Dog Workshops

It's time to work those dogs again! If you are enrolled in a dog project and wish to work your dog, you can. The series of workshops begins on Wednesday, May 3 at the Shelby County Fairgrounds and will run for about 9 weeks. Resource Project Leader, Linda Heflin, will lead the workshops. They will be fun and interesting for anyone from the beginner to advanced members.

There are some health requirements that you must follow in order to attend. So please be sure that your dog has current vaccinations for distemper, rabies, and parvovirus. You should also **be sure to have them on flea and tick preventives**. Female dogs that are in-season should not be brought to sessions during that time. Youth should attend even when the dog cannot. It is highly recommended that anyone planning on showing their dog at the Shelby Co. Fair 4-H Dog Show attend these workshops. Non-4-H youth and adults can also participate in the workshops. Things that you will need to bring to the workshops include:

- Your dog (clean and free of fleas and ticks, no in-season females)
- A six foot leather or nylon leash and choker chain or flat collar
- Current vaccination certificate for your dog from the vet
- Registration fee (\$10.00 each youth, \$30.00 adults)

We encourage everyone to be *weather aware* as these dog workouts begin. If the forecast causes weather concerns, we encourage you to stay home as the workout will likely be cancelled.

Don't forget, first session is on Wednesday, May 3 beginning at 7:00 p.m. Keep in mind that dog I.D. must be in Fair Entry by the May 15 deadline.

Food for 2023 4-H Fairs

Along with the Foods for Iowa 4-H Fairs – Quick Reference Guide (2023), ISU Extension and Outreach AnswerLine recently shared the blog post "Safe Frosting for Iowa 4-H Fairs". Exhibitors are encouraged to use this information as a guide when selecting recipes for the fair. Plan ahead for a successful fair experience. Use these guidelines to help select an acceptable product for exhibit, find an approved recipe source, and identify the appropriate preparation method. Food safety should always be considered when preparing food any time. Our office has printed copies available.
