State Recognition Opportunities: To qualify you must submit an application by **February 1st** and go through the interview process. This is a great opportunity for youth in grades 9th-12th for leadership beyond the county level.

lowa 4-H Foundation Scholarships are **due February 1st.** To be eligible for any of the lowa 4-H Foundation Scholarships you must have 2 letters of recommendation: one from an Extension Staff or a 4-H Volunteer and one form a school/college academic advisor or teacher. Please make sure to give your references plenty of time to submit their letter of recommendation. Around the Wold in 12 Dishes- Newsletter



This is a new process and we are here to help answer any questions.

YQCA



All 4-H livestock exhibitors are required to be YQCA certified for the county/state fair exhibition for the following species: beef, dairy cattle/goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep & swine.

Youth have two options to become certified:

Option1: Attend the in person training on January 30th 10am-11:30am (\$3 per youth)

Option 2: Complete online training (\$12 per youth).

How to register for online:

- 1. Visit https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login
- Login in with your 4-H Online username and password.
- 3. Select the course for the 4-H member based on their age as of 1/1/21
- 4. Choose the Web-based training.
- 5. Complete registration by purchasing the course—\$12/member for Web-based training.

How to register for in-person training:

- 1. Visit https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login
- Login in with your 4-H Online username and password.
- 3. Select the course for the 4-H member based on their age as of 1/1/21
- 4. Choose the Instructor-Led training, select "lowa" and find the Poweshiek County training scheduled for 1/30/21
- Complete registration by purchasing the course—\$3/member for face-to-face training.

Note: Must register and pay online for In-person session by January 25th. Max of 15 youth.
