A Note from Natalie Hedlund, County 4-H Coordinator:

The skill of goal setting and working to achieve the goal is something 4-H strives to teach and have 4-H'ers practice in all parts of the educational program – from project work, to club work, to development of civic engagement, leadership, and communication skills. As a 4-H member adds to her or his learning and skill set in a project area, goals should become more challenging and further learning demonstrated.

WHAT IS A GOAL?

A GOAL is.... deciding what you want to do and learn in a 4-H project.

A GOAL is.... having a road map. It helps you decide how to get to where you want to go.

Set goals that:

- Are specific (not too general or broad)
- Meet your needs and interest
- Provide you an opportunity for achievement
- Can be accomplished in a reasonable amount of time and with the resources available to you
- Show progress over previous years (if you have been enrolled in this project before)

HOW TO WRITE A 4-H GOAL

A goal has **3** parts. A goal should tell:

1. The **action**: **how** you are going to do it.

The results: what you will do.

3. The **timetable**: **when** you plan to have it done.

Examples:

Action Result Timetable

I want to make a poster about smoothies by the February club meeting

I want to train my 4-H beef heifer to lead before county fair time

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals Required Training

Are you planning to exhibit an animal at the Boone County Fair or Iowa State Fair this summer? Check out the list below of the species that are required to complete the YQCA Training in order to exhibit.

Required Certification: All 4-H beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, rabbits, poultry exhibitors must be Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certified by July 1st.

There are two ways to complete the required training:

- ONLINE The YQCA online training is \$12/person per year and can be completed online at https://yqcaprogram.org/ Training is based on the exhibitors age, not their grade, with a test at the end that must be passed. After completing training, a certificate of completion will be available for download. These certificates must be emailed, mailed or dropped off to Natalie Hedlund, 4-H Coordinator: natm@iastate.edu or 1327 SE Marshall St, Boone 50036.
- 2. **FACE TO FACE** There are two face to face YQCA trainings scheduled. March 12th and June 3rd 6:00 7:30 pm at the Community Building at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Registration is required to attend. Register online https://yqcaprogram.org/ and pay the \$3 online before the training.

I highly recommend looking over the instructions before starting to avoid the wrong name listed on the certificate.

Sheep and Meat Goat Weigh in

When: May 4 | 8:00 am—11:30 am Where: Fairgrounds- Show Ring

Who: All market and commercial ewe lambs as well as meat goats must be weighed, tagged and have ID forms completed. 4-H Families must complete animal ID in 4honline 2.0 after weigh in.

All sexually intact animals brought to weigh-in must have an official scrapie tag in their ear

State Fair: Any animal potentially being shown at the State Fair must be retinal imaged. This will cost \$5/head.

Dog Obedience, Rally & Agility classes are starting soon!

There will be a Dog Class Orientation meeting on Sunday, March 24th from 6:00 -7:00 pm at the Erb Center at the Boone County Fairgrounds. This meeting is very important for ALL members planning to exhibit dog at the county fair. At Orientation, we will be going over the plan for the classes, rules, supplies needed and much more.

Do NOT bring your dog to the March 24th meeting. **Bring to the orientation meeting proof of rabies vaccination.

Dog classes will be held on Sundays starting April 7th. Classes will be at the Boone County Fairgrounds from 6:00 - 8:00 pm each Sunday up until Fair. Sunday Dog Classes will include Obedience, Rally, Showmanship and Agility.

Exhibitor and dog teams must attend 50% of classes held in order to show at the county fair. Cancelled classes don't count toward the 50%.

Don't forget to ID your dog in 4honline by May 15th. The ID does include a photo of your current rabies certificate. I will be available at the March 24th meeting to assist with IDing your dog for anyone who would like help.

4-H/FFA Rabbit and Cavy Workshop at Jasper County Fairgrounds

There is a 4-H and FFA rabbit and cavy workshop that will be held on Saturday, March 9 from 12:30 – 4:00 pm at the Jasper County Fairgrounds in Colfax Iowa. Speakers will discuss rabbit and cavy breeds and health. Youth are encouraged to bring their rabbits and cavies to be evaluated and to show them in a "practice" show. Rabbit tattooing and cavy tagging will be available. Rabbit and cavies will be for sale. There is no need to register and no cost to attend (except for those youth who purchase rabbits/cavies and/or build a carrier and /or purchase rabbit and cavy equipment). Youth will receive free tickets for drawings for rabbit and cavy supplies. Youth from Iowa and other states may attend even if they are not enrolled in 4-H or FFA. This workshop is sponsored by Iowa State and South Central Rabbit Breeders, Jasper County Iowa State University and Outreach 4-H; and Eldon C Stutsman Inc and Heinold Feeds.
