## 2010 HENRY COUNTY FAIR RAIN POLICY

If an evening program is cancelled by rain, inclement weather, or for any other reason, before one-half of the program is completed, all paid admission ticket stubs will be honored at any of the following evening programs for which an admission is charged.

If the Saturday evening program is cancelled by rain, inclement weather, or for any other reason before one-half of the program is completed, all paid admission stub holders may be entitled to a refund of said admission charge, less \$1.00 (for partial program fee and overhead/administration fees) if said ticket stub holder, within 15 days thereafter, mail said ticket stub to the fair secretary, 127 N. Main St., Mt. Pleasant, IA 52641, and encloses a stamped self-addressed envelope. Failure to enclose ticket stub, or self-addressed envelope or to mail within 15 days after the event shall cancel this refund privilege.

The right to cancel any program and the determination as to whether one-half of said program has been completed rests in the sole discretion of the board of directors of the Henry County Agricultural Association.

**EXHIBITORS AND CONCESSIONAIRES**

- No premiums will be paid on exhibits removed prior to the release date unless the exhibitor has received prior approval from the department committee and the executive committee of the Fair board.
- There shall be no purchase or commitments made in the name of the Henry County Fair without their full consent.
- Any dispute or difference must be settled in a manner satisfactory to the superintendent. If not, it shall be referred to the executive committee of the Fair Board and their decision shall be final.
- The Association will do all in its power to prevent accidents, but will not be responsible should any occur.
- The management reserves the right to correct errors or change program after this book is printed.

## 4-H SHOWS

### IOWA YOUTH CODE OF ETHICS

---

4-H youth are expected to be sincere, honest and act in sportsmanlike ways at all times. Youth represent the entire program and their behavior reflects on their parents, leaders, club and the entire youth program. All adults involved with the youth program, leaders as well as parents, are expected to set positive examples and serve as positive role models by what they say and do. Any youth who breaks the code of ethics or allows another person (adult or peer) to talk them into violating the code of ethics agrees to forfeit all prizes, awards and premiums. The youth may also be prohibited from exhibiting at this and future exhibitions including the Iowa State Fair and other county, state, or regional exhibitions.

4-H Youth will abide by the following guidelines:

- Youth will do own work appropriate for age and physical and mental development. This includes research and writing of exhibit explanations, preparing exhibits (such as sewing, cooking, refinishing, etc.), care and grooming of animals, etc. Adult assistance should help guide and support youth, not do it for them.
- All exhibits will be a true representation of youth's work. Any attempt to take credit for other's work, alter the conformation of animals, or alter their performance is prohibited. Copyright violation or allowing others to complete youth's exhibit is considered misrepresentation and is prohibited.
- Youth will treat all people and animals with respect. Youth will provide appropriate care for animals.
- Youth will present exhibits that are safe for consumption. All food exhibits will be safe for judges to evaluate and for exhibition.
- All food animals that may be harvested immediately following the show shall be safe for consumers, and shall have met all withdrawal times for all medications, and be free of violative drug residue.
- If any animal requires medical treatment while at the fair or exhibition, only licensed veterinarian may administer the treatment. All medications that are administered shall be done according to the label instructions for the medication used.
- Animals' appearance or performance shall not be altered by any means, including medications, external applications and surgical procedures. Any animal that is found to have changed its appearance or its performance shall be disqualified from the show, and have penalties assessed against the exhibitor, parent and/or guardian by the management of the fair or exhibition.
- Youth will follow all ownership and possession rules and, if requested, will provide the necessary documentation.

Iowa Youth Code of Ethics (cont.)

- Youth will follow all livestock health requirements for this fair or exhibition, according to the state health requirements as printed in the premium book of the fair or exhibition. Youth will provide animal health certificates from a licensed veterinarian upon request from the management of the fair or exhibition.
- By entering an animal in this fair or exhibition, youth give consent to the management of the fair or exhibition to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or any other substances from the animal to be used in testing. If the laboratory report on the analysis of any sample indicates the presence of forbidden drugs, this shall be evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the exhibitor, parent and/or guardian to prove otherwise.
- Youth are responsible for own exhibits and will not allow others to violate this code on their behalf. By entering an exhibit in this fair or exhibition, youth will accept any disciplinary action taken by the management of this fair or exhibition for any violation of this code of ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or exhibition without recourse against the fair or exhibition.
- Youth want exhibit to be an example of how to accept what life has to offer, both good and not so good, and how to live with and learn from the outcome.
- Youth will not be involved in any illegal activities while participating in the 4-H and FFA events, including but not limited to alcohol, tobacco or drug use.

Youth agree to conduct themselves in an honest, ethical and upstanding manner and understand that disciplinary actions will result if these rules are violated. Youth understand that they are expected to represent the program in a positive manner. Youth and parent and/or guardian agree to read, understand and follow this code of ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or exhibition as printed in this premium book.
