2022-2023 4-H Enrollment

Enrollment is NOW OPEN!!!



Enrollment is open via 4-H Online 2.0 Sign In (4honline.com) All enrollments; including Clover Kids, 4-H members, and leaders needs to be entered in 4-H Online this year.

There is an annual program fee of \$35 to enroll in 4-H. But thanks to Mahaska County Farm Bureau, 4-H members will only have to pay \$30 for enrollment because Farm Bureau is donating a \$5 scholarship for each 4-H member!

Also new this year, we will be accepting online payments for 4-H enrollment. We are STRONGLY ENCOURAGING all families to pay their enrollment fees online when they enroll. When entering your enrollment there will be a section for fees. At this point you will need to enter a credit card. If you submit your enrollment with out entering a credit card you will have to submit cash or check. Cash or check payments should be submitted to the Extension Office via mail, mailbox, or in-person. Please indicate the child you are paying for, Once we receive your payment, your enrollment will be approved. Information on how to pay online can be found on page 7 of Family Enrollment Guide linked above.

If you feel that this fee would constitute an undue financial burden, financial aid is available from the Mahaska County 4-H Foundation. Please contact the Extension Office for assistance.



In order to be eligible to exhibit at Southern Iowa Fair in 2023, enrollment in 4-H Online 2.0 and program fee must be paid by Jan.1 2023 for all previously enrolled Mahaska County 4-H members. New 4-H members have until May15th, 2023.



As the new year starts, leader's make sure that you are re-enrolling as well. This helps make sure that we have your contact information correct and ensures your are covered in all situations. If you're not sure which type of leader role you have, you'll need to know when completing your 4-H Online registration. See the descriptions below:

Club Leader (Direct & Ongoing) - This is for primary leaders or co-leaders of clubs/groups. This leader type will grant you access to club information in 4-H Online. (This is the "Organizational" Leader role.) Once club leaders are enrolled and approved they will be given access to login in to 4-H Online and see their club's information.

Club Leader Assistant (Direct & Ongoing) - This is for an assistant club leader. This will grant you access to club information in 4-H Online. (This is a leader who assists the Organizational Club Leader, but is not the point of contact for the club.)

Project Leader (Direct & Ongoing) - This is for volunteers who lead (or meet regularly for) a specific project area within a 4-H club.

Group Volunteers (Direct & Ongoing) - This is for volunteers who interact with youth in public or group settings (This is the "Activity" Leader role).

Clover Kids- HELP NEEDED!



Clover Kid registration is open NOW via 4-H Online. Clover Kid meetings will begin officially in November because we are in need of volunteers for several clubs to the meet 6 kids for every adult ratio set by lowa 4-H.

Cost to join Clover Kids will be \$25.00 for the year which includes a t-shirt, monthly activities, and snacks at our monthly meetings. Each month will consist of a new lesson that will include activities and crafts. Unfortunately, children who are enrolled in Kinder-Prep are not eligible, only those who are enrolled in Kindergarten-3rd grade students are eligible.

Oskaloosa Clover Kids (meets 2nd Tuesday from 4:30-5:30pm at the Extension Office): This group needs 1-2 more volunteers.



Oskaloosa Christian Clover Kids (meets the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 3:15-4:15pm at the Christian School Music Room): This club needs a Club Leader and 1 volunteer.



Eddyville Clover Kids (meets the 1st Thursday of each month from 3:15-4:15pm at the Eddyville Elementary School): This club needs 2-3 more volunteers.



Fremont Clover Kids (meets the 1st Thursday of each month from 3:15-4:15pm at the Fremont School): This club needs a Club Leader.



North Mahaska Clover Kids (meets the 1st Tuesday of each month from 4:00pm-5:00pm at Friends Church in New Sharon): This club needs 1-2 more volunteers.

All new volunteers will need to complete a background check and training depending on the role of the volunteer. Clover Kids volunteers can be anyone that has a passion in working with our youth of younger ages such parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles. You name it! Clover Kids is a unique program because the Extension Office puts together the plans including kits and snacks for the program and your role as a volunteer is to carry out the meeting based on the plans.

Honor Council


4-H Honor Council applications were due **September 22.** The new Honor Council members will be notified shortly. Be on the lookout if you applied.

Reasonable Accommodation Practice

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION PRACTICES As part of its duties under the Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008 ("ADAAA") and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, lowa State University Extension and Outreach will provide reasonable accommodations to its "policies, practices, or procedures" when the accommodations are necessary to provide equal access to programming to participants with a qualifying disability. It will also provide auxiliary aids and services when they are necessary to provide equal access. The process has the following five stages: (1) completion of the Reasonable Accommodation Request and Healthcare Provider Disability Documentation forms, (2) participants and parents are sent an agenda for the eligibility team meeting, (3) the eligibility meeting is conducted, (4) a determination letter is sent to participants, and (5) possible reassessment for future events.
