Beef Weigh-In & State Verification

The second weigh in and state verification is Saturday, Jan. 10 from 9– 11 am at the Algona Livestock Auction & Exchange. If you want to show market beef at the state fair, you must come to the state verification. There is a \$5 charge per head (\$5 more for Ak-Sar-Ben) and forms require both exhibitor and parent signature. Contact the office before weigh in for the form if either the parent or exhibitor cannot attend. Remember 2nd year bucket calves need come and you can also bring your breeding heifer in to be ID and you will not have to do that in May.

Record Keeping Forms on the Web

FSQA Training

If you are planning to show livestock inside or outside of Kossuth County, you MUST have FSQA (Food Safety Quality Assurance) certification. Those who are under 12 must take the training yearly. Those who are 12-14 by Jan. 1 will have the option of testing out or attending the training. If you opt to test out, you will not have to attend any sessions until you are 15. Those who are 15 or older can come to the training, but we encourage you to try to test out. If you test out, you will not have to test or go to the training again. Check your certification or call the office to check your expiration date. You have four options to attend training this year.

All training will be held at 7 pm.

Legislative Day, The Power of Youth an Old Event Made New

There are several exciting changes to the legislative day event this year! . The first big change is a change in name. The committee wanted to focus the event on leadership learning instead of simply a visit to the capital. To reflect this change in focus The old Legislative Day will be now be called “The Power of Youth, Iowa 4-H.” But what is being done is more than just a name change, Legislative Day is being entirely overhauled and refocused to make it into a premiere leadership learning experience for our 4-H'ers. The second big change is that in order to focus the impact of this event, it will be directed primarily at our Intermediate aged 4-H'ers (7th and 8th grade). Kossuth County Fair Approved Rule & Class Changes for 2009-10

Bucket Calf

- Change the starting requirement to completing Kindergarten instead of 5 years of age
- Calves will not be weighed at fair and will be shown by exhibitor grade/not by calf weight
- Rule #2 drop wording steer or heifer

Market Beef

- Second year bucket calf class change from dairy beef & beef to steer & heifer

Pen Cattle

- Start pen cattle show later
- Exhibitors have until noon check in day to change pen/carcass cattle entries around

Meat Goat

- class changes: Breeding
- Market 0-4 months
- Light weight 5-8 months
- Heavy weight 9-12 months
- Rate of Gain 12-24 months

Horse

- All State 4-H Guideline rules will be followed, including wearing 4-H armbands. Books & armbands may be purchased at office.
- Exhibitor must house at least one horse that was shown at the fair. (clarification rule)
- Age divisions Jr: 4-7th grade; Sr: 8-12th grade. (Followed in past, just put in writing)
- Showmanship – jr & sr class
- Jr & Sr costume classes will be combined into one class
- Add wording to Jr Pleasure class (Horse under saddle over 56") - was omitted in last printing

Poultry

- Add bantam class

Sheep

- Breeding and market class release times will be the same (Sunday)

Bottle Lamb

- Open bottle lambs will be shown by grade – start in Kindergarten like bucket calf
- Require completion of the questionnaire for 4-H members.

Breeding Sheep

Class 3: Purebred Ewe Lamb

- If at least 3 ewe lambs of any one breed are exhibited, that breed will have a separate class in this classification.

Market Lambs

Rule 10: forget 3 pound allowance and just say 87lbs.

Rule 11: Market lambs must have an average daily gain of at least .35 to be first or second in class.

Rule 15: Carcass lambs must be scanned to be eligible to show in the carcass class.

