schedules together soon so save your spot in an area you enjoy by calling the office by July 10th. I know you want the fair to be a success, so we will be looking forward to your call.

Exhibit help available

The design sheets located on the web would be helpful when writing about design elements and art principles in exhibit write-ups. (Needed in most clothing, home improvements and visual arts exhibits as written in your fairbook. PLEASE read your classes carefully!) Also the *Inappropriate Food Exhibits For Iowa 4-H Fairs* sheet is there too. If you would like a copy contact the Office. The Preserved Food 4-H Exhibit Label are here at the office. You need one label for each jar.

Clothing design guidelines

When application of design elements and art principles must be explained, the following guidelines shall be used:

- a) Members in grades 4-6 are responsible only for application of the design element line or color.
- b) Members in grades 7-8 are responsible only for application of two design elements.
- c) Members in grades 9-12 are responsible only for application of at least one design element and at least one principle of design.

Consider 4-H Poster Communication Class

Information on this class is found on page 40 of your fair book. Project enrollment is required. Read the class rule carefully. Note size requirements. There are four poster art themes to choose from. (a) 4-H is..."(open to 4-Hers interpretation); (b) Join 4-H; (c) "Voyage to Greatness" (2009 Iowa 4-H Youth Conference theme); (d) "4-H Time" (2009 Iowa State Fair theme)

4-H County Council activities

The 4-H County Council has been busy planning fun activities during the fair. Some events are fair parade float entry, teen dance, games and co-ed mud volleyball tournament. Please watch for more details. They also plan to clean in the armory before the fair.

Challenge class

We will be offering the challenge class with banana bread this year. Everyone makes the same recipe that is listed in the fair book. Project enrollment and goal cards are not required. You must make entry by July 15th so that we can assign a time for you to have your loaf to the judge.

Photography challenge class

Note the photography challenge class on page 36 of your fair book. This entry does not count against the photo limit and anyone can enter. This year the challenge photos is barns. Judging will be done by the photo judges anytime during the judging time.

4-H'ers in Action Photo: Holidays & Seasons

This is also explained on page 36 of your fair book. The Iowa 4-H Foundation announces a special opportunity for all 4-H members to participate in the 3rd annual, statewide photo exhibition titled, *4-H'ers in Action!* The theme this year is **Holidays & Seasons**, so all photos submitted must be taken by exhibitor and represent this theme. The exhibition will feature the best photo from each participating county and will be displayed at the Iowa State Fair.

Fashion Revue/Clothing Selection/\$15 Challenge

Anyone interested in Fashion Revue/or Clothing Selection should note that judging will take place on Thursday, July 30 at the Kossuth County Extension Office. Remember the \$15 challenge class, you may enter all three! Please make entry on your individual entry form. Report forms will be mailed to you a week before the judging day. If you would like your forms before then, contact the Extension Office. Note that the Clothing Event show will be on Wed., Aug.5 at 3 p.m at the fair. The clothing event program for the State Fair (for senior winners only) will be held Aug 14.

4-H Historical/Family Heritage fair display

Remember the special opportunity listed on page 39 of your fair book. This class provides an opportunity for 4-H'ers and adults to work as a team. No special project enrollment is required. Please consider this fair class, along with the others listed in the Other Opportunities section, which do not require specific project enrollment.

Exhibit release times

All exhibits in the 4-H Exhibit building will be released between 4-5:30 pm on Sunday, August 9. Livestock will be released after 6 pm. Exhibitors who have both are asked to pick up the Exhibit Building items **before** the auction starts or make other arrangements ahead of time with Jean.

Ak-Sar-Ben

Ak-Sar-Ben livestock exhibitor should try to get their entries into the office by **August 10**.

Clay County entries

If you are planning to exhibit at the Clay County Fair, your entries are due in the office by **July 15**. Fair books are in the office for exhibitors now. Clay County deadline will always be the same as the Kossuth County deadline.

Going to the State Fair?

Livestock entry deadline is **July 1**. State Fair exhibitors will receive one free ticket with your entry, which is good for one day only. Additional tickets for you or your family may be purchased by July 20 at \$7.00 each or \$3.00 for children 6-11 yrs. Forms for ordering are available at the Extension Office. Parking tickets are also available for exhibitors as part of your free ticket. All 4-H families are eligible for these tickets.

