Check with your 4-H kiddo! Check with your club leader! Check with the Extension Office! A fair book was ordered for your family. You should have received it by now. It is safety green.

#### **Animal Identification—5/15**

Who: 4th-12th grade exhibitors
Animals that MUST be identified for 4-H/ FFA
members include: beef, bucket bottle calf, dairy
cattle, dogs, all goats, horses, pets, sheep, and
swine.

4-H members—identify via 4hOnline. FFA members—identify via Google Spreadsheet, ask your advisor.

REMEMBER: This process only *identifies* the animal. You will still need to enter the animal in a specific class through FairEntry by July 1. (FairEntry is open now if you want to do both steps.) Page 42 in the <u>fair book</u> explains it.

We will help you!! We want to help you succeed! You can call our office, stop by anytime, visit during extended office hours, email clinton4h@iastate.edu, send a pigeon! We do not know you need help until you ask! After May 15, we cannot help you. This is a state-wide deadline for animal identification. The Clinton County Extension Council also voted there will be no exceptions. Get your animals identified.

#### "Member Link" Emails


Every Wednesday now through August, all 4hOnline enrolled members will receive an email with 4-H/FFA Reminders, Clover Kids Reminders, Key Dates, and a "Where do I find..." section. Emails will have ~3 bullets in each section. They are EASY to digest! We will archive them on our website too.



#### Entering Animal Identification in 4-H Online 2.0

4-H Families will enter ALL animal data this year into 4-H Online

- ALL animal data MUST be entered by families by May 15 (Mkt. Beef Feb.1; Rabbit July 1)
- County 4-H Staff will review the weigh-in data for accuracy
- Ultimate animal data accuracy rests with each 4-H Family









#### Family Data Input -Animal ID

- 11. You will notice some IMPORTANT details and rules regarding the ID process READ THESE CAREFULLY!!
- 12. Click on "Show Questions" to complete each of the required fields and optional fields as needed.
  - Be sure the information is accurate especially:
    - Beginning Weigh Date
    - Beginning Weight
    - o Breed
    - o Retinal Images collected?
    - o Etc.
- 13. Click the Next button at the bottom of the form.
- 14. Upload any required or optional files for this animal.
  - This could include pictures of the animal, etc.
  - These file instructions are set up by county and/or state 4-H staff, if needed
- 15. Click the Next button
- 16. Review the entered information. Use the Back button at the bottom of the page to return to the previous screen to make corrections.
- 17. Once the entered information is correct and reviewed, click the Submit button.
- 18. IMPORTANT If you notice an animal whose status is "Incomplete", this means you didn't click through all the screens and hit the "Submit" button at the end. Once "Submit" is selected, the animal is "Active".
- 18. The animal information will display on the screen with the status, created, modified, and submitted date and time stamp (local time).












Family Data Input -Animal ID

\*\*Once submitted the animal will automatically be active.

County 4-H Staff will review the animal data to make sure weights, weigh dates, etc. are correct.

- County staff will work with families to correct any incorrect information
- <u>ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY for accurate</u> data resides with the youth/family

Click on the Animals tab from your account at any time to view the status for all of the animals for a member in the family.

#### **FairEntry is for ALL classes**

You can identify animals and sign up for classes at the same time. (Previously you identified now and signed up for classes after June 1.) They are still TWO different websites:

- Animal Identification is in <u>4hOnline</u> (or Google Spreadsheet for FFA)
- Entries/Classes are all in FairEntry

You MUST identify your animal FIRST and then sign up for classes through FairEntry. Need help? Visit the County Fair website.

The deadline is still 11:59 pm on July 1 for the Clinton County Club Show in FairEntry.

- 4-H members—you must log into FairEntry with your 4hOnline account.
- FFA members—Please follow this flow chart.

FairEntry houses ALL entries for 4-H/FFA classes as well as Clover Kids classes. You'll sign up for Fashion, Conference Judging Day, Livestock, Horticulture, Communications, Pets, Dogs, and more classes through FairEntry.

If there are any questions about if a specific product can be exhibited at the fair, families/members should email answer@iastate.edu.

- If the email comes back with yes, print the email and include it in your write-up or reference in the write-up an email was received with approval and note the date and name of the AnswerLine staff member who said yes.
- If the email comes back with no, there are suggestions on how to make the product acceptable for fairs.
