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2017 Summer Day Camps!



Camp 1 & 2: Healthy Me!: This 2 hour camp is designed specially for our youngest camp goers; ages 4 and up. Youth will experience different foods and prepare their own snack. We will also learn about being active to have a healthy heart. We require an adult or older sibling/babysitter to attend with the youth.

Camp: 3 & 4 Bugs & Butterflies: A Creepy Crawly, beautiful adventure camp involves fun, hands-on activities that teach basic science. We'll take a closer look at insects and butterflies all around us. Campers will learn through exploration and experimentation.

Camp 5 & 6: Dash & Dot: Campers will learn beginning coding with Bee Bots and then progress to Dash & Dot. Dash & Dot are real robots that teach kids to code while they play. Using apps and a tablet, kids will learn to code while they make Dash sing, dance and navigate all around the room. Sensors on the robot mean they react to the environment around them, including the kids.

Camp 7: Kids in the Kitchen: Explore tasting, cooking and healthy living. We will be sampling different foods and learning to properly prepare some new favorites. Don't forget about staying active as part of a healthy lifestyle!

Camp 8 & 9: An Unfortunate Camp: An Unfortunate Camp involves fun, hands-on activities that teach basic science behind inventions. We'll study reptiles (no real snakes involved!) and we'll get creative with interesting projects. Campers will learn through exploration and experimentation. An Unfortunate Camp is based on the first three book from the book series "A Series of Unfortunate Events".

Camp 10: Space Explorers: This camp involves going out of this world as we explore all things "space". This NASA inspired camp will provide campers with the opportunity to examine early rockets and take a peek into the future of space transportation. We'll build our own rocket prototype and experiment Newton's laws of motion.

Camp 11: Cooking up Science: Clover Cookie Factory: Campers will learn the science behind common ingredients and why they are needed in baking. They will then put their new knowledge to work and determine what ingredient is missing from the cookies prepared by the instructors. There will be several different cookies and each one will not have a necessary ingredient (or the wrong amount of an ingredient.)

Camp 12 & 13: Babysitting/ 1st Aid & CPR: Child care instruction will be led by Myrtue Medical Center; Learning for Life staff. Participants will learn about ages and stage of children ages 0-8, proper holding, feeding, diapering and age appropriate activities. 1st Aid/CPR instruction will be led by certified American Heart Association instructors from Myrtue Medical Center. Participants will learn child and adult 1st Aid and CPR. Open to any youth of babysitting age and ability. (Funding for this event is provided in part by Community Partnership for Protecting Children's (CPPC) Neighborhood Networks to help families build lasting relationships in their community.)
