Please review this newsletter carefully as it contains important Boone County Fair changes and reminders. **ONE IMPORTANT REMINDER:** All 4-H members must wear a white 4-H shirt while showing static exhibits and livestock exhibits unless rules say other wise.

4-H'ers will be receiving ribbons for their efforts throughout the week of County Fair. Ribbons are used to place exhibits into groups representing standards met.

- **Purple** means the exhibit exceeded standards. It is the highest ribbon awarded.
- **Blue** means the exhibit met all standards well.
- **Red** means the exhibit met some standards well, but could use improvement on others.
- **White** means the exhibit needs improvement on many standards or is missing information critical to evaluation.

★ GOALS FOR THE BOONE COUNTY FAIR

- Allow 4-H'ers ample opportunity to demonstrate and communicate what they have learned
- Give 4-H'ers the opportunity to receive feedback on their exhibits through education, evaluation and encouragement
- See families working and having fun together
- Show the public 4-H in action

FOOD AND NUTRITION EXHIBITS AT THE COUNTY FAIR

It is highly encouraged that exhibitors include a cost of how much their food exhibits cost within their goal cards. It is our hope that this list of ingredient costs will be helpful to you as you calculate this.

REMEMBER—divide the purchase price by the number of servings or measure of ingredients in your recipe.

PRE FAIR CHECK LIST



- ⇒ **White 4-H T-Shirt**—White 4-H t-shirts are required by anyone exhibiting at the County Fair, with the exception of dairy and horse exhibitors. T-shirts can be purchased at the Extension Office prior to fair or at the Livestock Office during fair for \$8.
- ⇒ **4-H Arm Band**—Horse exhibitors must wear a 4-H arm band on their arm when exhibiting in a long sleeved white shirt. Arm Bands can be purchased at the Extension Office prior to fair or at the Livestock Office during fair for \$2.50.
- ⇒ Read the Iowa Youth Code of Ethics, 4-H/FFA Livestock General Rules, Division Rules and Health Requirements found in the Boone County Fairbook.
- ⇒ Market Swine, Sheep, Goat, Beef and Pen of 3 exhibitors must complete an **Animal Care and Management Disclosure Statement** and turn it in at their species check-in. Forms can be found online at <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/boone/content/boone-county-fair-information>.

PEN/STALL SET-UP



- ⇒ **Stall assignments** will be posted by noon on **Sunday, July 15th**. Pens/stalls and tack/equipment can be set up anytime after this.
 - ⇒ **All exhibitors** must provide their own water buckets, feed, etc.
 - ⇒ **Beef exhibitors** must provide their own stall dividers.
- ⇒ **Rabbit and poultry bedding** was paid for by exhibitors at entry time and will be provided.
- ⇒ **Sheep, swine and horse** exhibitors must provide their own **wood product bedding**.
- ⇒ **Beef and dairy cattle bedding** was donated by the Boone County Cattlemen. Exhibitors do not need to bring their own.

ANIMAL ARRIVAL



- ⇒ **Arrival Times on Wednesday, July 18th**
 - ⇒ Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Meat Goats, Exotic and Dairy Animals = **6:00—11:00 am**
 - ⇒ Poultry= **8:00 am—Noon** and **4:00-6:00 pm**
 - ⇒ Rabbit= **4:00-6:00 pm**
 - ⇒ Swine = **7:00—9:00 pm—No early arrivals!**
- ⇒ All animals (excluding rabbit and poultry) must be vet checked before being unloaded off of trailers.
- ⇒ All **livestock trailers must be parked at the far east end of the Horse Arena** in the designated area (refer to map in the fairbook).
- ⇒ After arrival, be sure to **pick up your exhibit packet** at the Livestock Office which includes your stall cards, exhibitor number, safety pins, trophy donor addresses and Water bottle donated by Farm Credit Services.

DURING FAIR



- ⇒ 4-H exhibitors are to **groom their own animals** with assistance only from a family member, 4-H leader or other 4-H'er.
- ⇒ If an exhibitor has more than one animal in a class, **substitute showmen can be utilized**. They must be Boone County 4-H or FFA members.
- ⇒ If any show related problems arise, please contact a division superintendent. They will work to resolve the issue with you or find a person who can help.

