Workers:

Each club will need to have enough workers to meet the minimum requirements needed at each station. Senior 4-H'ers can serve as adults except in the grill and cashier area.

Stations:

1. Drinks = 2 members
2. Pies, Chips, Candy = 1 members
3. Meats = 2 adults and 2 members
4. Grills = 2 adults
5. Clean-up = 1 adult and 2 to 4 members
6. Cashier = 2 adults

FOODSTAND CLUB INSTRUCTIONS

Foodstand Guidelines:

1. Always be polite and courteous to your customers eating at the foodstand. Help them through the ordering process.
2. Show up on time and stay until someone from the next shift is there to relieve you.
3. Check in with the adult supervisor upon arrival for your shift at the back door. Do not come through the front doors.
4. Clubs coming on will have a short instructional session behind the foodstand by the tree before beginning work.
5. Your first concern is always to wait on customers. When not waiting on customers, pick up litter, wash up counters, refill kitchen items, and generally clean up your work area.
6. Older 4-H'ers need to work closely with younger members to help them become acquainted with the foodstand procedures.
7. There is NO FREE FOOD either for volunteers or customers.
8. Customers are VERY AWARE of how you handle their food. Keep your hands clean at all times. Hand sink & towels are by the back door. Dish washing sink is not for washing hands.
9. Shoulder length and longer hair should be tied back. Hairspray will be applied to hair for food protection reasons. No opened toe shoes allowed.
10. Do not let people wait for your attention - help them immediately.
11. It is hot and sometimes crazy and hectic work. Remind yourself again and again that you are having fun and helping your 4-H program at the same time.

The 4-H Foodstand at the Allamakee County Fair is one of the sources of funds available to the county 4-H program. Money raised at the foodstand directly supports the Allamakee County 4-H program and fair expenses.

The annual success of the foodstand is due to one big factor: First and most important is the involvement of the VOLUNTEERS - - club members, leaders and parents.
