#### **Animal Identification Deadline**

### Mark your calendars - May 15, 2022

May 15 continues as the deadline to identify animals in 4-H Online and FFA Google Form ID. You are able to identify your animals in these systems now, but do not enter any weigh-in animals (Swine, Market Lambs, Market Meat Goats) until after the weigh-ins this spring.

You have until 11:59 p.m. on May 15, but please do not wait until the last minute. Even if you do not have your animals yet, log into 4-H Online and click on Animals to ensure you are able to access your account or test out the FFA Google Form ID and ensure the links work well in advance of May 15.

PLEASE DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST DAY TO ID YOUR ANIMALS!

#### **New 4-H Members**

New 4-H members, who have not been in Mahaska County 4-H in the past, have until May 15, 2022 to enroll and pay their registration fee and be eligible to exhibit at the Southern Iowa Fair. Please note that the **75%** attendance policy will apply, so attendance at all club activities from the time of enrollment until July 1 is very important!

## **4-H Club Attendance Policy**

Mahaska County has a **75%** attendance policy in place for 4-H members of community and special-interest clubs. Members attending at least 75% of their clubs' meetings, activities, and/or pre-approved 4-H experiences will have eligibility to exhibit at the county fair. Clubs can set their own parameters within the 75% policy. We recommend if members are part of an *additional* special-interest club, like Honor Council, their attendance combined for both will count toward the 75%.

## FairEntry Opening June 1

# PLEASE READ THIS ARTICLE THOROUGHLY IF YOU PLAN TO EXHIBIT AT THE SOUTHERN IOWA FAIR!

We will once again use FairEntry for 4-H & FFA animal and static exhibit entries for the Southern Iowa Fair. We are in the process of setting up this year's fair and will open the system on June 1, 2022.

Animals MUST BE IDENTIFIED IN 4-H ONLINE or on the FFA ID GOOGLE FORMS by May 15 for any animals to be eligible to be exhibited at the fair.

Don't forget to complete your YQCA training if you plan to exhibit Rabbit, Poultry, Sheep, Beef, Dairy, Swine, Meat Goats, or Myotonic Goats. YQCA is not required for Horse, Llama/Alpaca, Dog, Bucket Bottle, or Pets. Your YQCA certification number is required in your animal entry in FairEntry, so have it available.

Livestock Entry for the Southern Iowa Fair will close on July 9, 2022. Static exhibit entry will close on July 15, 2022.

### **YQCA for Livestock Exhibitors**

YQCA stands for Youth for the Quality Care of Animals and is required for 4-H & FFA members exhibiting Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, Beef, Dairy, Swine, Meat Goat, & Myotonic Goat. It is not required for Bucket/Bottle, Llama/Alpaca, or Horse project exhibitors.

YQCA is an online training that can be completed at home or at the Extension office (by appointment). Cost to take the online training is \$12.00 each year. Those who complete a financial aid application at the Extension office will automatically receive a coupon code to use.

YQCA must be completed by <u>JULY 1</u> for members to be eligible to exhibit livestock at the county and/or state fair. The YQCA online program includes three components for each topic

(food safety, animal well-being, and character development):

1) knowledge building, 2) skills lab, 3) quiz for each content topic, and are designed specifically for each age group. The online program is very interactive, bright, colorful, relatable, and fun! More information can be found at

YQCA has a new platform. An email was sent out prompting anyone who has completed the training to download their certificate from the old platform before March 22nd. Those who have downloaded their certificate need to upload it to the new platform. A new account can be created at yqcaprogram.org. ## **Mahaska County Code of Conduct**

Every 4-H member in Mahaska County is required to complete the Mahaska County 4-H Code of Good Conduct form once ever. Deadline to complete the Code of Conduct, either paper form or electronic form, is **May 15, 2022**. This form must be submitted in order for 4-H members to be eligible to exhibit at the Southern Iowa Fair. ## **Class Exhibiting Requirements**

Mahaska County has a policy for classes and shows for the county fair. In order to hold a show at the Southern Iowa Fair, we must have a **minimum of 3 youth from 2 different families (4-H or FFA)** registered to exhibit a particular species. Don't forget animals must be registered in 4-H Online/FFA Google Form ID by **May 15**. Classes with fewer than 3 exhibitors from 2 different families will be placed on hold for the current year. Classes will be determined after all ID information has been received on May 15.

If classes meet the minimum requirement by identification in May, the show(s) will be held.

### **FFA Animal Identification**

FFA members will once again use Google Forms to identify their animals for the fair. The Google Forms are NOW OPEN!

FFA Animal IDs are due May 15, 2022 (with the exception of Market Beef as outlined on page 1 of this newsletter). Information will need to be filled out all the way and correctly for every entry to be eligible. ## 4-H Livestock Rules (4H 202)

If you plan to exhibit livestock at the county or state fair in 2022, please read the 4H 202 document very thoroughly. The 4H 202 can be found at <a href="https://store.extension.iastate.edu/product/194.pdf">https://store.extension.iastate.edu/product/194.pdf</a>. It includes important information for each species, including identification requirements. It is the responsibility of the 4-H family to read these requirements and abide by the rules set by the county and state 4-H program.

## **Help Day for 4-H Online**

We are hosting a help day for exhibitors who need help with 4-H Online. Kat and Sara will be available to help exhibitors in the auditorium at the Mahaska County Extension Office from 5 pm to 7pm on May 12, 2022. If you are unable to attend, please call the office to schedule a time for assistance. Staff will NOT be available over the weekend to help with questions and late entries will NOT BE ACCEPTED for 4-H or FFA animal identification entries. NO EXCPETIONS!

