

Independent 4-H'er

The 4-H program is a great opportunity for youth to develop various skills including leadership, communication, and service. Although the majority of youth participate within a club format, this does not work for all youth. Some choose to participate as independent members. Independent members have a mentor that will guide them through their 4-H experience and help them meet goals. Independent membership allows more flexibility, but with that comes more responsibility as well. There are requirements to be an Independent 4-H'er.

Requirements

Will report to an advisor once a month by phone call, e-mail or person to person.
Must do 3 out of following criteria:

- _____ Citizenship Project
- _____ Give talk or demonstration at a 4-H club meeting
- _____ Volunteer at a County Activity
- _____ Any other idea which is okayed by advisor
- _____ Help younger 4-H'er prepare a 4-H project for fair
- _____ Organize and present county workshop in project area

Must turn in Record Book to advisor by October 1st in order to play on a County Wide team.

Must meet above criteria in order to exhibit at County Fair. If criteria is not met 4-H'er will not be allowed to enroll as an independent 4-H'er in the following years.
