<b>Poultry</b> 	Must be in exhibitor's possession by May 15 of the current year. Broilers must be ordered & picked up on specified dates each year. <b>Sheep</b> Breeding 	Yearling ewes must have been born after January 1 of the previous year, and ewe lambs must have been born after January 1 of the current year. All must be in exhibitor's possession by May 15.		Maximum of 10 head to be identified. Eartag, birthdate, breed, face color and registration number (if registered).	Ewes identified as breeding will only be allowed to show as breeding.	All sexually intact sheep must be identified with an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin tag. Disqualification of lambs showing signs of prolapse. (866) 873-2824. Must be inspected by veterinarian when unloaded at the fair.
