Swine Tag Pick Up

4-H swine not attending the derby weigh-in must be tagged with USDA/EID tag for county fair. State Fair 4-H pigs also must have a DNA sample taken.

Timeline for swine tag pick up:

- Now—April 30: Order tags through online survey: https://go.iastate.edu/0IFIAP
- April 3— May 5: pick up tags/taggers from the Extension Office
- By May 15: All swine identified on 4hOnline (v2.4honline.com) or Google Spreadsheet
- By May 15: State Fair DNA envelopes returned to the Extension Office
- By July 1: 4-H and FFA youth make the actual entry in FairEntry.

All 4-H members interested in the swine project received a <u>letter mailed</u> with additional in March. View <u>online</u> for a reminder!

May 15 <u>Animal Identification</u> Deadline is Almost Here

Animals that MUST be identified for 4-H/ FFA members include: beef, bucket bottle calf, dairy cattle, dogs, goats, horses, pets, sheep, and swine. **FFA members**—identify via Google Spreadsheet, ask your advisor. **4-H members**—identify via <u>4hOnline</u>. <u>REMEMBER</u>: This process only identifies the animal. You will still need to enter the animal in a specific class through <u>FairEntry</u> by July 1. Page 42 in the <u>fair book</u> explains it.

FairEntry is Open Now—yes, you read that right!

After hearing feedback from exhibitors, you can now identify and sign up for classes at the same time. They are still TWO different websites:

- Animal Identification is in <u>4hOnline</u> (or Google Spreadsheet for FFA)
- Entries/Classes are all in <u>FairEntry</u>
 You MUST identify your animal FIRST and then sign up for classes through FairEntry. Need help? Visit the County Fair website.

The deadline is still 11:59 pm on July 1 for the Clinton County Club Show in FairEntry.

- 4-H members—you must log into FairEntry with your 4hOnline account.
- FFA members—Please follow this flow chart.

Market Broiler for State Fair

Entry is now open for Market Broilers for the lowa State Fair. Entries are due in FairEntry by May 1. Payment must be postmarked on or before May 1. Exhibitors must purchase 50 birds at a cost of \$93.50. For families sharing the 50 birds, each 4-H member must make a class entry for the Market Broiler division, but only one 4-H member should indicate the bird order. Birds will be shipped from the hatchery contracted by the lowa State Fair directly to the 4-H'ers on June 26. Participation is limited to the first 100 youth. Improve Thin or Over-grazed Pastures This Spring

The negative impacts of drought, high nitrogen prices and other high prices associated with pasture management have left some pastures in the state in less-than-ideal condition.

As the 2023 growing season approaches, Aaron Saeugling, field agronomist with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, discusses important considerations when improving thin or over-grazed pastures.