SWINE

- ⇒ **Check-In/Weigh-In**—Hogs must be checked in on **Wednesday, July 18th** from 7:00—10:00 pm. Pigs must arrive by 9:00 pm.
- ⇒ **Ultra-sounding**—All derby pigs will be ultra-sounded on **Thursday, July 19th** in the afternoon. Non-derby exhibitors are encouraged to have their hogs ultra-sounded as well for the chance to win cash prizes.
- ⇒ **Classes**—Please note the various class options listed in the fairbook for swine. Each pig can only be exhibited in one class.
- ⇒ **Medications**—Strict adherence to withdrawal times is a requirement. Be sure to bring only unmedicated feed to County Fair if your animal is to be harvested.
- ⇒ **Release**—Early release will be on Saturday, July 21st from 8:00—9:30 pm. Hogs not going home at this time will be released on Sunday, July 22nd at 6:00 pm. All animals going home must be signed out with a Superintendent or Extension Staff member.
 - ⇒ Pens may not be torn down until all hogs have left the Swine Barn. Parents and exhibitors are encouraged to help with pen tear down.
- ⇒ **Watch for More**—Announcements will be made on the board in the Swine Barn.



SHEEP AND MEAT GOATS

- ⇒ **Prior to Arrival at Fair**
 - ⇒ All market lambs and commercial ewes must be slick shorn.
 - ⇒ Sexually intact sheep/goats must have a scrapie tag.
- ⇒ A member may enter and show a maximum of six market lambs if one is home raised.
- ⇒ **Check-In/Weigh-In**—Sheep and meat goats must be checked in and weighed on **Wednesday, July 18th** from 10:00 am—12:30 pm. This weight will be used as the sale weight.
- ⇒ **Ultra-sounding**—Ultrasounds will be taken on **Wednesday, July 12th** in the afternoon. All sheep exhibitors are asked to have at least one sheep ultra-sounded. Cash prizes will be awarded.
- ⇒ **Watch for More**—Announcements will be made on the board outside the Sheep Barn.



BEEF

- ⇒ **Check-In/Weigh-In**—
 - ⇒ **Breeding Heifer Exhibitors:** Heifers must be brought to check-in on **Wednesday, July 18th** from 6:00 —7:00 pm. Tattoos and registration papers will be checked at this time. Crossbred heifers will be weighed at check-in to determine class breaks.
 - ⇒ **Market Beef Exhibitors:** Animals must be brought to check-in on **Wednesday, July 18th** from 6:00 —7:00 pm. Animals will be weighed at this time. This weight will be used as the auction sale weight.
 - ⇒ **Cow Calf Exhibitors:** Inform a Superintendent or Extension Staff member of whether or not cow calf pairs will be shown in Friday's show on **Wednesday, July 18th** from 6:00 —7:00 pm. Actual animals do not need to be present at check-in. They may either arrive on Wednesday and be stalled in the Beef Barn or come for the day of show only.
 - ⇒ **Bucket Bottle Calf Exhibitors:** Bring completed project records to the Livestock Office at 8:30 am on **Thursday, July 19th**.
- ⇒ **Exhibitor Meeting**—Wednesday, July 18th at 7:15 pm in the Show Arena
- ⇒ **End of Fair**—Exhibitors **MUST** move bedding in the barn at least 2 feet away from the wall/fence. All bedding in tie outs must be removed.
- ⇒ **Watch for More**—Announcements will be made on the board in the Beef Barn.

PEN OF 3 AND HERD BUILDER

- ⇒ **Check-In/Weigh-In**—Animals must be checked in and pen of 3 calves will be weighed on **Wednesday, July 18th between 6:00 and 8:00 am** in the Pen of 3 Barn.
- ⇒ Exhibitors must bring their own feed bunks. Electricity will be available if exhibitors would like to bring their own fans.

