A disability does not mean you have to leave the farm!

Since 1991, **Iowa AgrAbility** has helped more than 1,000 farm families affected by disabilities remain active in farming.

Ryan Odens is a farmer in northwest Iowa. Despite a spinal cord injury, he was determined to keep farming. Iowa AgrAbility helped make this dream come true. Modifications to the farm operation and some new equipment purchases allowed Ryan to overcome limitations he has due to his injury.

Disabilities may be due to farm or non-farm injuries or health-related conditions.

Examples include amputation, arthritis, stroke or heart attack, hearing or vision loss, spinal cord injury, brain injury, multiple sclerosis, or back pain.

Iowa AgrAbility Services

On-Site Assistance

We visit your farm to identify modifications that allow you to live and work more independently.

We can:

- ◆ Develop plans for remodeling your home, farm operation, or equipment to make them more accessible.
- ◆ Link you with people who design or fabricate devices to accommodate your disability.
- ◆ Help you identify possible funding sources to pay the costs of modifying your home or farm.

Universal Design and Home Accessibility

- ◆ Visit the Universal Design Learning Lab at Iowa State University to learn how to make your home accessible and attractive. See gadgets and gizmos that make everyday tasks easier.

Support from Others

- ◆ Meet farm families with similar disabilities or interests. Share ideas, stories, and support.

Resources

- ◆ Get help with farm financial analyses, learn about alternative agriculture practices, or find out how your family can cope with changes.
- ◆ Request the latest information. We offer publications, workshops, and educational materials. We can refer you to specialists on farm and family topics. You can also sign up for the AgrAbility newsletter.
