To: All 4-H/FFA Swine Project Members  
4-H Leaders

The 2019 swine show at the Cedar County Fair will continue to be a non-terminal show. Determination of final destination of swine project(s) must be made at swine check in at the fair Tuesday evening.

Options are:

- Will take hogs home OR
- Sell to designated hog buyer, determined by the 4-H committee. No exceptions. Hogs will be sold to a packinghouse on a carcass basis.

**Identification process:** All 4-H swine (for both county and state fair) must be tagged and identified in 4hOnline prior to May 15, 2019. Starting April 8, exhibitors should purchase and pick up tags (and taggers if necessary) at the Cedar County Office. You will then tag your own swine and enter your identification information into 4hOnline (please see the attached help sheet for instructions on this). 4-H county only pigs will require a USDA ear tag and NO ear notches need to be recorded in 4hOnline identification. 4-H pigs identified for State only OR for both State & County will need a DNA punch tag and ear notches recorded in 4hOnline. FFA please check with your advisors. At a minimum, FFA pigs will need an ear tag and ear notches for county fair, with paper identification turned in to the office by 4pm on May 15, 2019.

### SWINE FOR CEDAR COUNTY FAIR

- 4-H county only USDA ear tags will cost \$2.00 each.
- No ear notches will need to be recorded for 4-H county only pigs. If the pig is 4-H for both county and state fair, ear notches are required.
- FFA, please check with your advisor for tags. Ear notches are required for FFA pigs.

### SWINE FOR IOWA STATE FAIR

- 4-H state DNA punch tag will cost \$10.00 each.
- FFA, please check with your advisor for tags.
- 4-H and FFA ear notches are required to be recorded along with tag number (ear notch reference enclosed).
- Signatures are required on State Fair envelopes (those will be provided with the purchase of DNA punch tags).

**Fair check in procedure:** Swine may arrive at the fair grounds on Tuesday, July 9 8am-10am or 4pm-5pm while superintendents are on hand to check them prior to unloading (no health certificate required for this option). Another option is to arrive and unload July 9 10am-4pm with a health certificate (which will be checked 4-5pm). Swine check in and weighing will take place 5:30pm-6:30pm in the swine arena. Swine returning home may be loaded out Friday, July 12 7am-9am OR after 11am on Sunday, July 14. Swine going to the packer will be loaded out with a time/date TBA (likely Friday early morning). All Single Source Swine must go to the packer, no exceptions.

**Reminders:** All swine identified as a breed will require registration papers. You are encouraged to turn a copy in to the Extension Office by May 15. Registration papers will be verified and ID confirmed upon check in to the fair on July 9. If no papers are presented, swine will show as crossbred.

Again this year the Cedar County Pork Producers will be offering a Production Swine Project to showcase learning and education in swine production. And they will again be offering a Single Source Swine Class. Please see details enclosed.

Market Swine Iowa 4-H Animal Care and Management Disclosure Statement (Drug Affidavit) (enclosed) is required to be completed and turned in at fair check in on Tuesday night.

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## **DIVISION 265**

### ***Production Swine Project***

Superintendents – Cedar County Pork Producers

1. All class entries in this division need to be made in Fair Entry by May 15<sup>th</sup>.
2. The purpose of this project is to showcase learning and education in swine production. It is for those involved directly or indirectly with owning, caring for, or helping with any kind of swine enterprise.
3. You do not need to own the pigs you are working with.
4. You do not need to identify or show swine at the fair.
5. Combination Score of:
  - a. Presentation (3-5 minutes; video, pictures, slide show, display, poster, etc.) – 30 points
  - b. Oral Interview (question/answer with Pork Producer Board) – 30 points
  - c. Written records/log book (1-2 months daily duties/activities) – 40 points
6. Records due to Cedar County Extension Office by 4pm on June 21; Presentation and Interviews held June 27 in the evening with schedule TBD).

Recognition of the participants will take place during the Live Swine Show on Thursday at the fair. Written records and displays/etc. will be exhibited at the 4-H Building on Thursday of the fair as well.

