Record Books

The purpose of 4-H record keeping is to teach valuable life skills in how to organize important information that may be needed for things such as taxes or applying for loans. Record keeping is an ongoing process that does not end when the 4-H year ends. Youth are encouraged to select a format and process that meets their needs and their learning style.

OBJECTIVES FOR 4-H RECORD KEEPING

- To learn how to set goals, make action plans, and determine how well you did.
- To learn the skills of record keeping such as organization, planning, and decision-making.
- To learn to communicate and summarize.
- To learn responsibility by completing a task.
- To evaluate information that will market personal skills through future resumes and applications.

Club leaders will be collecting your record books to review and nominate members for various awards. You may nominate yourself for county project awards. Senior 4-H'ers are encouraged to apply for a state awards so feel free to contact us at the Extension office or visit State Project Awards for more information. Club leaders will communicate with club members when they want record books turned in to them. We do expect every 4-H'er to turn in some form of record keeping to their leader. Leaders must turn record books into the Extension Office no later than Friday, September 22.

- While at the fair, Dr. Brandi Huddle will gather ultrasound images of each animal, this data will be used to create carcass scores related to grade, quality, and yield.
- Winners in each category will receive a cash prize up to \$500.
- · Participants will be invited to a reception to recognize award winners.
