# 2024-2025 Program Year Starts!

September marks the beginning of our new 4-H year, which means it is time to re-enroll and start thinking about which project areas you are interested in for next year. Remember all youth K-12 must re-enroll in 4-HOnline <u>each year</u> to keep active 4-H or Clover Kid member status. Do this early in the year to stay in the loop for upcoming events!

Starting September 3, remember to go to <a href="https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in">https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in</a> and log in with your email and password. A quick link is also available on the Extension webpage. It is okay to select "reset password" option and the program will walk you through the steps of getting a new password. Please be sure and check your **correspondence preference for 4-H Newsletters**. You will need to select mail or email. If you do not complete this step your enrollment may be sent back to you to select your preference.

We would like to have all returning members re-enrolled early to participate in activities. Again this year we will be offering some fun re-enrollment incentives for those that enroll before November 1st.

It is very important that when you re-enroll that you make sure you are giving us an email address where you want all important 4-H information throughout the year to go. If you change emails, just simply call the office so that we can get it changed or log into your account and change it there. # 4-H Record Books

### Purpose of Record Keeping:

- ⇒ Track participation, goals, and achievements throughout the year. Keeping annual records shows overall growth in a project area over time. Record books are a great way to track progress throughout the 4-H year and compare growth from year to year.
- ⇒ Your record book should be a reflection of the past year (September 2023-August 2024). Complete your records based on your age division and grade you were in last school year, Junior (completed grades 4-6), Intermediate (completed grades 7-8), Senior (completed grades 9-12).

### **Recognition for Completing Records:**

- ⇒ Check with your 4-H Club leader to find out when in September record books are due. Club Leaders or other adult volunteers will review your record book and provide feedback.
- ⇒ Leaders look at project work, and overall record book using the rubric (provided to leaders in the Fall Leader Packet) to review youth's record book and nominate for awards.
  - ⇒ Juniors who reach 18 points and list activities in at least 1 of the 3 areas of Communication, Citizenship and Leadership to receive a project award. Club Reviewers can nominate up to 2 Juniors per club to receive "Record Keeping Star" at County Convention.
  - ⇒ Intermediates who reach 21 points and list activities in at least 2 of the 3 areas of Communication, Citizenship and Leadership to receive a project award. Club Reviewers can nominate up to 2 Intermediates per club to receive "Record Keeping Star" at County Convention.
  - ⇒ All Senior level books are nominated at the club level and reviewed again for county-level awards. Senior books are due to the Extension Office by the Frist Monday in October at 4:30pm.

#### Tips:

- ⇒ Forms have been updated for the 2023-2024 Program 4-H year; information including record keeping order, instructions, Frequently asked questions, and more can be found at <a href="https://www.extension.iastate.edu/cass/record-keeping">https://www.extension.iastate.edu/cass/record-keeping</a>. Be sure to review the Record Keeping Evaluation Form, Project Awards Evaluation Form, and County-Level Application Form. If you prefer paper copies, stop by the office to have forms printed.
- ⇒ Record Book Covers, as pictured, are available in the Extension office for \$3.50.
- ⇒ If you have any questions, reach out the Katie or the extension office 712-243-1132. Club Leaders have a packet with all reviewer's paperwork and notes about all of the forms needed.
- ⇒ Youth who completed 8-12 grade can also apply for County Level Awards for going above and beyond in skill areas such as leadership, citizenship, or livestock.
- ⇒ There are even scholarship opportunities for graduating 4-Her's who have kept an up to date record book and turn in a record book their final year as a member.

#### Leaders:

- ⇒ Please be sure to turn senior record books nominated for awards and award results sheets into the Extension Office by October 7 at 4:30pm. The award sheet should list ALL record books that were turned in for you to review.
- ⇒ If you are needing assistance with your record book, project awards, county-level awards, or would like someone to look over/review it before you submit it please reach out to Katie to set up a meeting time that works into your busy schedule.



### Youth Action Committee Members Needed—Youth & Adults

Are you interested in continuing to make the best better and improve Cass County 4-H programming? Do you enjoy developing and sharing your leadership skills and experiences? The Youth Action Committee focuses on program and policy development for the County 4-H Program. YAC organizes county-wide activities such as banner club, fall fest, record book awards, county convention, and other county-wide events/meetings and reviews club t-shirt designs for uniform approval.

YAC is made up of youth and adults from across the county with the goal to have representation from a large percentage of the 4-H Clubs. # 2024-2025 Youth Council Applications

Looking for a fun way to get involved, meet other 4-H members from around the county and develop leadership skills? Youth Council is just what you are looking for! Return an application to the Extension Office on or before October 7th at 4:30pm.

Council members must have these minimum qualifications:

- · Completed at least two years of club work.
- Be in 9, 10, 11, or 12 grades.
- Plan to remain actively involved with their local club.
- Have a current and completed 4-H record book.

Candidates will be interviewed and selected by the Youth Action Committee. Council members may serve up to four, one-year terms. Members are expected to attend monthly meetings, plus events planned throughout the year. Group plans one major event during the year and tries to host activities for all ages and families. (New member party, Share-the-Fun, educational presentation workshop, junior day camp, county convention.) Council members are expected to behave in a responsible and mature manner. They shall represent themselves as good role models. Issues of misconduct will be handled by Extension staff and/or the Youth Action Committee. Members Council should make meetings/events a priority to maintain eligibility for subsequent years. The Council may choose to elect officers, those elected to serve agree to make meetings and council activities a priority as they take on additional leadership responsibilities.
