Junior Livestock Auction

Saturday, July 20th, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. in the Ronald Turke Show Arena

Rules

- 1. All animals must have been shown at the current Appanoose County Fair to be eligible for the Junior Livestock Auction.
 - a. Only eligible livestock species will be allowed to be sold during the auction, no additional products and/or by-products, supplies, or equipment will be permitted to be sold during the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 2. Eligible species for the Junior Livestock Auction include Market Beef, Bucket Bottle Animals, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Market Swine.
- 3. 4-H and FFA members must be present and sell their own animals at the livestock sale.
- 4. Sale order will rotate each year. The 2024 Sale Order is:
 - a. Large Animals: Beef, Bucket Bottle Calf, Swine, Sheep, Bucket Bottle Lamb
 - b. Small Animals: Goat, Bucket Bottle Goat, Rabbit, and Poultry
- 5. All 4-H and FFA members desiring to sell livestock through the Junior Livestock Auction must notify and draw for sale order by <u>5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July</u> **18**th, **2024**; there will be NO EXCEPTIONS for late entries into the auction.
 - a. Sale Draw will be open Tuesday, July 16th through Thursday, July 18th from 2:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. in the Fair Office following each specie's show. You will not be able to draw for the auction until after the completion of each show.
- 6. Sale order will be Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, followed by Breed Champions & Reserve Champions, then Top Rate of Gain Winners. The rest of the animals will be sold in order of number drawn.
- 7. The total number of animals allowed to be sold per exhibitor will be determined by the total number of eligible species that is exhibited. An exhibitor is not allowed to sell more than 4 head per specie with the exception of only 2 beef exhibits.
 - a. An exhibitor that has exhibited <u>2 eligible species</u> is allowed to sell a total of <u>6 animals</u>, with no more than 4 individuals per specie.
 - b. An exhibitor that has exhibited <u>3 eligible species</u> is allowed to sell a total of <u>7 animals</u>, with no more than 4 individuals per specie.
 - c. An exhibitor that has exhibited <u>4 or more eligible species</u> is allowed to sell a total of <u>8 animals</u>, with no more than 4 individuals per specie.

- 8. Each exhibitor may go through the auction ring two times in each species (not counting champions). Animals should be sold in lots of 2 or 3 if you are selling more than 2 animals in that given specie.
- 9. Sale weigh-ins will take place on Friday, July 19th from 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. All animals going through the auction will be required to be weighed during the sale weigh-ins except for bucket bottle calves, rabbits, and poultry.
- 10. Animals invited to the South Central Iowa Showdown (Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion, if applicable) are not eligible to sell in the Junior Livestock Auction. However, those exhibits will be allowed to enter the auction for premium donation with no change of ownership of the animal. Additionally, if any animal that goes through the auction is given back to the exhibitor it will be considered sold for premium (as no change of ownership has taken place).
 - a. Exhibitors are not granted the choice of selling for premium only, unless they are invited as a Showdown participant.
 - i. The following exhibits that are eligible to sell as premium only, as a result of being invited to the South Central Iowa Showdown, are the Grand Champion (market and breeding) beef, goat, sheep, and swine. Exception: Reserve Grand Champion can sell for premium only if the Grand Champion elects to not participate in the Showdown.
 - b. Each exhibitor may only sell 3 individual animals for premium. If an animal is sold for premium, it will be counted towards the total number of animals sold per exhibitor. (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- 11. Buyer must determine the destination of the animals at the time of the sale. (Resale, Locker, Keep, For Premium Only (given back to the exhibitor), etc.)
- 12. The buyer has the option of separating a pen of animals and purchasing 1 or more of the animals being sold.
