YQCA certification (formally known as FSQA) is being accepted by many livestock shows and fairs that require youth quality assurance certification. View the list here, but always check the entry requirements of each show for complete details.

YQCA includes information for youth showing the following food animals:

YQCA is available as an online program for youth everywhere in the United States. YQCA in-person workshops may be available to youth where state 4-H or FFA offices or state/national livestock organizations have partnered to have qualified trainers offer in-person workshops.

RULES

10207 Bucket of Flowers

- ◆ A bucket of flowers is a 5 gallon bucket (may be decorated) with plants and or flowers. These planters will be used during the fair to help beautify the grounds.
- ◆ Buckets will be judged (Static Judging Day – Monday, July 6) and then placed by the 4-H'er on the fairgrounds.
- ◆ After the fair the exhibitor must take home his/her bucket unless it is purchased in the auction.
- ◆ Exhibitors wishing to participate in the Bucket of Flowers auction (only 25 will be sold) will need to sign up at the Extension office at least 1 week before judging day or when completing the entry form. Exhibitor must be present at the auction or the bucket will not be sold.
- ◆ Exhibitor has the option to get reimbursed the \$10 or donate the \$10 back into the 4-H Fund. This exhibit is not eligible for State Fair.
- ◆ A free 5 gallon bucket may be picked up at the Extension office after June 1 between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:30 pm.





Welcome Summer Assistant

Buchanan County Extension and Outreach is pleased to announce that Rachel DeBoer has joined the team as a Summer Youth Educator. DeBoer, daughter of Greg and Gina DeBoer of Independence, is currently enrolled at Grand View University studying secondary education and math.

In her role as Summer Youth Educator, DeBoer will provide day camps and outreach activities to give area youth the opportunity to engage in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) learning. Previously, STEM Summer Assistants have worked with local day cares, libraries and other organization with summer outreach programs for youth. With COVID-19, DeBoer will also be exploring online youth programming activities.

“I am excited about giving kids the opportunity to learn during the summer while personally gaining some additional teaching experience,” DeBoer said. “I really am looking forward to providing an engaging learning opportunity, especially under the circumstances this summer.

Teaching STEM programming is right in the center of DeBoer’s wheelhouse.

“I almost decided to get a teaching endorsement in STEM,” she explained. “I started out with science but didn’t enjoy my classes. One of my favorite STEM activities in school was making a robot and then programming it with a calculator. The goal was to program the robot through a maze. It was challenging but very engaging.”

DeBoer has previously worked with youth as a nanny, a piano teacher and a Vacation Bible School teacher. She wants to become a teacher because she “loves helping others.”

“I am very passionate about serving others,” she said. “I would love to teach 8th grade because it is a very important time for students. They learn through experiences about people, relationships and themselves.”

The DeBoer family which includes Rachel and three brothers, has had the opportunity to live several states including Iowa, Pennsylvania, Maryland and Nebraska, where Rachel was a 4-H member.

“I got purple ribbons for a jar of beets I canned and also for a poem I wrote,” she added. “A fond fair memory.”

YAC Letter & Rule Updates

Dear YAC members;

Will we have a fair? To answer the big question – we don't know. Iowa 4-H, State Fair and Iowa Fair Association members are working together to determine the best solution that keeps the health, safety and welfare of the youth in the forefront. We hope to hear something next week.

We have a few changes:

1. **Rabbit:**

With all of the safety precautions that are being mandated to keep everyone healthy this year, the Rabbit Committee will not be able to hold a workshop to help 4-H and FFA members with the tattooing of animals for the 2020 Buchanan County Fair. We will be pushing back the start of this rule to be aligned with the state fair rules for the 2021 fair.

With the addition of the rabbits being added to Master Showmanship, Rule 19 that states that rabbits are not included in Master Showmanship was not deleted and should be.

2. **Meat Goat:**

Rate of Gain Awards are cancelled due to Covid-19; livestock weigh-ins were not able to be held.

Novice Goat Project, number 3 of enrollment process should be deleted for this 2020 Fair. The rule to strike states "Purchase price of the animals will be determined by averaging the value of the of the goats using reputable market prices and will be announced as a per pound. Total value of the animals will be determined at the weigh-in by multiplying the beginning weight by price per pound to get the purchase price."