Awards in each grade division will be awarded (1<sup>st</sup> - \$30, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$20, 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$10, with Traveling Trophy for each division Champion)

**DIVISION 266**  
***Single Source Swine Project***  
Superintendents – Cedar County Pork Producers

1. Participants must sign up by April 19 with the Extension Office, call 563-886-6157 or submit online here: <https://www.extension.iastate.edu/cedar/4h>.
2. Participants can purchase 1 pig from the county's single source producer to show in the single source class only. Exhibitors may bring other pigs to show in other swine classes.
3. Pigs will be ear tagged and vaccinated by producer. The producer will keep them until 4/28/19 when weather is more favorable for small pigs. Members will pick them up at the swine arena on the Cedar County fairgrounds with time TBA. They will be weighed before loading out.
4. All pigs will be selected and distributed to youth randomly by drawing tag numbers.
5. Price will be set according to market value the day of pick up and families will sign a contract. Participants will pay the balance after the fair regardless if the animals exhibit at the fair. All swine exhibited in the Single Source Swine Class will go directly to the packer from the fair. Payment due to the producer will be deducted out of your packer check.
6. All project participants will show in the Single Source Swine Class which will require a scan and fee.
7. Participants will interview with the Pork producers June 27 regarding their project experience as well as care and management, facilities and equipment, and feed.
8. Scoring for the class: Scanning score is 30 pts., Show ring is 30 pts., Interview is 30 pts. = 90 points.

Recognition of the participants will take place during the Live Swine Show on Thursday at the fair. Written records and displays/etc. will be exhibited at the 4-H Building on Thursday of the fair as well.

Cash awards will be awarded.



## **Regulations Pertaining to State and Interstate Shows**

### **Age of Exhibitors**

1. To be eligible for a county, state, or interstate show—including Iowa State Fair—a 4-H member must have completed 5th grade prior to the event.
2. A 4-H member becomes ineligible to exhibit beyond the county level upon completion of the calendar year of high school graduation. Note: In the event that a 4-H member has dropped out of high school, the 4-H member is eligible to exhibit livestock only through the calendar year that his/her class graduated.

### **ID Limits**

Exhibitors may identify a maximum of 40 head for the Iowa State Fair or those attending a county fair weigh-in. A maximum of 40 head may be identified for county fair only or those not attending a county weigh-in.

### **Ownership**

All the animals must be owned by and identified to the individual 4-H member. When registration papers are involved, the papers must either be in the 4-H member's name or show a logical family relationship.

Animals changing ownership after being identified as a 4-H project are ineligible to be exhibited as 4-H animals for that 4-H year. All swine must be in the possession of the 4-H member.

Animals offered for sale in an auction are considered to have changed ownership even though bought back by the original owner or if the owner refuses a bid or says, "No Sale."

### **Iowa State Fair Identification**

All swine must be tagged with the official state 4-H ear tag, ear notched, and a DNA sample collected. Animals identified as part of a 4-H project cannot also be identified or exhibited as an FFA project.

### **Deadline**

All swine must be entered in 4HOnline for county fair and/or State Fair eligibility and exhibition by May 15.

### **Signing and Filing the Verification Form**

Your signature on the front of this form indicates that you have reviewed it and the information is correct and complete. Keep one copy for your reference, and return the other copy to the county site coordinator.

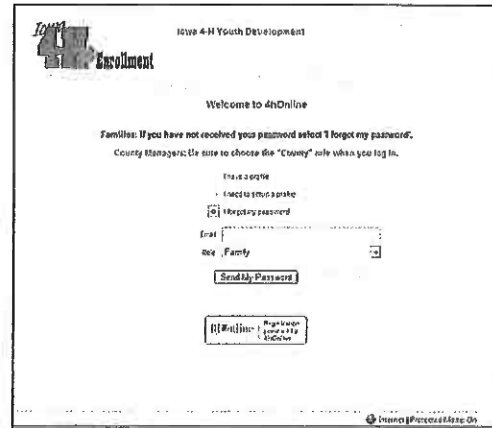
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## Log in to 4HOnline:

