

**SWINE – YQCA Required**

**RULES:** (Be familiar with General Livestock Rules)

- 1) **Use of Payleen is PROHIBITED in the production of your fair animal. \*\***
- 2) **All swine should be tagged by April 15, 2021.** No weigh-in is required this year. Swine exhibitors can check out tags (\$3/tag) and taggers at the Extension Office starting **March 15<sup>th</sup>**. If a tag should come out, it **MUST** be reported to the Extension Office and can be replaced with permission by staff or the swine superintendent.
- 3) Swine must be owned, fed, and cared for by the exhibitor by **May 15<sup>th</sup>** of current year.
- 4) Swine must be identified in 4-H Online by **May 15<sup>th</sup>** for 4-H Exhibitors. FFA Exhibitors must turn in the paper ID forms to the Extension Office by **May 15<sup>th</sup>**.
- 5) **An individual may identify up to 10 head of pigs for the Achievement Show, however only 6 may be entered into show classes in FairEntry by June 15<sup>th</sup>. An exhibitor who is in both 4-H and FFA may enter up to 6 pigs as a 4-Her and 6 pigs as a FFA member.**
- 6) **Exhibitors may show a combination of 6 pigs (crossbred or purebred, breeding or market). Two of the 6 pigs may be scanned for carcass competition (the pigs to be scanned will need to be selected before they go across the scales at fair).**
- 7) **All swine exhibitors need to have Youth for Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Certification by June 15<sup>th</sup>.**
- 8) All swine herds in Iowa are now considered negative for Pseudo rabies. This eliminates the need for 4-H and FFA members to test their swine prior to county fair. You will NOT have to test hogs for Pseudo rabies this year.
- 9) Swine will be placed in purple, blue, red, and white ribbon groups by the judge.
- 10) Confinement hogs should be used to non-concrete surface before coming to show.
- 11) Hogs may be clipped if the exhibitor so chooses, but no shorter than ½ inch. Clipping will follow Iowa State Fair Rules.
- 12) There will be purebred classes offered in both the market and breeding divisions. There must be at least 3 of a purebred breed to make a class, and all breeds that fail to have 3 to make a class will show together in the Other Breeds Class. In order to show a purebred, the exhibitor must have a pedigree in his/her name or family name at the time of fair weigh-in.
- 13) Market pig classes will be determined on the basis of ending weight on entry day at the fair.
- 14) Superintendent will decide show order following weigh-in.
- 15) This is a NON-TERMINAL SHOW. That means youth will be allowed to take pigs home and not run them through the auction. This decision needs to be designated to the staff on the check-in form during weigh-in at the fair. It also means buyers can purchase pigs in the auction to take home.
- 16) **All market swine under 220 pounds and over 315 pounds will not be eligible for show, scanning, or go through the auction. They should be taken home by the exhibitor.** The ideal weight is between 270-300 lbs.
- 17) **There is no weight limit on breeding gilts. Gilts must meet market weight requirement (220-315 lbs.) to be sent on the truck to the packer. If they do not meet these requirements, they must be taken home at the end of the fair.**
- 18) **Swine that are not sold in the auction can be sent on the truck to the packer and sold under the exhibitor's name at that day's market price.**
- 19) **See Auction section for new rules. Animals that are shown in any of the Market Classes are eligible to be sold in the auction. If an animal is not exhibited in a market class, they will not be allowed to sell in the auction. No breeding animals will be allowed to go through the auction.**
- 20) **Check-out for Swine will be Monday afternoon beginning at noon. Livestock that will not be sold in the auction may leave the fairgrounds Sunday at 4:30 pm, but Exhibitors MUST return on Monday before noon to help with clean-up. See General Livestock Rules for more on check-out process.**

- 26200: Crossbred Market Barrow

**Carcass Contest**— Youth may have a maximum of two pigs scanned. Animals must weigh more than 220 lbs. in order to be scanned. All carcass swine must be scanned. Youth will be billed after auction for the first pig scanned. The second scan will be paid for by the Chickasaw County Pork Producers. Scanning fees must be paid before receiving premiums.

**NEW IN 2021: Exhibitors must bring their own pig to be scanned themselves, or the pig will not be scanned.**

**26300: Individual Carcass**

**Showmanship** (see General Showmanship Contest rules) Exhibitors will automatically be entered into the appropriate Showmanship class and should notify the Superintendent or Fair Staff if they choose not to participate on the day of the show.