- No longer have a “Carcass On the Hoof” class. The only carcass class will be that using the scan data and rate of gain in the Iowa State formula to determine a winner based on retail value per days on feed. A more appropriate name for the class will be selected. The lambs will be lined up in the ring by their value and the judge may discuss them. The champion Carcass Lamb will compete for Grand Champion Market Lamb.
- Creation of a “White Face and Other” division for market lambs. Class size determined by entries. The champion White Face and Other market lamb will compete for Grand Champion Market Lamb.
- Creation of a “lotto” division in market lamb show. These would be lambs sold by one producer at feeder weight to interested 4-Hers. Lamb selection would be done by lotto or draw basis. Basis for evaluation at the fair would be at the judge’s discretion – show-type only, performance and type, showmanship, etc. The champion Lotto Lamb would compete for Grand Champion Market Lamb. (see back)
- The champion Black-Face Market Lamb will be selected from the three weight divisions as before. In the final Grand Champion selection, there would be five lambs with their respective five reserves.
- Champion Black-Face / Champion White Face / Champion Other / Champion Carcass / Champion Lotto

- Creation of a Performance Pen of Lambs division. Three lambs exhibiting number one pelts; show in pens; no leading or grooming allowed. Evaluation similar to pen cattle show – rate and cost of gain, knowledge of exhibitor, etc. Number of lambs allowed to be identified and weighed in for this class is not yet determined. (see below)

Swine – All exhibitors will be required to have a premises identification number

Non Livestock – Offer a people’s choice consideration for the Photography Challenge Class

- Note more non – livestock changes might come as State makes update in Jan/Feb.

New Sheep Classes:

PERFORMANCE LAMB PEN CLASS

**Note different than the pen of 3 market class we had in the past will still have in the future during the regular sheep show.

Overview: This project provides an opportunity to feed lambs on a businesslike and practical basis. Three (3) lambs will be judged in the pen with emphasis on rate and economy of gain, return per dollar invested and market value, uniformity, etc.

1. Lambs to be entered in the Performance Pen class must be weighed and tagged with an official 4-H tag during the spring Kossuth County market lamb weigh-in. Lambs will be designated for the Performance Pen class at weigh-in. 4-H exhibitors can weigh-in/enter a maximum of 2 pens with a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 lambs per pen. If more than one pen is entered, exhibitors must declare by ear tag the lambs designated for each pen. Pens can be wethers, ewes or mixed – no ram lambs allowed to be weighed. Animals identified for the Performance Pen class can be shown in the Performance Pen class only.
2. Feed records, including amounts fed and consumed and costs for feed and other products used, should be kept for use in judging the Performance Pen class. 4-H record forms will be provided. It is suggested that 4-H lambs be penned and fed separately from non-4-H lambs to maintain the integrity of the feed records.
3. Lambs in the Performance Pen class will be shown in fleece to maintain pelt value. All performance pens of 3 lambs must be shorn uniformly over the entire body no later than June 10. If needed, arrangements may be made to shear Performance Pen lambs at a common site.
4. The sheep superintendent will schedule a visit to each 4-H exhibitor’s facility sometime during the feeding period.
5. Lambs do not need to be halter-broken as the Performance Pen will be shown loose in a pen at the fair. The exhibitor will complete a summary of feed usage, costs, beginning and ending weight and value of each pen and other pertinent information. (Ending market value will be determined by Alta Livestock LLC and provided to sheep superintendent one week prior to the Kossuth County Fair Performance Pen show.) The judge may discuss the project with the exhibitor. Rate and economy of gain, management, market acceptability and return per dollar invested will be emphasized. The judge will use the information provided on the summary and in the interview, plus his own discretion, in placing the class.

LOTTO LAMB CLASS

1. Lotto Lamb class will be held during the market Sheep Show and all market lamb rules must be followed.
2. All exhibitors must sign up for this class by April 5 and should be enrolled in the sheep project.
3. All Lambs will be purchased by exhibitors at market price from a uniform source at the May county weigh in. Lambs will be tagged and weighed and must be paid for before leaving the weigh in site.
4. Animal assignments will be made using a lottery system at weigh in. Up to two lambs may be purchased and exhibited by each participant
5. Champion Lotto Lamb is eligible for Grand Champion market lamb class.
6. Lotto lambs will be shown in the same class.