HORSES

- ⇒ **Check-In**—**Wednesday, July 18th following exhibitor meeting.**
 - ⇒ Halter horses will be vet checked and measured at **7:00 am on Thursday, July 19th** at the Horse Arena. They may not be anywhere else on the grounds until after their veterinarian inspection.
- ⇒ **Exhibitors Meeting**—**Wednesday, July 18th at 11:30 am.** Parents are encouraged to attend.
- ⇒ **At the Fair**
 - ⇒ No tack stalls will be permitted.
 - ⇒ **Helmets are required** whenever you are mounted on your horse, mule or pony including during warm up, riding to the arena and at the parade.
 - ⇒ Horses are not to be ridden in the area south of the barns. The east horse arena may be utilized as an exercise arena.
 - ⇒ Trail Class (Mounted and In Hand) will be on Wednesday, July 18th from 5:00—7:00 pm, Come and Go.
 - ⇒ Costume Class (Mounted and In Hand) will be on Wednesday, July 18th at 7:30 pm.
- ⇒ **Class Reminders**
 - ⇒ Patterns for equitation, showmanship, horsemanship, fun and trail classes can be found online at <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/boone/page/4h-horse-information>
 - ⇒ The Costume Class is judged on attire of horse and rider, how they complement each other and tell a story.



RABBITS

- ⇒ **Check-In/Weigh-In**—Rabbits can arrive to the fairgrounds, be checked in and weighed on **Wednesday, July 18th from 4:00-6:00 pm.** They will be checked for lice and disease at this time.
 - ⇒ Exhibitors will sign up for classes at this time.
 - ⇒ Exhibitors should know the breed of their rabbit at check-in.
- ⇒ **Frozen Water bottles** will be provided this year.
- ⇒ **Auction**—Commercial (Purebred), Non-Standard Commercial (Crossbred) and Market Pen of 3 rabbit exhibitors are eligible to participate in the Market Livestock Auction for premiums. Animals will not be sold. 4-H/FFA member can sell their animals only by private treaty.



POULTRY

- ⇒ **Check-In/Weigh-In**—Poultry can arrive to the fairgrounds and be checked in on **Wednesday, July 18th from 8:00 am - Noon or from 4:00-6:00 pm.**
 - ⇒ Exhibitors will sign up for classes at this time.
 - ⇒ Exhibitors should know the breed of their animals at check-in.
 - ⇒ Birds will be checked for lice and disease at check-in.
 - ⇒ Meat birds will check-in on **Saturday, July 21st from 11:30-12:30 pm** and go home that same day.
- ⇒ **Auction**—Commercial Geese, Commercial Ducks, Commercial Turkeys, and Broiler Pen exhibitors are eligible to participate in the Market Livestock Auction for premiums. Animals participating in the auction are no longer eligible to be shown in future years.

CATS

- ⇒ **Need to Bring the Following Items to the Show—**
 - ⇒ Proof of your cat's rabies and distemper shots
 - ⇒ Completed Cat Project Record

SMALL PETS

- ⇒ **Need to Bring the Following Items to the Show—**
 - ⇒ Completed Rabbit, Poultry or Small Pet Project Record
- ⇒ Exhibitors will be required to come to the stage and talk to the audience about their pet.
- ⇒ Small Pets show will immediately follow the Cat Show in the Community Building on Friday, July 14th.



DOG

- ⇒ **Dog Obedience and Rally Show—**Saturday, July 14th at 9:00 am in the Show Ring
- ⇒ **Dog Agility Show—**Saturday, July 21st at 6:00 pm in the Show Ring

RELEASE

- ⇒ **Static Exhibits—**Released at 5:00 pm on Sunday, July 22nd
- ⇒ **Animals—**Released at 6:00 pm on Sunday, July 22nd. Please enter Gate D and exit Gate E, traveling north on Argo street.

