How many people called?

Teen Line received 182 calls for the month of March. This is an increase of 17 calls from the previous month. The annual total (fiscal year) of calls from October 2003 – March 2004 is 1,138.

Who called?

The average caller was 16 years old, female (55% female, 21% male), and remained on the line for 3 minutes. Nineteen percent of the calls were made by adults. Two percent of the callers were using our service for the second time or more.

Topics of discussion:

The greatest number of calls were categorized as relationship concerns (14%). Of these twenty-six calls, 46% revolved around family issues, 15% revolved around peer/friend issues, and another 35% were concerned about boy and/or girl relationships.

The remaining calls were categorized as follows: abuse (7 or 4%), birth control (3 or 2%), educational (7 or 4%), foster care/aftercare (7 or 4%), hang-ups (23 or 13%), health (20 or 11%), information about hotline (14 or 8%), lonely or just needed to talk (2 or 1%), other (17 or 9%), prank (26 or 14%), pregnancy (8 or 4%), runaway (1 or 1%), sexuality (10 or 5%), and wrong number (18 or 10%).

What was the outcome of the calls?

Of the 182 calls, 45 (25%) required a listening ear and counseling that the Teen Line staff provided. In addition, 26 callers (14%) had a specific question that staff was able to answer. To supplement the information given by staff, 38 referrals (21%) were made. Staff was unable to help the 52 callers (29%) that hung-up or made a prank call.

To whom were the callers referred?

Of the referrals that were made, 2% were to the Iowa Department of Public Health, 10% were to a family planning center, 10% to another hotline, 4% to law enforcement services, 2% to legal services, 14% to medical services, 10% to school personnel, 4% who were referred to a counselor other than their school counselor, and 10% of the callers were referred to their parents. Seven callers (14%) were referred to the Iowa Aftercare Services Network.
