Human Sciences and Data—Connecting the Dots

Human Sciences shows up in MyData in a lot of ways. We want to take a moment to explain some of the ways you see Human Sciences show up on your County Dashboards. You will see statewide programs, county-based programs, and asynchronous learning opportunities.

Asynchronous Learning Opportunities— Childcare providers across the state engage in asynchronous learning through Moodle courses. These contacts are entered into MyData once the learning is complete and attached to the provider's county. The most prominent way you see these on your county dashboard are as "Essentials Childcare Preservice" or "Universal Precautions".

Virtual Program Offerings— Human Sciences offers virtual programs statewide for all Iowans. By using Registration Services, we can easily connect participants with the counties when we report contacts in MyData. Some of the advantages to statewide offerings include having more population to guarantee minimum registration numbers are met, fulfilling statewide grant contracts, and ensuring robust discussions in classes.

In-Person Program Offerings— Human Sciences offers a wide range of in-person learning opportunities. Some of these may be scheduled at the request of community partners, some may be statewide classes that we offer, such as ServSafe or in-person childcare provider trainings. Others may be county programs we are partnering with YOU to provide in the counties.

One-on-One Contacts— Another Human Sciences piece of your County Dashboards are the contacts from the Hotlines, Iowa Concern, and AnswerLine.

Remember MyData is a tool to provide information regarding the programming and resources being accessed in your county during a point in time. After virtual or in-person program offerings that have participants from your county, you should receive a brief impact email from the education specialist(s) delivering that program. We hope this makes some connections between the program and those numbers.
