

I took Rusty to the Boone County Fair as a merit steer.

I took turns with my brothers doing chores, making sure the calves had water and weren't sick. I started leading Rusty around the farm yard in January. I worked with him about once a month until the month before fair – then it was everyday! I curry combed him regularly and washed him a lot before fair. I scratched, petted and talked to him whenever I did chores.

During the year I attended a feed workshop at Ogden Farm and Feed, the county grooming clinic at Shaw's, helped with herdsmanship at the fair, participated in showmanship, helped with the pre-4-H bottle calf show at the fair and participated in the grooming contest at the fair.

This is what I learned in this project:

I learned a lot from my dad and my brothers about feed rations, how much to feed the calves and when to increase the amount of feed given. My brothers taught me how to show Rusty – how to get him "set-up", how to use a show stick and the importance of keeping his head up and my eyes on the judge. I learned about grooming – washing, clipping and "fluffing" - from my dad, brothers and the grooming clinics.

I also learned that it is hard to say good bye after the sale.