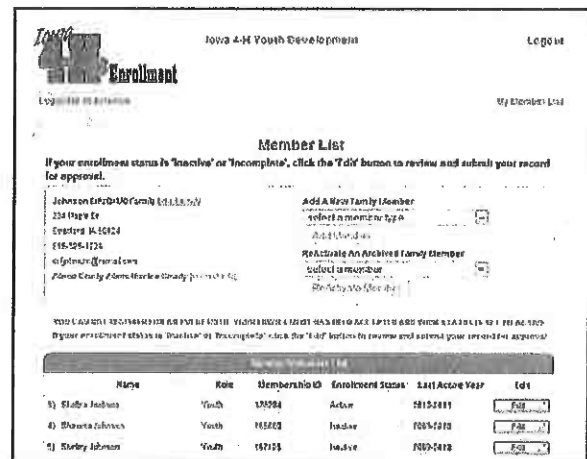
### On the Iowa 4-H Youth Development Log In page:

1. Click "I have a Profile."
2. Enter family email address provided to Extension Office.
3. Enter your password.
  - If you have forgotten your password, mark "I forgot my Password."
  - Click "Send my Password." Do not close the internet window.
  - Open your email browser and find the email from 4HOnline. Locate your temporary password.
  - Return to 4HOnline and paste/type the temporary password.
4. Choose "Family" from the "Role" drop-down box.
5. Click "Log In."
  - If you had to have your password re-set, you will need to create a new password before going on. Your passwords must be a minimum of 8 characters, and must contain 2 of the 3: letters, numbers, symbols.

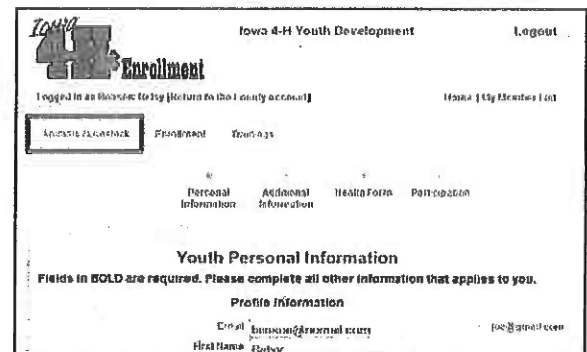


The **Member List** screen includes all of your family members enrolled in 4H: members, leaders, volunteers.

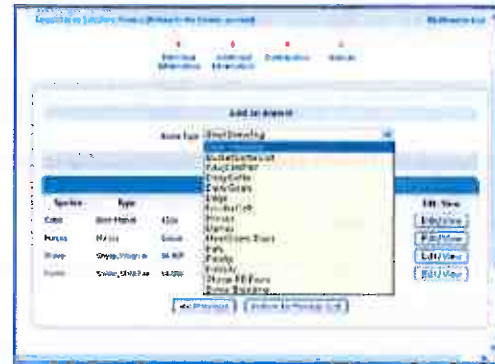
Click "Edit" to the right of the member listed to go to that member's Personal Information Screen.



Locate and click on the Animals/Livestock link in the upper left.



There is a drop-down box and a list of any animals that have already been entered (there may not be any yet). Select the animal type that you want to enter and click the add button below the drop-down box.



The next screen will be a data entry screen for the species you selected (see below for examples). Note that in some species, certain selections will activate extra entry fields [Example: selecting *Registered* will in some cases show a *Breed* drop down box.]

