A member in your family is interested in the horse project. There are few steps you need to complete in order to exhibit.

- #1 – Identify your horse(s) in 4hOnline or FFA Google Spreadsheet by May 15th
- #2 – Attend at least one workshop offered by the horse committee
- #3 – Enter classes through FairEntry by July 1st (open now!)

Upcoming Workshops

For 2023, the horse committee has chosen four dates for workshops. Exhibitors must attend **at least one**. Workshop options are:

- June 6, 6-7:30 pm at the Fairgrounds
- June 14, 6-7:30 pm at the Fairgrounds
- June 27, 6-7:30 pm at the Fairgrounds
- July 11, 6-7:30 pm at the Fairgrounds

Fair Check-In Process Changes

For 2023, Extension Staff will CALL exhibitors between 9 am-3 pm on Monday, July 17 to check-in entries/classes. Please be prepared with what you will be exhibiting in. No check-in's will be offered after July 17. The horse show will start at 8:30 am on Thursday, July 20 ON TIME! 😊

Clinton County Fair Book Summary of Changes Excerpt

Horse, Pony and Mule Department General Rules

#1 – New Rule added “Photos are required with May 15 identification through 4hOnline. FFA members must email photos to clinton4h@iastate.edu or mail to the Clinton County Extension Office. Photos must be front view, back view, left side, right side.”

*Rules shift up one number

New #20 – changed to read “Exhibitor with an identified horse is required to attend 1 of 3 workshops that will be offered by the horse committee prior to the fair.”

Classes – +1 year to all years listed

Speed Division

Removed Class 512:51 Texas Barrels, all ages

Removed Class 512:55 Keyhole, all ages

Added Class 512:54 Obstacle Race, all ages

Iowa State Fair 4-H Requirements for Horses

- Maximum of 5 head can be identified.
- Animal cannot be identified under both 4-H and FFA.
- Animal can be identified by more than one 4-H member (immediate sibling or step-sibling only), but cannot be identified as 4-H under one sibling and FFA under another sibling.
- 4-H Online ID required by May 15.
- ALL horses are required to have **photos uploaded** into 4-H Online by May 15 (both county and state fair).
- Horses must be owned and not leased as stated in the 4H202:
