- Last year about 1.8 million people benefited from Iowa State University Extension and Outreach educational programs, and nearly 17,000 volunteers worked with us.
- Some 94,000 youth were involved in 4-H programs. That's one in five lowa school-age youth.
- Companies who have worked with our Center for Industrial Research and Service (CIRAS) reported making \$43 million in new investments and creating or retaining more than 6,000 jobs.
- Our field agronomists consulted with more than 10,000 crop farmers.
- Our community development specialists helped lowa communities leverage more than \$29 million in grants and resources to complete infrastructure, building, and other projects.
- More than 196,000 lowans increased their understanding and skills on family issues through noncredit workshops and conferences.

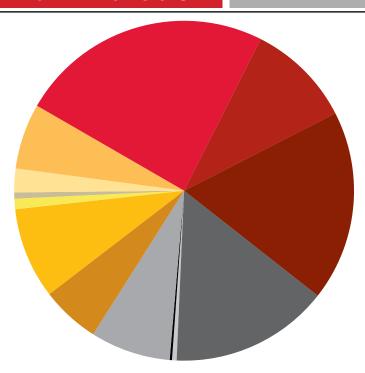

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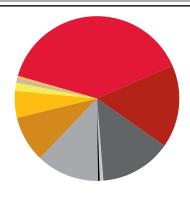

OVERALL REVENUE FY2011



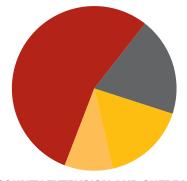

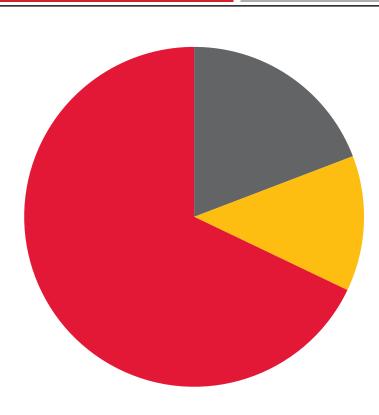

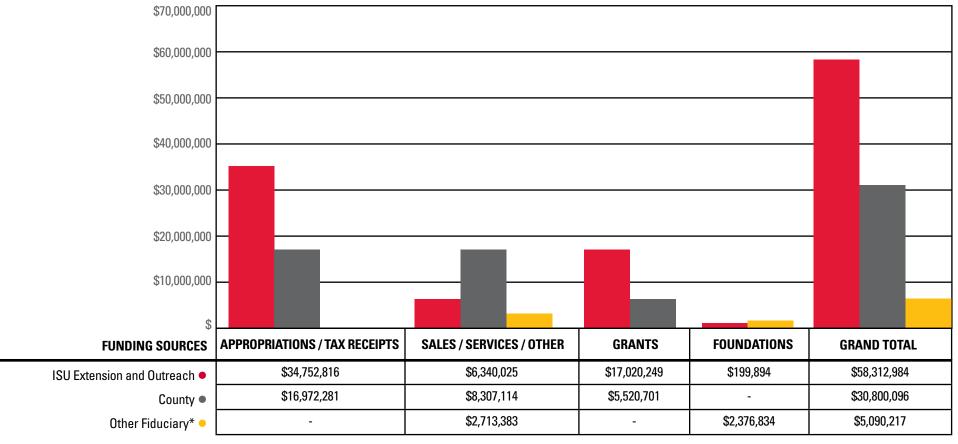