## Sheep & Meat Goat Weigh-in

The 4-H & FFA Sheep & Meat Goat Weigh-in will be held on Saturday, May 7 from 8:00-10:00 AM at the scale on the Southern lowa Fairgrounds. Tags are \$3.00 each. State Fair Verification is \$5.00/hd. Breeding Lambs & Goats do not need to attend this weigh-in unless you plan to exhibit at the lowa State Fair. Retinal Images will need to be taken on all the lambs & goats going to the lowa State Fair. All Lambs & Goats MUST be entered into 4-H Online by the families by May 15. Bottle Lambs & Bottle Goats are not required to attend the weigh-in.

#### **Bucket'o'Junk Contest**

Bucket'o'Junk registration is now closed. All participants will be contacted via email by Sara for confirmation of sign up.

Participants will be notified via email with details for pick up times once this is determined.

Members do not need to be present for pick up. Please note that the buckets will be full of scrap metal and will be heavy!

## **Rabbit Tattoo Clinic May 9**

Anyone with rabbits that need to be tattooed for fair identification purposes can attend the clinic on May 9th, 2022 from 6pm-8pm at the DAV Building located at the Southern lowa Fairgrounds. Adam Antolik, Rabbit Superintendent, will be present to answer questions and to tattoo rabbits. Rabbits that are already tattooed do not need to attend this clinic. Youth are not required to attend this clinic, it is just an option available to families.

## **Bucket/Bottle Animal Packets—NEW!**

Now that it is May, all bucket/bottle animals must be in the youth exhibitor's possession within **two** weeks of the animal's birth (must have been born by April 30) and must be bottle/bucket fed. ### **Livestock Identification Details**

If you plan to show small animals, livestock, and horses at the Southern Iowa Fair or Iowa State Fair, please read on. Each species is listed with details for identification in 4-H Online. If you plan to exhibit at the Iowa State Fair, the animal must first be identified in 4-H Online by May 15 to have state fair eligibility. The only species requiring photos is Horses. You do not have to upload a photo for any species, besides horses.

Market Beef (incl. Carcass & Advanced Feeder Pens) - These animals were identified at the weigh-in last December. Members should have gone into 4-H Online and entered ID information before February 1st.

**Breeding Beef**—We will not hold a Heifer Tattooing this year. Please make sure your heifer either has a registration tattoo or 4-H ear tag and identify using 4-H Online. The tattoos must match the registration papers and tags must match the identification report at fair check-in or the animal will be disqualified.

Market Sheep (Market, Derby, Commercial Ewes) — These animals will be identified at the May 7 weigh-in. All information from the ID form will be entered into 4-H Online by the families. Please check the paper ID form for accuracy, if you find a mistake, please call us to get it fixed. If the information is correct, please identify each animal in 4-H Online by May 15.

Breeding Sheep (Purebred & Yearling Ewes) — These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online by May 15. Ear tag can be a 4-H tag or farm tag. Scrapie tags are required for any sexually intact lamb.

Meat Goats (Market & Breeding)—These animals will be identified at the May 1 weigh-in. All information from the ID form will be entered into 4-H Online by the families. Please check the paper ID form for accuracy, if you find a mistake, please call us to get it fixed. If the information is correct, please identify each animal in 4-H Online by May 15.

Myotonic (Fainting) Goats — These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online by May 15. Type MYOTONIC in the Scrapie Flock ID line to notify us that the goat is a Myotonic goat. Myotonic goats must be registered with the Myotonic Goat Registry.

**Dairy Goats**—These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under *Goats, Dairy* by May 15. Tattoo and birthdate are required. Scrapie tags are required for any sexually intact goat.

## Livestock Identification Details (cont'd.)

**Dairy Cattle**— These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under *Dairy Cattle* by May 15.

**Swine**—These animals were already identified at the weigh-in in March. All information from the ID form will be entered into 4-H Online by the families. Please check the paper ID form for accuracy, if you find a mistake, please call us to get it fixed. If the information is correct, please identify each animal in 4-H Online by May 15. All lowa State Fair Swine must be tagged with special DNA punch tags (tagged by families) and entered into 4-H Online by May 15.

Bucket/Bottle Calf, Goat, & Lamb—These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under Bucket/Bottle Calf, Bucket/Bottle Goat, or Bucket/Bottle Lamb by May 15.

Animals must have a tag, either 4-H or farm tag in their ear to be eligible for the fair. Exhibitors may identify more than one in each division, but only one in each division may be exhibited at the fair. Llamas/Alpacas— These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under Llamas by May 15. If leasing a llama/alpaca, the lease must be turned in to the Extension office by 4:30 p.m. on May 15. Lease forms are available on our website and at the Extension office.

**Rabbits**— These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under *Rabbits* by May 15. All rabbits must have tattoos in their ears, left ear preferred.

**Poultry**—These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under *Poultry* by May 15. If you have a pen of the special Market Broilers, please be sure to note that in your entry **Dog**—These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under *Dogs* by May 15. We must have the rabies vaccination serial numbers and dates in 4-H Online by May 15. If your puppy is too young for the rabies vaccination, please contact the Extension office as soon as the vaccination is given. All dogs must be vaccinated to be eligible for the fair.

Horses—These animals must be identified by the exhibitor in 4-H Online under *Horses* by May 15. Photos of horses must be uploaded. If you are leasing a horse, the lease must also be uploaded to 4-H Online. If you plan to exhibit your horse at the lowa State Fair, you must also upload your Registration Form to 4-H Online.

Scrapie Tags—ANY sexually intact sheep or goat must have a scrapie tag or scrapie tattoo prior to leaving home to arrive at the fair.
