How many people called?

Teen Line received 171 calls for the month of April. This is a decrease of 55 calls from the previous month. The annual total (fiscal year) of calls from October 2002 – April 2003 is 1,320.

Who called?

The average caller was 18 years old, female (57% female, 23% male), and remained on the line for 5 minutes. Fifteen percent of the calls were made by adults. Eighteen percent of the callers were using our service for the second time or more.

Topics of discussion:

The greatest number of calls were categorized as relationship concerns (20%). Of these thirty-five calls, 57% revolved around family issues, 17% to peer/friend issues, and another 19% were concerned about boy and/or girl relationships.

The remaining calls were categorized as follows: abuse (12 or 7%), birth control (2 or 1%), educational (1 or 1%), employment (2 or 1%), foster care/aftercare (6 or 4%), hang-ups (30 or 18%), health (6 or 4%), information about hotline (12 or 7%), legal (2 or 1%), lonely or just needed to talk (20 or 12%), other (31 or 18%), prank (10 or 6%), pregnancy (8 or 5%), runaway (3 or 2%), sexuality (2 or 1%), suicide (2 or 1%), and wrong number (7 or 4%).

What was the outcome of the calls?

Of the 171 calls, 63 (37%) required a listening ear and counseling that the Teen Line staff provided. In addition, 26 callers (15%) had a specific question that staff was able to answer. To supplement the information given by staff, 35 referrals (20%) were made. Staff was unable to help the 41 callers (24%) that hung-up or made a prank call.

To whom were the callers referred?

Of the referrals that were made, 12% were to a counselor other than their school counselor, 6% were to the Department of Public Health, and 6% were to a family planning center. Add to that, 4% to law enforcement, 6% to legal services, 10% to medical services, 6% to another hotline, 14% to a school personnel, and 8% of the callers were referred to their parents. Five callers (10%) were referred to the Iowa Aftercare Services Network.
