MARKET BEEF RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. General and general livestock rules and regulations apply in this department.
2. All exhibitors are eligible to weigh-in 6 market animals. Youth are limited to exhibiting 3 market beef animals in the 4-H Market Beef Classes. Exhibitors may select one steer from their 3 market beef to enter the Carcass Production Class. A second carcass production entry will be at the discretion of the committee chair.
3. Exhibitors must register for the Carcass Production Class, and pay the \$20 per animal scan fee by May 15.
4. Carcass Production animals must be steers.
5. Carcass Production animals will be scanned after fair entry at a time to be announced by the Beef Committee.
6. During the market beef show, the top 10 Carcass Production beef will be recognized following the selection of the Grand Champion Market Beef. Carcass Production beef recognized must have a USDA quality grade of Select, Choice or Prime as projected by the ultrasound scanner.
7. Entries will be placed on "a value of lean produced per day of feed", which considers rate of gain, rib eye area, fat cover, estimated percent internal fat, USDA quality grade, estimated carcass weight and carcass value.
8. Market beef will be weighed as they are unloaded. Weight classes will be determined after all calves have been weighed, but not more than 15 animals will be included in any weight class. Animals must weigh 900 lbs. or more to qualify for Market Beef Classes. Animals weighing 899 lbs. or less will be shown as heavy feeder calves and will not be eligible to show for champion. Market Beef entries must have been weighed in on Saturday, December 18, 2010.
9. Only those beef with a daily rate of gain of 2.4 lbs. for steers and 2.2 lbs. for market heifers or more are eligible for blue ribbons. There are 206 days from Saturday, December 18, 2010 to Tuesday, July 12, 2011.
10. Market animals will be in 2 divisions: Market heifers and market steers. Respective champions will be awarded in each division.
11. The County-Raised Beef producer must reside in Henry County.
12. All market beef must be double-tied. Failure to comply will result in forfeit of premium money.
13. Once a calf is loose in the ring 3 times, that calf is automatically tied to the fence for as long as the animal is being shown.

BEEF DEPARTMENT (CONT.)

14. All market beef must be dehorned.
15. Class adjustments may be made at the discretion of department committee.
16. Premiums paid will be: Blue \$11.00 and Red \$7.00

BEEF DEPARTMENT (CONT.)

BREEDING BEEF RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. General and general livestock rules and regulations apply in this department.
2. Exhibitors are limited to a total of three entries in the beef heifer and cow classes. Cows must have been selected by a member as a yearling or a two year old.
3. All heifers will be judged from the standpoint of future usefulness as a breeding cow.
4. Heifers shown in this division cannot be shown in any Market Beef class and are not eligible for the Ribbon Auction.
5. A minimum of three animals will represent a breed class. Otherwise, the committee will determine classes. Appendix & purebred Shorthorn will be shown together, as will foundation and purebred Simmental.
6. A champion heifer and reserve champion heifer for each class will be selected from the blue ribbon first and second place heifers in each age group.
7. Purebred beef must turn in copies of registration papers at time of ID—May 15. If registration papers are not turned in by May 15th, animal will be shown in commercial class. Registration papers must be in 4-H's name.
8. All breeding beef will be weighed in on entry day (Tuesday) at the county fair.
9. All breeding beef must be double-tied. Failure to comply will result in forfeit of premium money.
10. Only horned Herefords will be allowed to show with horns.
11. Once a cow has won Supreme Breeding Cow-Calf, she is no longer eligible to be shown again.
12. Breeding heifers will not compete with breeding cow/calf classes for championship

BUCKET CALF RULES AND REGULATIONS

Must be in place on Tuesday Between Noon and 3:00 pm

1. Calves must be double tied at the fair.
2. Calves must have been fed milk or milk replacement other than naturally from cow, for one month.
3. Calves must be born between January 1 and June 1 of show year.
4. Participants will only receive premium money on one exhibit.
5. Calves shown in the Bucket Calf Class may not be shown in other beef class.
6. Bucket calf program will be judged with the following score card:

a. Knowledge of bucket calf & production - oral interview	35
(consideration given for age & experience)	
b. Manual/Records	35
c. Showmanship	20
d. Herdsmanship	<u>10</u>
Total	100
7. I.D. sheets are due in the Extension Office by June 15. Members must register with the office to receive I.D. sheet and manual. Completed manual is due to Extension by Tuesday, July 05, 2011.
8. Participation is open to 4-H members & those pre-4-H youth in grade 3.
9. 3rd grade classes are noncompetitive. Youth in 4th grade and up must be 4-H members
10. Youth will be divided into classes according to grade and/or number of years in project.
11. Premiums paid will be: Blue \$5.00 and Red \$3.00

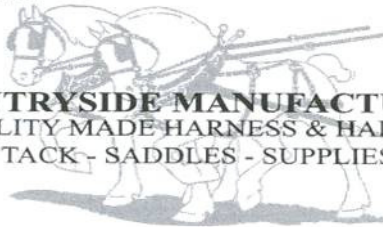

DAIRY CATTLE RULES & REGULATIONS

1. General livestock and general rules and regulations apply to this department.
2. Entries are open to Guernsey, Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Milking Shorthorn, Holstein and Jersey females born between July 1, 2008 and February 28, 2011. Animals born prior to July 1, 2008 may be entered if they were enrolled as a 4-H project by the exhibitor as a two-year-old heifer or younger. Grade animals must show the characteristic markings of the breed in which they were entered.
3. Exhibitors are limited to three entries.
4. All animals will be placed in blue, red and white groups on confirmations only.

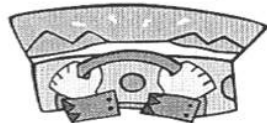
