Poultry Testing

ALL poultry will be required to have pullorum typhoid testing performed within 90 days of the Polk County Fair. Certificates from the hatchery or store of purchase do not qualify as current testing; this certificate is invalid once the birds have entered your farm.

We will offer one more testing day at the Polk County Extension Office in Altoona on Thursday, July 6, 6:00-8:00 pm.

Youth Open Class Tagging Requirements

Any animal that will be shown in a youth open class show at the Polk County Fair needs to come to the fair with a vet-issued health paper. In the past families have run into issues with their animals not having an official id. An official id is one of the following:

- USDA approved RFID (white button or bigger plastic tag that can be scanned)
- Brucellosis tag (orange metal tag)
- Registered tattoo with registration paper (for purebreds)
- Other USDA tags (silver metal tags with the US shield)
- 4-H USDA tags
- 4-H EID USDA tags
- Scrapie tags for all sheep and goats intact or over 18 months of age

If you do not have access to one of these types of tags: Bucket bottle calf is where this is normally the issue, so if you have one that needs to be tagged, please arrange a time with Marci to bring the animal to the Extension Office. Due to staff capacity this summer we will not be able to make farm visits.

Livestock Skill-A-Thon

Back for 2023 is the Livestock Skill-A-Thon. So what is a Skill-A-Thon? It is an event to test a youth's knowledge of livestock in general. The event will be made up of 10 stations testing knowledge in varying livestock/animal species. Each station will include photos or diagrams of things to identify as well as a word bank for possible answers. Species will include: horse, sheep, swine, meat goat, dairy goat, dog, poultry, rabbit, cattle and pet stock. Potential topics are: breeds, tack, by products, body parts, diseases, methods of ID and meat cuts.

The Skill-A-Thon will take place starting Thursday, July 20 at 9 am, youth must be registered at this time. This contest is open to youth K-12th grade, it will be broken into the following age categories: Pee-Wee (K-3), Junior (4-6), Intermediate (7-8), Senior (9-12). Youth will have the ability to compete in teams of 3 or individually, teams will work individually at each station.

2023 Entries will be only done electronically.

- System will not open to receive entries until May 24
 - 4-H & Clover Kids will log-in with 4-H Online information
 - New FFA will need to create a log-in
 - If youth are showing 4-H and FFA they will log-in each way and have 2 separate entries.
 - Help sheets are on the homepage of the webpage.
- o Entries can be paid via check, cash or credit card online.
- If people choose to pay by check or cash that is due to our office by July 1, 5 pm NOT postmarked by July 1. Please note the office will be closed on July 1.
- Late entries can still be made 2 days after July 1, but must be done in our office and credit card will not be accepted, a \$50 fee per day is also assessed.

Foods for Iowa 4-H Fairs

Planning to exhibit in food and nutrition at the Polk County Fair? Make sure to check up on the <u>Foods</u> <u>for Iowa 4-H Fairs</u> document that has been updated. This document and the <u>AnswerLine</u> set the rules for food safety when it concerns exhibited food for fairs.

Entry Tags

Entry tags will be printed by the Extension Office with the specific info that you entered in Fair Entry. Tags will be mailed the week following July 1. If you plan to make changes to your building exhibits after you have entered, please let us know as soon as possible to be able to print new tags. Please use detailed descriptions when registering.

Livestock Health Papers

Individual Certificates of Veterinary Inspection will be required on livestock exhibited (including Open Class animals) at a county 4-H/FFA fair, and must be inspected when unloaded or shortly thereafter by a livestock superintendents. Superintendents will require health certificates at check-in time or the animal will be removed from the fair grounds. Each show must have an official veterinarian. Health Certificates must be issued within 30 days (14 days for sheep and 7 days for swine) of the county fair.

Dogs, Cats and pets Must have a current rabies certificate. Poultry and birds must be Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of exhibition. Birds must also be free of lice and mites at fair.

Clover Kids at the Fair

Clover Kids can enter in the Polk County Fair and take projects (you pay one entry fee but take multiple projects) on Conference Judging Day, Saturday, July 16. Projects include crafts you made throughout the year and/or an exhibit you created specifically for the fair. In previous years, Clover Kids have shown judges: lego projects, homemade jewelry, baked goods, a coloring page, etc. The judging process is a higher level show-and-tell; ALL exhibits that Clover Kids bring will be judged at one time.

- Bucket of Flowers is just that the youth plant and care for a container of flowers,
- Educational presentation is when the youth give a 5-minute or less speech teaching the judge(s) and the audience how to do something.