Community service grants

If your club is planning a community service project and could use some extra money, consider applying for a grant from the Friends of Kossuth Youth & 4-H. They provide seed money to help fund your group projects. Contact the office for more information. Grants are due July 1 or October 1 this year.

Iowa Beef Heifer Award

Any 4-H, FFA or Junior Beef Breed Association member who will exhibit a beef animal at the Iowa State Fair is eligible to compete for this award. Applications are due by July 31st to the Iowa Cattleman's Assn. Contact the office for an application.

Nature's Detectives Camp will be held July 9 & 10 at Smith Lake for those who have completed 4th to 6th grade. Call the office right away if you want to attend or invite a friend. Participants do not need to be in 4-H.

Enter the Barn Quilt Design Contest at fair

The Iowa State Fair is inviting Iowans to be involved in designing a quilt tile for the Richard O. Jacobsen Exhibition Center. A quilt design from each of Iowa's 99 counties will be displayed on the exterior walls of the Jacobsen Exhibition Center. Designs must consist of a patchwork pattern using geometric shapes with no animals, words, symbols or logos allowed. There is also a specific palette of colors also. Designs must use 2-5 colors chosen out of the specific color palette (blue, red, orange, green, teal, yellow, purple, brown, black and white). The Kossuth Extension Office has examples of the color palette available for reference. Designs must consist of four 8" by 8" tiles to form a 16" by 16" block. A 1" white border should be left on all 16" sides. Final designs must be drawn to scale on white paper using appropriate colors.

Designs must be submitted to the Kossuth Extension office by August 1. Fair attendees will have the opportunity to view the designs and the award winners will be announced following the fair. Please consider entering yourself and help us pass the word to everyone who might be interested. This contest is open to the general public.

Premise ID

What is Premise ID? Premise identification is part of the National Animal Identification System (NAIS) being developed to identify animals and track them as they move from one location to another. The purpose of the program is to create a database that will allow a rapid traceback in the event of a disease concern. Youth may already have a premise ID number for the farm where their 4-H animals are being cared for.

Who is Requiring Premise ID? Currently, Premise ID numbers are only required for 2008 by Tyson Fresh Meats. Other packers may soon follow in the coming years. This is mainly due to increasing requirements and precautions on food safety from not only U.S. entities but also those overseas including the Japanese market. Premise ID numbers will NOT be required for the 2008 Iowa State Fair 4-H exhibitors, **but will be required for all swine exhibitors going to the Clay County Fair.** Keep in mind, Premise ID number requirements may increase in 2009 for all swine exhibitors and possibly other species. Stay tuned for more information.

How do Youth Obtain a Premise ID Number? The Premise ID must be for the farm where the hogs are being cared for—if that is not where the 4-H'er lives, they will need the owner of the property where the hogs are being cared for to submit the form and the 4-H'er would use that number. Maintaining Key Markets for 4-H & FFA Projects

More and more packers are increasing their reluctance to purchase fair animals. There may be one or a number of reasons for this (drug residues, additional testing on fair animals as required by the Food Safety and Inspection Service). In order to keep this important avenue open to our youth livestock exhibitors and county fairs, youth need to be reminded on the importance and consequences of their actions. Feed additives and drug additives need to be followed according to their instructions and withdrawal periods. Every individual fair animal that goes to market does affect the market viability for everyone else. It can take only one occurrence for a packer to simply stop buying fair animals altogether.

Kossuth thoughts. Keep in mind that your need to use the premise ID of the location that the animals are housed, not by who owns them. It may take several weeks to receive the number, so it is important to complete the application right away.

2009 Kossuth County Fair
Judging Schedule for Exhibits Building
Tuesday, August 4

The 2009 judging schedule for the Exhibits Building for Tuesday, August 4 is as follows. Your exhibits are to be brought in during the time period scheduled for your club. This includes all non-livestock exhibits. Judging will be done by areas, two judges will judge all Clothing, another two will judge all Food & Nutrition, etc. Exhibitors will get in the line that pertains to each one of their exhibits.
