Iowa State University Extension staff will hold a 3 hour workshop dealing with all aspects of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). Iowa State University Insect Diagnostic Clinic experts and tree experts will conduct the workshop.

Topics include: Symptoms and signs of EAB infestation, common tree identification, problems with ash trees, EAB program and regulations/quarantine, effective insecticides, ash tree alternatives, the First Detector Program in Iowa and outreach plans for our area.
