FASHION REVUE

July 1	Fashion Revue fully completed entries due at Extension Office
July 07	Fashion Revue Judging
July 19	Style Show with Fair Queen Contest (<i>Participation expected. Please let the Extension Office know if you have a family scheduling conflict.</i>)

All entrants (boy or girl) to qualify for participation in the county must:

- a. Be enrolled in the current year 4-H Clothing Project.
- b. Model a garment or outfit the entrant has constructed, hand-knitted, machine-knitted, or crocheted during the current 4-H year.
 1. Outfits may be either dressy or casual, such as tailored or party clothes, suits, active sportswear and coats.
 2. An outfit consisting of one to three pieces is very acceptable for Fashion Revue.
 3. Undergarments and accessories may be made or selected by the member.
- c. Submit completed Fashion Revue entry form to the Extension Office by July 1.
- d. Meet with the judge for evaluation the day of July 7.
- e. Up to four eligible senior level 4-H'ers may be selected to represent the county at the State Fair, with no more than two participants from any one category (female, male, or minority). **Individuals may participate more than one time in the State Fair Fashion Revue program.**

CLASSES

- 3 Senior Fashion Revue (completed 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade)

To be eligible for State Fair the participant must fit the following rules as well as those listed above:

- a. Have been a participant in a 4-H clothing project or educational experience in the current year.
- b. Be in the senior level for 4-H (grades 9-12).

THE \$15 CHALLENGE

The \$15 Challenge – All participants (male or female) to qualify for participation in the state event should:

- a) Purchase an outfit that represents the 4-H'ers goal or intended use for the selected outfit.
- b) Have had individual planned or county experiences in choosing shopping alternatives, evaluating fit, quality and construction features, price and cost comparison.
- c) Outfits **must** be selected and/or purchased from a garage sale, consignment store, or resale shop (i.e. Goodwill, Salvation Army or other stores of this type.) (Hand-me-downs or clothing as gifts that were selected by the 4-H'er belong in Clothing Selection.)
- d) Cost of outfit must be \$15 or less, not including shoes, accessories, or undergarments.
- e) Receipts(s) **MUST** be turned in with Clothing Event Report Form.
- f) Up to three eligible senior level 4-H'ers (one female, one male, one minority) may be selected to represent the county at the State Fair. They must not have previously represented the county in \$15 Challenge at the State Fair.

July 19	Style Show with Fair Queen Contest (<i>Participation expected. Please let the Extension Office know if you have a family scheduling conflict.</i>)

All entrants (boy or girl) to qualify for participation in the county:

- a. Do not have to be enrolled in the Clothing Project; however, for senior members to be considered for State Fair they should have participated in a 4-H clothing project or educational experience in the current year.
- b. The outfit selected by the participant must be purchased, since the purpose of this program is to help youth develop skills in choosing shopping alternatives, evaluating fit, quality and construction features, price and cost comparison. Clothing may be purchased new or used. Gifts of clothing, either new or used, are not eligible.

CLASSES

- 1 Junior Clothing Selection (Completed 4th, 5th or 6th grade)
- 2 Intermediate Clothing Selection (Completed 7th or 8th grade)
- 3 Senior Clothing Selection (Completed 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade)

Only senior 4-H'ers are eligible to go on to State Fair. One boy, one girl and one minority member from each county may be chosen for State Fair. They must not have previously represented the county in Clothing Selection at the State Fair.

State Fair Clothing Selection Event will be Thursday, August 13 at Merle Hay Mall.