HERDSMANSHIP

- ⇒ **Herdsmanship scores and comments will be posted daily in the livestock barns.**
- ⇒ See fairbook for judging criteria. Points will not be awarded for having an attendant as all members and adults are asked to be aware of animals and people in the barns to insure safety of everyone.
- ⇒ Each exhibitor is responsible for clean up of their own area during fair and before leaving the fairgrounds at the conclusion of County Fair week. "Manure Only" piles are north of the barns. Place trash in trash barrels or dumpsters. Garbage barrels are to be kept **OUTSIDE** of the buildings so they can be emptied each day.
- ⇒ Please do not use brooms on dirt floors--**USE rakes** (*you don't remove as much dirt that way*).
- ⇒ No Cash Awards. Club of the day will be selected per species per day and will receive a traveling plaque to display for one day.



AUCTION REMINDERS

- ⇒ **Market Livestock Bonus Auction—**Monday, July 23rd at 9:30 am in the Show Ring
- ⇒ **Sale Order—**Sheep, Meat Goats, Rabbits, Swine, Live Market Beef, Poultry, Beef Pen of 3, Carcass Beef, Market Beef
 - ⇒ Livestock superintendents will determine auction order for each species, with the top five champions in each species division being listed first.
 - ⇒ Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter **only one** project per species for the premium auction, regardless of whether or not they are in the top five line-up.
 - ⇒ Beef animals will be the only live animals sold during the auction.
- ⇒ **Who Participates?—**4-H and FFA members who exhibit market beef, pen of 3, market lamb, market swine, meat goats, rabbit and poultry may **choose to participate**. Be choosing to participate in the auction, 4-H and FFA members are ending their project for the year. Check-in crews must be informed of your intent to participate in the auction.
- ⇒ **Payment—**Checks will be issued within 30 days of the auction. Contact the Fairboard (515.432.5899) with any check amount questions. **Checks must be cashed within 30 days of issue day or they will be forfeited.**



Peoples Guys & Gals

Move Dividers out of Rabbit Building before 6:00 pm. Repair, pull nails & staples and wash dividers and move into Community Building (southeast corner). Set up club booths in Community Building with provided map. Sweep and clean food stand at horse arena. (Each club is responsible for bringing the necessary equipment. Here are some suggestions of what to bring: brooms, buckets, rags, tools for repairs, pliers to pull staples, and stepladder.) Help out other clubs if needed.

Rabbit – After 6:00 pm Sweep. Set up rabbit sawhorses, plastic, and cages as directed by superintendents. (Each club is responsible for bringing the necessary equipment. Here are some suggestions of what to bring: buckets, rags, tools, gloves, weed-eater, garden rake, hoe.) Help out other clubs if needed.

Poultry Club

Poultry – After 6:00 pm Sweep. Set up poultry sawhorses, plastic, and cages as directed by superintendents. Rake, pull weeds, and pick up litter around barn. (Each club is responsible for bringing the necessary equipment. Here are some suggestions of what to bring: gloves, weed-eater, garden rake, hoe.) Help out other clubs if needed.

Town & Country Pioneers

Beef/Dairy Barn and Pen of 3 Areas – Pick up trash and leaves inside and outside of building; clean/rake beef tie outs and Pen of 3 pens; pick up trash and cut/pull weeds north of the barns and in west arena. South and North Horse Barns - Pick up trash; rake pens and alleys; pull nails. Clean horse and beef wash racks including cleaning out drain. Pick up litter in the Show Ring bleachers, stairs, and ring; close all windows; move all garbage cans to south-side; stack tables and chairs at south end; clean Livestock Office - take down all signs, pull tacks, etc. Pick up trash in all areas west of Argo Street and south of barns, including carnival area and both sides of Industrial Park Road and Argo Streets, Leonard Good Stage, farm equipment display area, around Rabbit Barn, and west booster parking area. Community Building - move table and chair racks into storage room (when empty.) Sweep or vacuum big room, meeting rooms, and hallway of Community Building and sweep Commercial Building. Pick up trash around both buildings and Food Stand. (Each club is responsible for bringing the necessary equipment. Here are some suggestions of what to bring: garage brooms, dustpans, shop vacuum, leaf blower) Help out other clubs if needed.

Horse Interest Club
