Upcoming Weigh-Ins

Swine Weigh-Ins will be held on April 6th. We will begin drawing for Rural Development Swine at 8:30 AM. Weigh-In and ear notching to follow.

Sheep & Goat Weigh-Ins will be held on April 20th. We will start at 8:00 AM and finish at 10:00 AM.

YQCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals or YQCA is required for all FFA & 4-H members who wish to exhibit livestock at the Adams County Fair and the Iowa State Fair. This does not include horses or dogs.

- You will select the training based upon the age you turned in 2023. Each training lists an age group (Junior, Intermediate, Senior) after the ages, take the training based upon your age as of December 31, 2023, even if the training group listed is incorrect.
- The training must be completed before May 15, 2024 in order to be eligible to participate in the Adams County Fair!

Face to Face Training - Save the Date!

There will be a face-to-face training on Wednesday, March 27th at 6:30 PM at the Adams County Extension Office. The cost will be \$3. The registration link will come at a later date.

Online Training:

Trainings may also be completed online via the YQCA website. The online training will cost \$12 per member completing the training. Members must sign in at https://yqcaprogram.org/ and register.

You may test out at the age of 12 for the Intermediate level and then again at age 15 for the Senior level. Testing out costs \$36 for the 12-year-old tests and \$48 for the 15-year-olds test. You may only try to test out once per age group and the test out must be completed online. Do not fret if you don't pass the test. You will only be charged \$12 for the online training for your current age group.

Shooting Sports in 2024

Shooting Sports practices will be held on the 4th Sunday of the month. Remember you will need to attend at least 6 practices to be able to participate in any competitions: County Fair Shoots, Regional Events, State Shoot. We will set up some extra practices in June. For the Winter, we will plan some indoor activities: safety review, gun cleaning, equipment maintenance, review of our upcoming year. We will try to have the laser dry fire set up in the basement for the shotgunners.

Adams County Fairbook Changes 2024

General Rules -

Change: General rule #3 - 3. All 4-H exhibitors must be active club members, including attending 75 percent of their club meetings. Club leaders determine exhibition eligibility.

All 4-H and FFA exhibitors are active club members with no more than 2 unexcused club meetings. Club leaders determine eligibility.

Change: General rule - 25 - Parking along the east side of John Street in the grass is allowed. Depending on availability, the parking lot east of the pool house is another option for livestock exhibitor parking. Livestock trailers are not to be unhooked on the grounds at any time. Trailer parking will be in designated areas.

Livestock Regulations –

Change: Livestock Regulations - 4. A copy of registration papers for all purebred animals entered in said classes will be required to be turned in to the Extension Office or uploaded on 4honline before June 15. FFA members will turn into their FFA Advisor

Change: 20. Rate of gain will be figured on all animals that are weighed in at designated species weigh-ins.

Swine Rules -

Add: There will be an optional spring weigh-in for all swine. It is up to the swine exhibitors to weigh-in their swine. Any swine that is weighed-in will be entered into the rate of gain contest.

Add: Market class for gilts

Combine Rule – 3 & 4: All breeding and market swine must be in the exhibitor's possession, tagged, ear notched, and identified before 11:59 p.m. on May 15.

- A. 4-H members must identify swine in 4hOnline by the above deadline.
- B. FFA members must identify swine with species specific forms to their FFA advisor by the above deadline.

Remove: Each swine exhibitor who wants to enter swine in the Fair Sale is required to weigh-in at least one market swine.

Add: Exhibitor can only designate 1 pig to go to carcass.

Change: 5. LIMITATIONS—An exhibitor may show a maximum of two breeding gilts, three individual market pigs(market gilt or barrow), one pen of three, and three carcass pigs. You can only bring a maximum of seven pigs at the fair per exhibitor. Each exhibitor must declare what division. Swine can only be entered in individual market classes or carcass classes. Pen of three can be made up of any market animal (individual, carcass).

Add: Pen of 3 can be made up of individual or carcass swine.

Adams County Fairbook Changes 2024

Horse Rules -

Change: No stallions will be shown, except 2024 foals.

Remove: All county fair exhibitors must have successfully completed Level 1 by July 1 of current year and are encouraged to complete more advanced levels. To compete in Ak-Sar-Ben Advanced Level (600s) classes, exhibitors must have successfully completed lowa Level III. All level testing must be done in Adams County by the Adams County Horse Project leader(s).

Remove: No open flames or smoking in the barns – Add to General Rules

Add: Showmanship awards (banners) for horse/pony

Add rule: Exhibitors may only compete in 1 saddled equitation class. Classes include: Open Walk/Trot, English Pony Pleasure, English Horse Pleasure, English Equitation, 2 & 3 yr. old Snaffle Bit Pleasure, Pony Pleasure, and Horse Pleasure.

Change: Exhibitors may enter as many horses as they want to the following classes. Exhibitor must designate one horse in each class as their high point horse. Classes include: Western Riding, Reining, Poles, Barrels, Flag Race, Costume, Key Hole Race.

Fair Sale Rules -

Remove: One the exhibit goes through the sale ring it is no longer eligible for 4-H or FFA shows or fairs. Any animal invited to participate in the Best of the Southwest Shootout will be allowed to withdraw from the sale.

Remove Part of 5: All pigs under 225 pounds at Fair Weigh-In must go to resale.

Change Part of Rule 4: Those participating in the Premium Sale must fill out the Premium Sale Form and submit to the Fair Office by noon on Saturday of the Fair.

Iowa 4-H State Livestock Updates



These FAQs review changes for Iowa 4-H Livestock and Horticulture Exhibition at the 2024 Iowa State Fair. The full premium book will be released later in the spring.

Are there new limits to the number of animals I can bring?

With limited barn space and increasing exhibitor numbers in both swine and sheep, new entry limits have been set. Swine exhibitors may enter and bring a maximum of 5 market pigs and 5 breeding gilts. Sheep exhibitors can still enter 4 market lambs but may only enter 12 breeding ewes. Beef rules have been reworded to better explain entry limits. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of two beef animals. A third steer may be entered if exhibited only in the Beef of Merit show. (This is not a change, just updated language for Beef.)

Have entry fees increased?

Yes. Beef - \$35/head. Youth Dairy Cattle - \$25/head. Horse & Pony - \$25/horse. Meat Goat, Sheep and Swine - \$10/head.

Is there clarification for the advantage or percentage ewes or wether dam classes?

In 2024, additional language has be added to the sheep department that further explains the eligibility of advantage or percentage ewes. A class of percentage or advantage ewes will only be added if 5 or more have been entered. If a class cannot be created, advantage or percentage ewes will show in the commercial class. Additionally, percentage or advantage ewes are not eligible for Supreme Purebred Female. However, they may compete for overall Commercial Ewe.

So, what's next?

If you are planning to exhibit 4-H Livestock or Horticulture projects at the Iowa State Fair, make sure you complete both of these steps!

- 1) Submit the Animal ID in 4-HOnline by each species' deadline, and
- Submit online entries between June 1 and July 1, 2024.