3. PT testing is not required.
4. Retinal scans are not required.
5. The May 15th deadline to have animals entered in 4Honline is postponed to June 1st.
6. Ear tags are on sale, just call the office and we will make arrangements for you to get the tags.
7. The same accommodations will be made for Purebred Registration paperwork.

Are you a dog lover? Have you ever thought about showing your precious pooch at the County Fair?

Staff will send you an online link to an informational 4-H Dog meeting, beginning at 6:00 PM on Tuesday,

May 12. You will go over the dog handbook and detailed information on expectations and upcoming clinics to help you prepare your dog for the show this summer.

If you decide showing your dog at the County Fair is something you are interested in doing, you must sign up for 4-H! 4-H is more than just showing animals. It is an amazing opportunity to have fun, make new friends and develop your communication and leadership skills. You will also have the opportunity to do projects in countless categories and participate in a variety of community programs and projects!

Process for tagging 4-H livestock at the 2020 Buchanan County Fair

- 1) Call the Buchanan County Extension Office and request tags for Breeding and Bucket Bottle Calves, Meat Goats, Sheep and Swine.
- 2) Cattle have larger ear tags. For all other types of livestock the tag size is the same. Swine planning to be shown at the State Fair also require to have a separate DNA tag. When you call let us know how many tags you need for which species.
- 3) Mail payment for tags.
- 4) Upon receipt of payment, the Extension Office will call you back and let you know your tags are available for pick up in a tub outside the building. If you need to borrow a tagger, let us know and we include it in your zip lock bag of tags.
- 5) Return taggers within 24 hours.
- 6) Once the ear tag is placed, take pictures of your livestock where ear tags are readable. You will need to know whether the tag is in the left ear or the right ear when you upload them into 4-H online.
- 7) Pick up tote will be disinfected daily.

Club Booth Decorating

Club booth decorating will be on Thursday, July 2nd starting at 5:00 PM at the Buchanan County Fairgrounds. The theme for the 2020 Fair is *We've Got A Good Thing Growing!* You may use the theme for your booths, but it is not required.

Decorations: All clubs will be provided one table. Please do not use staples, tape, thumbtacks or nails in booths. You may use Velcro, straight pins and string to hang your decorations on the back wall. Hooks can be used on pegboard side walls.

Layout: Smaller clubs will have a 4'x6' booth space this year with a card table provided unless other arrangements have been made with the Extension staff. All other 4-H clubs will have the regular 8'x5' booth space with an 8 foot table provided.

Prizes: Prizes remain the same as past years. There will be a \$25 prize for 1st place and \$15 prize for 2nd place. Winners will be posted in the building during fair week and receive their checks on Awards Night.

Pie Bakers needed for 44th Annual Contest and Auction

The Buchanan County ISU Extension and Outreach office is searching of a few great pie bakers for the 44th Annual Pie Baking Contest & Auction at the 2020 Buchanan County Fair.



Pie baking time slots are available each hour between 6 a.m. and 12:00 pm. on Thursday, July 9. Call 319-334-7161 to reserve your spot. This year's auction will be held on **Thursday, July 9th at the Black Pavilion at 6:30 p.m.** Pie judging will begin at 2 p.m.

“It’s a family tradition,” explained one grandma when she signed up to make a pie. “Each year I make a pie with whichever grandchildren are currently in 4-H. It has been going on for years and created some special memories.”

Pie baking teams arrive at the 4-H Building at the Buchanan County Fairgrounds at their designated hours. Pie tins, donated by Steve Brentner, and lard for making flaky crusts, donated by Fareway, is provided. All other supplies are brought in by the pie making teams. Rules indicate these judged pastries must be fruit pies with no lattice top, frozen crusts, streusel topping or one-crust pies allowed. Pies are numbered to allow anonymity from the judges and baked by the contest supervisor. Cooled pies are sampled by

the judges beginning at 2 p.m. Awards are presented at 6 p.m. prior to the pie auction. All pies are then auctioned to benefit the 4-H program. Generous donors have been known to pay more than \$300 for a pie to benefit student 4-Hers and this worthwhile organization.

Previous Pie & Bucket of Flowers Auctions proceeds have helped to ensure that local 4-H and FFA members have access to exceptional youth programming throughout Buchanan County. Programs supported include:

- Green Thumb Camp,
- Kitchen Creations,
- Vet Camps,
- 4-H activities, shows, etc.
- Youth grant programs (E.G. KidWind and Farm-Chat).
- Provide financial aid for youth who cannot afford program fees.
