Home Improvement Workshops

lowa 4-H is hosting a trio of virtual, statewide 4-H Home Improvement workshops for youth grades 4-12. Youth can sign up for one or multiple workshops in the series. All successfully registered participants will receive a project kit for the workshop thanks to the Iowa 4-H Foundation.

Workshop Option 1: January 18, 5-6:00 PM on Zoom

Join this 4-H workshop to explore the home improvement project area. Workshop attendees will gather virtually to meet other youth interested in home improvement, learn about furniture design, and learn to create a scale model of a piece of furniture that can be exhibited at a county air event.

Workshop Option 2: March 28, 5-6:00 PM on Zoom

Join this 4-H workshop to explore the home improvement project area. Workshop attendees will gather virtually to meet other youth interested in home improvement, learn about selecting furniture finishes, and explore different techniques to finishing or refinishing home improvement or woodworking projects. This workshop will help youth gain important knowledge needed for taking their home improvement exhibit to the next level.

Workshop Option 3: May 2, 5-6:00 PM on Zoom

Join this 4-H workshop to explore the home improvement project area. Workshop attendees will gather virtually to meet other youth interested in home improvement and explore creating floor plans for current space or newly renovated or built space! Learn about elements of a floor plan, creating a space that fits your unique needs, and explore how accessibility plays a role in designing floor plans.

Beef Weigh in

Are you planning on showing a market steer, market heifer or beef pen of 3 at the 2024 Boone County Fair or lowa State Fair? If so, please be aware that these animals **must be weighed-in prior to February 1** at an ISU Extension and Outreach weigh-in event. Additionally, before you can weigh in and identify your animals you MUST be an enrolled 4-H member who has completed the online enrollment process in 4-HOnline. Here are the details for Boone County's weigh-in:

- When: Saturday, December 9, 2023 from 8:00 10:00 am (all animals must arrive by 10 am)
- Snow Date: Saturday, December 16th, 2023
- Where: Boone County Fairgrounds Beef Pen of 3 barn
- Please follow the flow of traffic when you arrive
- Process:
- An *Iowa 4-H Market Beef Verification Form* will be provided to all 4-H'ers/FFA members for completion.
- If an animal is to be shown as a *purebred*, we must be provided with a sire name or registration number **AND** the animal's tattoo on this form. If this information is not complete, the animal will be required to show as a crossbred.
- All animals will be weighed and tagged. Weights and tag numbers will be recorded on the Verification Form.
- Market 4-H animals that will potentially be attending the Iowa State Fair must be retinal imaged. The fee for this process is \$10/head. Checks can be made payable to Boone County Extension. Retinal images will be scheduled AFTER weigh in, but you are encouraged to pay the fee ahead of time. You will be asked to declare Iowa State Fair animals at weigh in.
- 4-H Families have to enter their own animal ID information into 4honline **by February 1, 2024**. Instructions on how to ID animals in 4honline will be given to all families at weigh in. You will use the information that was recorded on the *Verification Form*.

If you are unable to attend on the Boone County weigh-In day, please call the Extension Office as soon as possible: 515.432.3882 and talk with Jess or Natalie to make other arrangements.

PLEASE NOTE: All 4-H market beef exhibitors **must be enrolled in 4honline in order to ID an animal.** If you need help completing this process, please contact Natalie Hedlund, 4-H Coordinator, by calling 515.432.3882 or by emailing nata@iastate.edu

YQCA—Youth for the Quality Care of Animals Training

Required Certification: All 4-H beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, rabbits, poultry exhibitors must be Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certified by July 1st.

There are two ways to complete the required training:

- ONLINE The YQCA online training is \$12/person per year and can be completed online at https://yqcaprogram.org/ Training is based on the exhibitors age, not their grade, with a test at the end that must be passed. After completing training, a certificate of completion will be available for download. These certificates must be emailed, mailed or dropped off to Natalie Hedlund, 4-H Coordinator: natm@iastate.edu or 1327 SE Marshall St, Boone 50036.
- 2. **FACE TO FACE** There are two face to face YQCA trainings scheduled. March 12th or June 3rd from 6:00 7:30 pm at the Community Building at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Registration is required to attend. Register online https://yqcaprogram.org/ and pay the \$3 online before the training. Participants must complete a pre and post test in order to obtain their certificate.

State 4-H Scholarships

Who: Iowa 4-H members are eligible to apply for 4-H scholarships if they meet individual scholarship requirements. 4-H'ers may apply for multiple scholarships but only one will be awarded per academic year.

What: The lowa 4-H Foundation knows it's not easy to finance a college education, and they know that many lowa 4-H'ers can use help achieving their educational goals. For that reason, they offer **90** scholarships that total more than **\$100,000** in funding! These scholarship are designed to encourage lowa 4-H members to continue their education beyond high school.

Fair Fundraiser

Save the Date! The 2024 Boone County Fair Fundraiser is scheduled for Saturday February 3rd!

Proceeds generated from the event will help pay for judges, premiums and ribbons for 4-H and FFA events during the Fair as well as our 2024 special fund-a-need project; sealing the roof on the Erb Center.

The Erb Center is used regularly by 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters. It is used for club meetings, workshops, day camps, and much more throughout the year. During the Boone County Fair, the Erb Center is solely used as the 4-H Foodstand. Proceeds from the 4-H Foodstand go towards funding the 4-H program for the entire year including sending youth on trips, conferences, camps, workshops and much more. The Erb Center was updated in 2016 from the existing foodstand. The entire building was remodeled but one project that there wasn't funds for was sealing the roof. In 2023, the Erb Center roof leaked in the kitchen area. We are currently raising funds to put a sealant on the metal roof. The sealant will seal all fasteners as well as rust-proofing. The sealant has a 30 year life expectancy, and an 18 year waterproof warranty. This will ensure years of keeping the Erb Center in great condition for the use of the 4-H food stand and many other uses. The cost to seal the roof on the Erb Center is over \$15,000. It is our goal to fundraise as much money as possible towards this project and have it completed before the 2024 Fair.

If you want to help make the 2024 Fair fundraiser a success, the fair board is currently seeking donations for the live and silent auction. Donation deadline is January 22nd. Fair Fundraiser tickets will go on sale after the first of the year.