Read the information at the top of each screen, particularly if you are considering exhibiting at the state fair. Some fields that are NOT required (bold) are actually necessary for state fair animals. For each animal entered, enter all the information requested and click the save button. **All fields in bold are required.**

**NOTICE that beginning in 2013-2014, you have options to print the information that you entered on screen.**

- It is not necessary for you to print paper copies unless you need that information for a show that is outside of Iowa. The information that you enter in 4hOnline is available to Iowa 4-H staff, just as it is available to you.
- If you WISH to print the information on screen, you have two options:
  1. **Animal Exports (to Excel)** – Option is located on the Animal List screen, and returns all information in an Excel spreadsheet, one line per animal. Each animal type uses different fields, so if you have identified dogs and horses and llamas, you'll export twice. This is for family info only—will not be accepted anywhere as a valid identification because it's editable.
  2. **Print Animal Information** – This option is located at the top of each individual animal screen, and prints a paper copy of the information that is on the screen for that specific animal. If you want one for each animal, you have to open each animal's info screen and print the form for each. This is the equivalent of the old paper ID forms, but in Iowa 4-H shows, we will always use the online data, not any paper, as identification.

**REMINDERS:**

- 🔔 **Families are not able to enter information for any weighed-in animals (mkt. beef, sheep, meat goats & swine). Those animals are entered by county staff. Refer to the Livestock Verification Help sheet for more information.**
- 🔔 **All animal ID's must be submitted no later than May 15<sup>th</sup>, 11:59 p.m.**

  - Double-click on the file, or highlight and click Open.
  - If you make a mistake, use the Clear button to remove the picture.

  - Browse to locate the picture of your dog—it needs to be GIF, JPG, PNG, TIFF or PDF format.
  - Double-click on the file, or highlight and click Open.
  - If you make a mistake, use the Clear button to remove the picture.
- 🐾 You also have an option to upload a scan of your rabies certificate—again, it needs to be GIF, JPG, PNG, TIFF or PDF.

  - Double-click on the file, or highlight and click Open.
  - If you make a mistake, use the Clear button to remove the picture.
  - **State Fair horses are REQUIRED to have photos uploaded BEFORE MAY 15.**

As a youth livestock producer, I understand that I have an obligation to be a responsible producer and that all market animals will enter the food chain and become edible food products for the consuming public. This subjects every exhibit animal to all state and federal regulations involving proper drug usage and all Food & Drug Administration, Animal Plant Health Inspection Service, Food Safety Inspection Service, and Environmental Protection Agency regulations.

- ❖ We, the undersigned, certify that we have read, understand and will abide by all rules and regulations of the local county 4-H/FFA fair, or the 4-H division of the Iowa State Fair. We agree to the condition that these exhibit animals (identified on this form) may be screened for violative residues and foreign substances. Also, as a condition of entry, exhibitor agrees to a background check for any past disqualification from other livestock shows.
- ❖ We have completed the Treatment Records information on the back of this form for any injectable, water, or feed medication, pesticide, topical or other substance that has been administered to exhibit animals. Use of these products may require additional time to meet legal withdrawal limits before harvest. We certify that we have reviewed the treatment and feed medication records for all exhibit swine and they meet or exceed the suggested withdrawal periods for Japan Maximum Residue Levels (MRLs) of pharmaceutical products listed on the National Pork Board web site, <http://www.pork.org/Producers/JapanMRL.aspx>
- ❖ We certify that these exhibit animals have not received drugs that are not in compliance with label indications or, if applicable, the requirements of the regulations codifying the Animal Medicinal Drug Use Clarification Act amendment to the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic act (under the direction of a valid Veterinary/Client/Patient relationship).
- ❖ If violations are detected, appropriate state and federal authorities will be notified, and regulatory action can be expected. Also exhibitors will be subjected to penalties as determined by show management.
- ❖ We certify these hogs did not originate from a herd under quarantine and there has not been evidence of swine dysentery (*Brachyspira hyodysenteriae*) in this herd during the past twelve months.
- ❖ We certify the Premise ID number(s) provided is the location(s) the exhibit swine were housed prior to arriving at the show and the exhibitor has an active/current FSQA or YQCA certification.
- ❖ We further certify the information provided below is correct and accurate, and that we have read and understand these regulations and may be relied upon by any person or entity accepting these animals for harvest.

