Only the animals properly identified in 4honline will be allowed to show at the County and State Fair. Rabbits must be identified by *July* 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **Youth for the Quality Care of Animals Required Training**

Required Certification: All 4-H beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, rabbits, poultry exhibitors must be Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certified by July 1st. The YQCA training is \$12/person per year and can be completed online at https://yqcaprogram.org/

Training is based on the exhibitors age, not their grade, with a test at the end that must be passed. After completing training, a certificate of completion will be available for download. These certificates must be emailed, mailed or dropped off to Natalie Hedlund, 4-H Coordinator: natm@iastate.edu or 1327 SE Marshall St, Boone 50036. If any families would like to come into the Extension Office to utilize their computers to complete the training, they need to make an appointment with Natalie by calling 515.432.3882 or by emailing natm@iastate.edu.

### **Animal Identification**

4-H animals must be identified in 4honline by *May 15th* (excluding poultry, exotics, cats and small pets) in order to be shown at the County or State Fair. Rabbits must be identified by *July 1<sup>st</sup>*. If you have swine, bucketbottle calf or produce of dam calves, please contact Natalie at natm@iastate.edu to arrange the pick up of 4-H tags.

#### Helpful Hints:

- All bolded fields must be complete online in order to save the animal, which is required to properly ID it.
- Please note that this year, horses and dogs identified last year did not transfer so members will have to create a new animal and add all the info including photos.
- If animals are <u>not</u> owned by the exhibitor or in partnership with a family member, a <u>lease agreement</u> needs to be turned in by May 15th.

- Animals must be identified in 4honline in order to be shown (excluding poultry, small pets, cats and exotics).

### **Swine Identification**

All 4-H pigs must be tagged! This year, all pigs must have a USDA 840 tag. Tags can be purchased from the Extension Office. Pigs must be tagged and Identified in 4honline by May 15th in order to exhibit at county and/or state fair.

\$2 per tag for County Fair only pigs

\$8 per DNA sample for State Fair pigs (DNA samples are not tags this year so you will also need a tag)