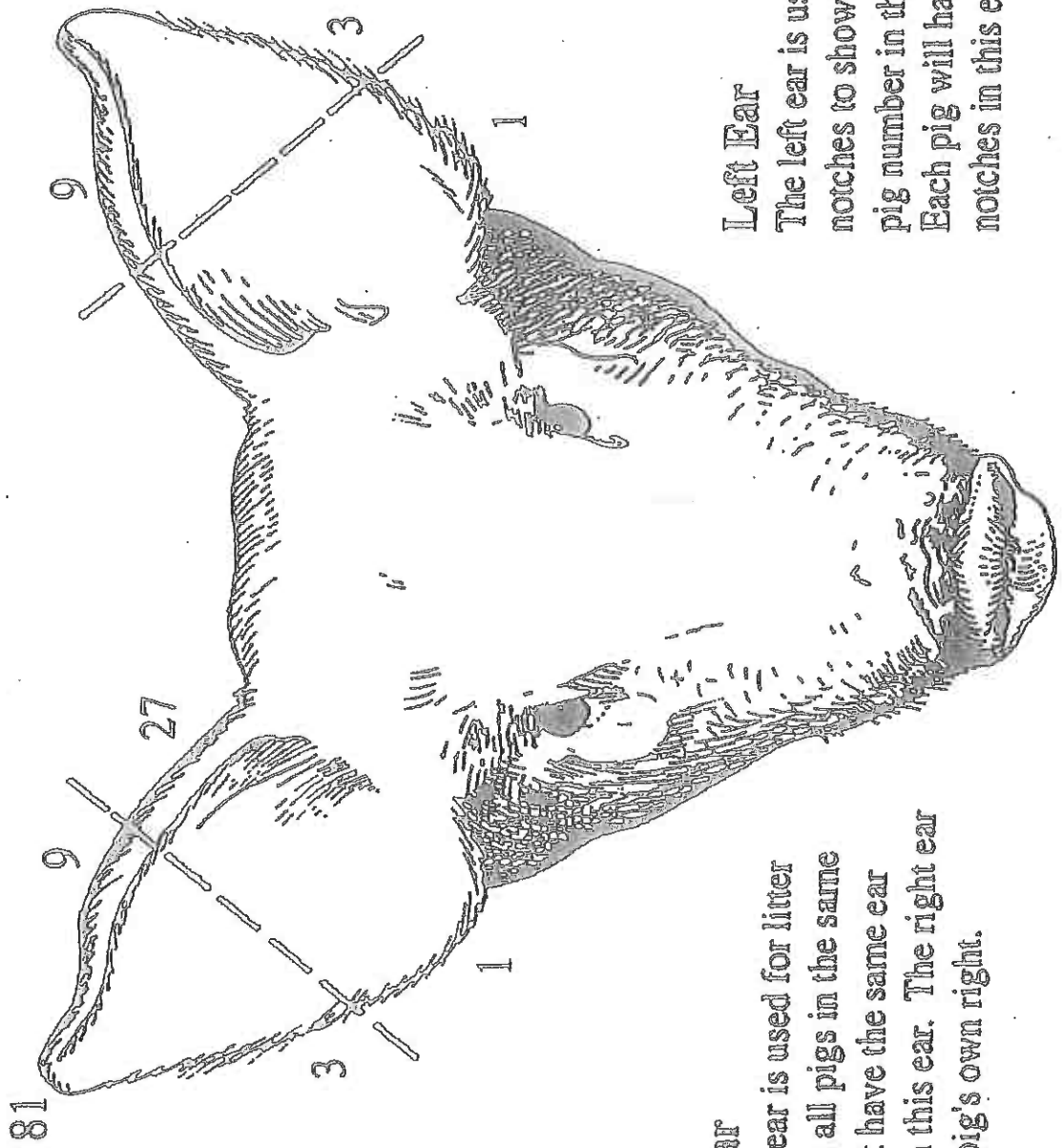

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# Universal Swine Ear Notching System



## Right Ear

The right ear is used for litter mark, and all pigs in the same litter must have the same ear notches in this ear. The right ear is on the pig's own right.

## Left Ear

The left ear is used for individual notches to show individual pig number in the litter. Each pig will have different notches in this ear.