### **Fair Book Changes & Reminders**


- General Livestock Rules: Late Entries (after July 1st) are not guaranteed an exhibitor shirt. Once livestock are on the fairgrounds, they must not leave the fenced in area of the fairgrounds until release on Sunday unless otherwise specified in the fairbook, or special circumstances are permitted by the species superintendent. Horses are permitted to leave the fenced in area of the grounds to go to the horse arena. Animals are limited to being in the following areas (designated barn, tie outs) or designated exercise areas. Those areas are as follows: Horse Warm Up Arena, Cattle/Sheep/Goats/Swine Grass area east of Beef Pen of Three Barn. All livestock must be in their designated area (stall or tieouts) by 10:30pm each night. No animals are to leave their designated areas/barns after 10:30 pm. Barns will be closed from 10:30 pm 5:00 am unless special circumstances are permitted by the species superintendent.
- For emergency purposes, recommend writing two phone numbers on the back of stall cards.
- Failure to follow the rules set forth in the fairbook will result in consequences set by the Boone County Fairboard in cooperation with Boone County ISU Extension and Outreach (if it involves a 4-H member or Clover Kid) and FFA Advisors (if it involves an FFA Member). Consequences for failing to follow the rules could include withholding premium money, fines, banning exhibition at future fairs, or other.
- Market Livestock Auction name changed to Market Animal Exhibitor Fund. The word Auction is confusing since bids don't go to the highest bidder so the name what changed. Eligibility rules are unchanged.
- Sheep/Meat Goat: Sheep must arrive on the fairgrounds slick shorn. Body shearing or clipping is not permitted on the fairgrounds. Leg fitting/clipping is permissible. Muzzling is not permitted at the Boone County Fair.
- Dairy Goat: All does shall have an ADGA tattoo in their left ear to show year of birth. For goats born in 2023, the letter is "R". All animals must have a scrapies tag listed on the ID in 4honline or ID Form. Non-registered animals shall have a scrapies tag in their ear. ADGA registered animals do not need to have a scrapies tag in their ear but registration papers must be present at time of check in. All goats must be clipped and groomed before fair. Herdsmanship: Alley should be swept clean. Break Showmanship into three classes: Junior, Intermediate and Senior age divisions depending on number in each class. Adding a Herd Builder Class Two Dairy Animals Same wording as Dairy Cow
- **Dog:** Showmanship classes may use show leads or gentle leaders. This was a wording change.
- **Dog Agility:** Add two classes Advanced Novice and Jumpers Advanced Novice. Changes made to the number of obstacles and timing of all other agility and jumpers classes to accommodate adding of the new classes.
- Entries—The responsibility for making proper entry rests upon the exhibitor. Online entry using Fair Entry is available at www.extension.iastate.edu/boone/fairinfo All entries must be submitted online by July 1 through the FairEntry to avoid paying a late fee. Entries after July 1st must be made in the Extension Office during office hours and will be charged a late fee of \$5 per business day after the July 1st Deadline. This is important in order to make pen, stall, and class assignments and award premium money. Late Horse Entries will NOT be accepted. Late Entries (after July 1st) are not guaranteed an exhibitor shirt.
- Release Plan: The release plan for animals is the same as last year. See included sheet or page 10 in Fairbook. Members are responsible for cleaning up their stall. Rabbit and Poultry members must help clean up the building and move cages at release time.
- A Centennial Celebration is the theme for fair, club booths and Extravaganza. The color of everything is Blue.
- → Static:
  - Creative Photography Class A photographic image that was creatively edited or modified beyond reality in a creative, imaginative, and experimental way to make it more interesting and visually engaging. Could be a composite of photos. If mounted, photograph/image must be on foam core no smaller than 4" in length or larger than 14" in length.
  - → Photography Class Maximum thickness of finished project must not exceed ¼" thick.
  - Food & Nutrition Classes Display boxes are not allowed.
  - Thrifty Meal Challenge Formally known as the \$10 meal challenge. Meal purchased for 4 people for \$11 total.
  - **4-H Poster Communication Exhibit –** Themes have changed.
- Static Entry Reminders: Must enter exhibits in FairEntry by July 16<sup>th</sup>. Entries made after July 1<sup>st</sup> are not guaranteed an Official Exhibitor Shirt. Recommend having all exhibitors enter at least one entry BY JULY 1<sup>st</sup> so that we have their shirt size for the shirt order. The Entry Tags and Entry Forms will be printed specifically for each member and exhibit. There will be a separate Check Out Table where Entry Forms must be turned in. If an Exhibit isn't entered into FairEntry by July 16<sup>th</sup>, members must complete the Entry in FairEntry at a computer at the Check in table. Entering Late Entries will delay their judging process so please encourage members to get their Entries completed in FairEntry by July 16<sup>th</sup>. Members with 10 or more exhibits may pick up their tags and entry form at the Extension Office on Monday, July 17<sup>th</sup> but must notify Natalie by July 14<sup>th</sup> that they are planning to pick up tags.
- Flower Bucket Challenge: DO NOT put into Fair Entry. Separate Form needs to accompany the bucket for judging.
- No major changes to the following Divisions: Herdsmanship, Beef, Beef Pen of 3, Herd Builder, Swine, Dairy Cow, Horse, Poultry, Small Pets, Cats, Rabbit, and Exotic.
- → Communications Day June 12<sup>th</sup> starting at 2:00 pm at Extension Office. Public Speaking topics changed. Entries due in FairEntry by June 1<sup>st</sup>.
- → Fashion Day July 10<sup>th</sup> judging in am with Style Show at 6:00 pm in the Community Building. New Class: Innovative design Purpose of this class is to encourage creativity and out-of-the-box thinking when creating an outfit. \$15 Challenge changed to \$20 Challenge. Savvy Shopper budget increased to \$30

## Livestock Release Plan

### North

12th Street

Livestock Release line up will start north of the tracks on Argo Steet. (heading south) Argo Street will become a One-Way Street during load out.



Industrial Park Rd.

The Livestock Release plan is in place for the safety of our exhibitors and our families. The Fair Board will have paid staff and volunteers to assist with this new process. Please be patient. We must all work together to make things go safely and smoothly.

- Livestock Release will begin at 4:00pm on Sunday July 23rd with a limited number of trailers allowed in gated area at a time.
- The livestock release line up will start north of the tracks on Argo Street (heading south)
  - Horses/Beef/Heard Building/Dairy/Sheep/Goats 4 trucks/trailers will be allowed at a time to enter the fairgrounds through Gate E to load and exit through Gate D and must then proceed south on Argo Street.
  - Swine 2 trucks/trailers will be allowed at a time to enter the fairgrounds through Gate C to load and exit through Gate C and must then proceed south on Argo Street.
  - **Poultry and Rabbit** 2 trucks/trailers will be allowed at a time to enter the fairgrounds through Gate B and load and exit through Gate B and must then proceed south on Argo Street.
  - Beef Pen of Three Semi will load out at 7:00pm

#### **IMPORTANT NOTES:**

- NO PARKING will be allowed on Argo Street or 10th Street between Argo and Champa Street during load out time.
- Argo Street will become a one-way street headed south during load out.
- As you load out, please be as quick as possible as we anticipate a long line, and we want it to move quickly.
- Please be cautious as you drive through the fairgrounds, as people will be walking through the grounds with items to load.
- Exhibitors are still required to clean up their stall/area of the barn as in previous years. It is encouraged this is done after the livestock are loaded and have left the fenced in area of the fairgrounds.
- If your trailer is parked in trailer parking on the far east of the fairgrounds, to get into the livestock release line, please take Champa or Curtis Street south to Industrial Park Road, then head west to Meridian Street. Go north on Meridian Street and then east on 12th street until you reach Argo Street.
